# From the Pastor's Desk

It has been almost one year since we started the work at our DeSoto site. Currently we average about 40 children at our Wednesday evening program, called Agape House, and have begun weekly worship as of the first of April.

As we begin year two, a couple of changes are coming which will be a little more visible to us all. The first is a name change which reflects our new structure of being a multi-site church. This change has been mentioned several times but we have not done much to fully acknowledge this change. Come July first of this year, some of that will change in more noticeable ways.

As of July 1, my appointment will be to Cross and Flame Ministries with two sites, Murphysboro and DeSoto. The individual site names will remain the same: the Murphysboro UMC and the DeSoto UMC, so each congregation and the communities involved will not experience significant interruptions.

The other site of some notice will be the churches' website. The new name Cross and Flame ministries will define the website. There will be some common areas of ministry which involve both sites but also separate pages unique to the two locations. We hope to also roll out these changes by the first of July.

At the leadership retreat I used the illustration of SIH. A healthcare organization in multiple sites, each with its own identity but working together in a common purpose. This is what we are now - a ministry in two locations with a common mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.





# The Library Corner: May Miscellany

Featuring a short and to-the-point review by Scarlett Pierson

What are some of the things you think of when you think of the month of May? May flowers? The UMC Women's Prayer Breakfast? Mother's Day? Perhaps of all the women, moms or not, who make a difference to you and to the community? Probably you also think of Memorial Day, and those who have passed on, including those who sacrificed for their country?

Well the church library doesn't have any books about May flowers---but it does have books that relate to all the other above-named topics!

Let's start with <u>Bearing Hope</u>, written for women who desperately want to have a baby, but for whom the dream of motherhood remains only a dream, not a reality. Here's what Scarlett Pierson has to say about this book:

#### <u>Bearing Hope</u> by Liv Ryan

What a terrific book! Breath of fresh air! This is the book you give to your friend who's struggling in any way with having kids. Liv Ryan's voice is genuine and so full of love. She's practical in her advice and straight shooting.

So easy to read, so many topics she goes through. At the end of the book she gives Bible verses to hold onto that I'll use to encourage others. **Really a 5 star book!**

# *For the Love: Fighting for Grace in a World of Impossible Standards* by Jen Hatmaker.

Hatmaker is a mother of 5, pastor's wife, and star on HGTV's "My Big Family Renovation." She emphatically says she does NOT "do it all"—she has help, and she has made tough choices about what she can or cannot do. The world gives women the message that not only can they do everything, they must also do everything well. In this frank and funny book Hatmaker says, "*We need to quit trying to be awesome and instead be wise.*" (p.7)

(P.S. Parents, read the chapter on "Jesus Kids"; in it she discusses kids, faith and reasons youths leave church. It's happening at an alarming rate. And she suggests that the church may fail—but give them Jesus.)

And of course the library also has devotional and other books for women.



A classic short Christian novel about the events that

ensue when a preacher challenges his congregation to ask themselves, in their decisions about daily life, the simple question, "What would Jesus do?"

<u>In His Steps</u> takes place in the railroad town of Raymond, probably located in the eastern U.S.A., and in Chicago, Illinois.



The main character is the Rev. Henry Maxwell, pastor of the First Church of Raymond, who challenges his congregation to not do anything for a whole year without first asking: "What Would Jesus Do?" Other characters include Ed Norman, senior editor of the Raymond Daily Newspaper, Rachel Winslow, a talented singer, and Virginia Page, a heiress, to name a few.


covered; however, a commitment to attend is required before registration. Registration forms can be found on the youth bulletin board and should be submitted by **May 7**.


