

The Library Corner: A Little Lightness

Light of heart. Sometimes that's exactly what we want to be, and exactly the type of book we want to read. And sometimes it's even better if the books happen to also give us something to think about or some inspiration while they entertain us. Here are a few library materials that meet that description.

Kaleidoscope: Seeing God's Wit and Wisdom in a Whole New Light. Patsy Clairmont, who is gifted with a sense of humor, and who has been a speaker at Women of Faith conferences, looks at some of the straightforward observations made in the book of Proverbs and applies them to life—her life. Most of the time her serious point is made in an amusing way such as the short chapter on Proverbs 10: 29a, "The way of the Lord is strength for the upright" where she discusses her purse—so big she gave it a name—Bertha! But she also talks about what she needs strength to do, and invites readers to consider that question for themselves.

Yes, Lord, I Have Sinned But I Have Several Excellent

Excuses. James W. Moore gives his book a funny title, but then of course it is especially funny because that's the underlying message behind many a sin that we want to rationalize away! He talks about "common" sins of Christians and churches, and does so seriously, while at the same time giving many interesting and amusing anecdotes.

When God Winks at You: How God Speaks Directly to You Through the Power of Coincidence by Squire Rushnell. This is not a "funny" book, but the underlying message is so upbeat and inspirational, that the whole book leaves you with a feeling of amazement, and a lightened heart. Don't rush through this book—give yourself some time to take in some of these amazing true stories.

God Never Blinks: 50 Lessons for Life's Little Detours. Regina Brett, a newspaper columnist, wrote these lessons in one of her columns when she turned 50 years old. Here she expands upon her experiences, such as being an unwed mother when she was young, and a cancer survivor later in life. She does so with a sense of proportion and humor, with chapters such as *"Don't take yourself too seriously—no one else does"* and *"Life isn't tied with a bow, but it is still a gift."*
