



The Library Corner: The Gifts of Imperfection!

There are gifts in imperfection? That is good news for all of us! Angie Baughman shares a review (below) of Brené Brown's book The Gifts of Imperfection: Let go of who you think you're supposed to be and embrace who you are.

Where do I even begin? This book, and the work of Brené Brown, has been transformational in my life. If you are not familiar with her research, I encourage you to find her TEDx Houston talk from June 2010 on YouTube. I have watched it at least a dozen times and I always learn something new from it.

After watching this talk, I looked for her on Audible and purchased a copy of *The Power of Vulnerability*. This recording is Brené teaching workshops on the same guideposts that are found in the chapters of *The Gifts of Imperfection*. I often go back to both the audio and print versions of this book to remind myself of concepts that are significant to me.

Brené's work challenges me because her writing presses on many of the places where I struggle. I am journeying to live at a place of greater peace with myself and her willingness to share her own journey sparks hope in me. I believe that I am capable of living with more worthiness, more self approval, and more acceptance of who I am. Here are a couple of Brené's statements you would find underlined in my copy of *Gifts*:

How much we know and understand ourselves is critically important, but there is something that is even more essential to living a Wholehearted life: loving ourselves. When the shame winds are whipping around me, it's almost impossible to hold on to any perspective or to recall anything good about myself. I went right into the bad self-talk of God, I'm such an idiot. Why did I do that? And this quote she shares from Howard

Thurman, "Don't ask what the world needs.
Ask what makes you come alive, and go do it.
Because what the world needs is people who have come alive." Brené is a Christian, but her work is academic. She talks about God and her spiritual journey in relationship to the work she does and how it affected her personally. She refers to a transformative time in her life that she describes as a "spiritual awakening". I find her writing style to be honest, encouraging, challenging, and accepting.

2017 Annual Report

United Methodist Men (UMM) is the official organization for the men at the local church, Annual Conference, and denominational levels. Among the purposes of the UMM is to involve men in a growing relationship to Jesus Christ and His church, to provide resources and programs in the area of stewardship, and to provide models and support for Annual Conference and local church United Methodist Men. Our annual report follows.

For the past seven years the United Methodist Men (UMM) have invited the community to our church to enjoy a homemade apple pancake breakfast to help celebrate the Murphysboro Apple Festival. The church has gotten behind this "mission" and it has been offered with a high level of hospitality which has resulted in a very positive response from the community. Rather than keep any of the profits, the UMM have voted to support missions at our church and in the community. **Some \$10,144 has been raised the past 7 years!** The programs funded have included food pantry, camping and camping scholarships, funds to help our youth on their mission trip to Belize, and funds to the Little Grassy Camp for the "Buy a Bunk" project. The UMM believe the Little Grassy camp is essential to the spiritual growth of youth in the community so it was an easy decision to support the camp.

For our 2017 annual meeting, we were very pleased to have Les Winkeler, the Sports Editor of *The Southern*, deliver an interesting presentation based on the question "where does the modern man go for inspiration?" His talk was named "Spirituality is right in our backyard." To make his point, he presented slide pictures of fascinating sites such as the Grand Canyon, Glacier Bay, Crater Lake and the haystacks off the Oregon Coast. However, to further support his topic he had a large personal selection of pictures of birds and animals and scenes he has taken in southern Illinois. The pictures of sunrises and sunsets were inspiring. As he noted, all of this is "right in our backyard."

Other events we had or attended are The Main Event in Nashville, Graduates Breakfast, Feed the Team (Murphysboro HS), attending a Cardinal baseball game and a Saluki football game, serve at the Women's Breakfast, display the Nativity Scene, and do minor cleaning and some repairs at the church. One of the best attended events is our Saturday morning at the Bigham Farm. Allen treats us to breakfast and gives us an overview of the latest in farming equipment and the operation of the farm. We have decided to adopt the Lighthouse in Marion. The Lighthouse is a homeless shelter and a safe place for families to stay until a family crisis is resolved. The UMM will be responsible to do any repairs and keep the room clean and painted.

Informing you of what we do is felt to be very important. For the men of the church, if you are not an active member then please consider joining the UMM. We average around 12 men each month. The UMM is open to all men, young and very mature. We meet on the second Saturday of the month at 7:30 a.m. The breakfast is always very good and "homemade!" For those who would like to enjoy a breakfast including a social time and an occasional devotional, please join us. The topics we discuss range from serious to the sublime.

Our elected officers are Jay Graff, President; Rob Williams, Treasurer; and Perry Patterson, Secretary.


