



The Library Corner: Listening to God

Pastor Larry's sermon on August 20th was called "When God Speaks" and was based on Jeremiah 1:4 "The word of the Lord came to me, saying . . . "

We know that there are many ways God can speak into our lives. Learning to look and listen for those ways comes to us as both a challenge and an invitation. More than one book in

our library addresses that invitation and challenge. Here are several:

Listen: Finding God in the Story of Your Life by Keri Wyatt Kent. Kent divides her book into three parts. Part I is about listening to our own lives. She says: "I believe God speaks to us about our lives through our joys, our pain, our longing, and our awareness of them will help us understand who God is and whom he has made us to be—what our life is 'truly about'." (p. 8)

Part II of Kent's book is about listening to others, and how God can work with that effort in ways that helps both the other and one's self—and how both can meet God in that listening.

Part III of her book is called "Listening Practices." Kent discusses listening in silence, listening through Scripture, and listening in prayer, all with the goal of opening up space for God in our lives.

The Joy of Listening to God: Hearing the Many Ways God Speaks to Us by Joyce Huggett. Huggett is an English author who, like most of us, spent her prayer time sharing her concerns with God. Then she found a whole new dimension of prayer as she began to learn to be quiet before God. In this book she shares her life and her experiences with us as she discusses how we too can prepare ourselves to hear God speak.

Discerning the Voice of God: How to Recognize When God Speaks by Priscilla Shirer. Shirer says that she "sat in many prayer meetings where passionate believers shared stirring encounters with God's voice while my own soul was filled with overwhelming confusion. How did these saints know God was speaking?" (p. 5 of participant book).

She decided that although she believed God spoke, she was not going to disappoint herself by thinking he would speak to her. And that's how it was she relates, until the day "God spoke personally and intimately to me." This is a six-session DVD study and workbook to help individuals anticipate that God will speak to them and learn to recognize his voice. While it is set up for a group study, it can be used by individuals as well. One of the good features of her study is the quotes from others about their experiences in listening for and discerning God's voice. Shirer also explains "this study cannot give a formula by which you can discern His voice with 100 percent accuracy. As you practice discerning, know God graciously allows our errors to be the best teacher in hearing correctly in the future. "(p. 5)

caring For Kids



A few years ago, we began a large-scale outreach project aimed at helping the children of Murphysboro. While we had been collecting school supplies for several

years, it was time to go a step further and be intentional with this ministry. Our schools and students had needs that went beyond crayons, pencils and glue sticks – they needed easily accessible money. So July became our Caring for Kids month where we collected school supplies, Wal-Mart gift cards and cash for our grade school social workers. Over the years, we have added a few items here and there, but our focus stayed on our grade-school aged children. But as any parent will tell you, our children don't stop being our babies and needing us once they get older. As we found more places offering school supply support for children, we saw an opportunity to explore the needs of our older youth in middle school and high school. When we asked the middle school and high school social workers what was needed most, the response from the social workers was eye-opening; the overwhelming request was for personal hygiene products. This year's Caring for Kids request list was long and varied, and let's face it, not very fun. And with such a variety of items, we did not see an immense stockpile of any one thing taking over the Sanctuary. But what we did see was a congregation whose eyes were opened to the reality of what some of our youth face, and that accepted

the challenge to help. We thank all who gave to the Caring for Kids collection and for all who continue to pray for our children and youth each day.

Since the mid-90's this congregation has been involved in building upgrades and improvements. Over the years almost \$2M has been borrowed, spent, and paid off which is really a phenomenal record of financial commitment and dedication. However, almost all of that work was focused on the oldest part of the church with very little done to the Educational Wing built in the late 60's and now over 50 years old.

This next capital campaign entitled "LET'S FINISH WHAT WE STARTED" (LFWWS) (spanning 2018-2019) will focus on much needed improvements and upgrades to the Educational Wing. LFWWS will bring balance to our work and draws us closer to completion of work undertaken 15 years ago.

Phase I of the LFWWS campaign for the most part consists of projects functional in nature:

- New, modern and more efficient heating and cooling system to include ceiling insulation
- New windows and/or additional exterior window coverings
- Relocated, larger and more functional Nursery
- New range hood/fire suppression system in the kitchen
- Upgrade of the restroom off the Fellowship Hall to be modern and fully handicap accessible

Clearly, the projects itemized above are not fancy options. Rather, they are basic necessities, some of which are long overdue. Collectively, these improvements will impact in a very positive way the potential of our largest ministry tool: **OUR BUILDING**.

In order to complete this work we need to do nothing more than what we have all been doing for many years—personally seeking God's guidance and direction about what part of this large project belongs to me to support. In the past no one person has paid for the whole project, and I doubt they will this time. It will be our church coming together as a family to jointly support the work we have agreed needs to be done.

We have prepared a booklet that describes the work to be done in the Phase 1 project. Contact the church office if you would like one sent to you. Please begin to consider the part God is asking you to play. Pledge cards will be available at the North and Southeast entrances to the Sanctuary from Sept 3 - Sept 10, and will be collected on Sept 17. **LET'S FINISH WHAT WE STARTED!**




Coming in OCTOBER:
