Teresa and I will celebrate our tenth Easter at Murphysboro this year, and sometimes we marvel over the changes we have experienced in those years. We came here with one grandchild and we now have five. Any child in the congregation under 10 years old had not been born yet, and the young men and women who today are now 18 or 19 years old were just 8 or 9 at that time. 






#### Bus Trip to the AQS Paducah Quilt Show





#### What Christians Can Learn By Studying Jewish Feasts

When I first began studying Jewish life and culture during the time Jesus was on earth, I was humbled by my lack of understanding. I had been a bible student for years and had read countless stories that mentioned Jewish feasts and festivals without ever pausing to ask myself about their relevance to me and my spiritual journey today. What I have learned over the past few years has made my heart so tender to the significance that lies within the feasts. As I have come to understand them better, I also see how over and over again God used these celebrations to pull His people back to Him and to point them to the Messiah who would someday come.


I am excited to offer five weeks of teaching on this fascinating subject and my hope is that through our discussions we, too, will feel God pulling us in closer connection with Him. I also pray that we will see the story of Jesus unfold in the meaning of the feasts in a way that will deepen our understanding of Christ's passionate love for us. Participants will need to acquire their own books and be prepared for the first session by reading the introduction and first chapter. I hope you will pray about joining us for this five-week class.

Session Two - Passover ~ Session Three - Pentecost

#### The Library Corner: What's New?

Something is new in the library every month. We consistently add to the collection—perhaps new fiction, or a new DVD study, or books for children. This month we have two new things to share with you—a new book in our "Local Authors and Local Interest" section, and something special for the children and youth of the church. Read on!

Jill Rogers, who attends Murphysboro UMC along with her husband Marty, has donated a book she wrote, **Shift Happens: Turning Your Stumbling Blocks into Stepping Stones.** Jill tells about many life experiences she has had, some very devastating, starting with a rape when she was a young woman of 23. That was traumatic, but it started Jill on a journey of discovery and growth that allowed her to deal with that situation, and others that followed.

Central to this process is her strong faith in God, as well as the willingness to keep her mind and heart open to change and new insights that strengthened her. She shares that journey with us in order to encourage others who are going through difficult times. She says:

My life has been thrown into so much change, one after another that tore my entire world in two, yet I adjusted and lived through it, which is why I'm here to tell you that if you get the right help you can do it too. . . through ANYTHING. . . This book is the witness of my life learning and being led by the Spirit of God. It is the only witness I have to give you from all I have learned. (p.53)

The most obvious "new thing" in the library is a lovely new child and youth section, provided through the hard work of Bob and Trina Eaton and Dan Bratton. We have added a youth bookcase, plus two book "bins" for younger children. It makes the youth section more attractive, and makes it easier for kids to look through and choose books and DVDs that interest them.

Waking Up White is the book Irving wishes someone had handed her decades ago. By sharing her sometimes cringe-worthy struggle to understand racism and racial tensions, she offers a fresh perspective on bias, stereotypes, manners and tolerance. As Irving unpacks her own long-held beliefs about colorblindness, being a good person and wanting to help people of color, she reveals how each of these well-intentioned mindsets actually perpetuated her illconceived ideas about race. She also explains why and how she's changed the way she talks about racism, works in racially mixed groups and understands the antiracism movement as a whole. Exercises at the end of each chapter prompt readers to explore their own racialized ideas. Waking Up White's personal narrative is designed to work well as a rapid read, a book group book, or support reading for courses exploring racial and cultural issues.
