Noisy Mission Offering In September is going to Gum Drop Kids!

Years ago I once heard a pastor say when folks joined their church they were given the choice to receive an apron or a bib. The implication here was not subtle and few if any opted for the bib. I feel everyone would have been better served if they would have been presented with both; maybe not a bib but something similar.

It has been my experience that sometimes life crashes in on us and we need the church to support us when we have little or nothing to offer in return hence the need for the bid. As well as other times we need to step up and serve so others can experience seasons of rest and renewal at this time we would put on our apron and be ready to serve.

Christian discipleship was always intended to be a two-way street. You are to receive from the church but also give back to the church. While our lives circumstances can throw this formula into temporary imbalance we should always work to restore that balance when possible. Those who tend to give in excess burn out becoming angry or frustrated while those who do not give of their time and service typically fade away from the church due to lack of real connection and commitment.

It has always been true if everyone gave a little we would all have plenty and the burden would never be too great on any one person. However, churches like almost all other organization seem to run on the 20/80 rule - 20 percent of the people do 80 percent of the work. So I encourage you to find your balance. Find the place that allows you to receive from the body of Christ while experiencing meaningful service to support that body. That sweet spot is by far the best place to be and helps each of us to live the abundant life that God dreams for each of us.

WHAT ARE THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES UP TO?

<u>Faithful Friends</u>, a class for women of all ages with rotating leaders, is continuing their 12-session video based study, Twelve Women of the Bible, featuring life changing stories for women today by Lisa TerKeurst, Elisa Morgan, Amena Brown, Jonalyn Grace Fincher, Jeanne Stevens, and Naomi Zacharias.

<u>Helping Hands</u>, led by Donna Horniacek, is a traditional Bible Study Class for men and women. The Fall 2018 lessons come from the Book of Genesis, the book of beginnings. Through its pages, God is revealed as the Creator, Sustainer, Judge, and Redeemer who brought all things into being. The lessons survey God's creation of the universe, earth, and people through (3) units: God Created the World, God Destroys and Re-Creates, and God Blesses and Re-Creates Regardless.

<u>Pathfinders</u>, led by Terri Twenhafel, will be studying the book, "Everybody, Always: Becoming Love in a World Full of Setbacks and Difficult People" by Bob Goff. In this inspiring follow-up to the New York Times bestselling phenomenon, *Love Does*, Bob Goff takes readers on a life-altering journey into the secret of living without fear, care, constraint, or worry. *Everybody, Always* reveals the lessons the author learned – often the hard way – about what it means to love without inhibition, insecurity, or restriction.

<u>Seekers</u>, led by Susan Patterson, will be reading and discussing the book "I Bought a House on Gratitude Street" by J. Ellsworth Kalas. In this book, Kalas shares life-lessons on matters of friendship, prayer, sin, and success all through the lens of scripture. In the words of the author, "Some...have come to me by my seeking, some have been shared with me by people of wider experience, and some have been thrust upon me by my mistakes."

<u>Trailblazers</u>, led by Rick and Scarlett Pierson, is studying Bill Hybels' *Too Busy Not to Pray*. In this study, Hybels asks the question, "Do you have trouble finding time to pray?" So much clamors for your attention: work, school, friends, family, church—the list goes on and on. Time for God and time to pray often seem impossible to fit into packed days and nights. 

The Library Corner Treasure Hunt in the Church's Back Yard

Question: What is white, blue, red, yellow, orange and green?

Answer: It is the colorful, brand new LFL constructed by Bob and Trina Eaton. Now do you know what it is? Maybe not! So here's some basic info on the church's LFL:



Q: What in the world is a "LFL?" A: It is a Little Free Library. These are book exchange boxes, set up in neighborhoods. As the name says, they are little, and the books are free-- like a tiny library where anyone can come and take a book.

Q: Where is it?

A: It is close to the pavilion, by the sidewalk near 16th St. A LFL box has been there for some years, and the new box replaces a well used old one.

Q: Who uses the LFL?

A: Everyone can! The church's LFL gets plenty of visitors, although we never know how many. However a lot of books come and go through the doors of that box!

Q: What kind of books are in the LFL, and where do they come from?

- A: All kinds of books find their way into the box. We put in books that are donated or that are found at book sales, etc.
- B: But one of the fun parts is that all users are encouraged not only to take a book, but also to leave a book—so you never know what you will find! It's like a treasure hunt!

Q: What are the most popular books?

A: Children's books! Books for the youngest go quickly, but chapter books and Young Adult books are also popular. People also like cookbooks and history—military and war history especially. The box is usually well stocked with fiction and mysteries. We also try to see there are always a few religious books in there.

Q: What part can church members play in the LFL? A: Plenty! If you enjoy "treasure hunting" for books, stop by the box and look for a book that interests you, and bring one to share with others. It is great to see many people using the box. Or you can donate books—just leave them in the library downstairs. Based on our experience of where books are most likely to be used, we may place them in the library, the LFL, or one of our public libraries. We thank you for your participation in whatever way you choose! And many thanks to Bob and Trina Eaton for that beautiful box!
