## From the Pastor's Desk

I would imagine that few of you are aware of the tremendous ministry we provide each year for the children and youth in our congregation to attend summer camp. Last year we sent 50 young persons to summer camp at a cost of over \$17,000. Our church sent more youth to the Little Grassy UM camp than any church in the Annual Conference.

This year as we began planning our 2019 budget the church leadership realized fairly quickly that something was going to need to change or we could not maintain this level of commitment to our youth's spiritual development.

Over several hours of discussion we pledged to use this year's Easter offering to support summer camp cost and to use the season of Lent to highlight camping and build support for this offering.

The Finance committee has set a goal of \$7,000 for this year's Easter offering which is just a little over twice our typical offering. Over the next several weeks we will communicate in numerous ways the impact of summer camp on our youth and the various options available to support this life-changing ministry.

Just one example of the impact of this ministry was illustrated a few weeks ago when Emma Nehring spoke in worship about her mission trip to Africa. Emma pointed back to a week of church camp when the journey of shaping and modeling her life began.

Camp is expensive. A full week of camp costs \$450 per youth. Our church pays 75% of that cost for active youth in our church, or \$337.50. We do not have to do this, nor do we have to provide support at the 75% level. The unfortunate reality is that the more cost we pass on to parents, the fewer youth will get to go to camp.

Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Camp is a proven ministry that year after year makes a powerful impact upon our youth for Jesus Christ.

I ask you to prayerfully consider now the investment you hope to make in our youth's summer camp program. It is my prayer that many of you will step up with an Easter offering to cover the cost of one week of camp. I know I plan to do just that and invite you to join me and many others in this effort.


Young at Heart is a group of senior adults, that meet monthly, on the second Tuesday, for food, fellowship and a program.

## The Library Corner: New for the New Year

**New and Improved:** We are happy to report that the library took a big step forward in January because we now have a catalog listing of all library items for use by our church library patrons. It took a bunch of work plus some computer wizardry by Gaye Auxier to design and print out this easy-to-use catalog.

The catalog print-outs have been placed in three-ring binders and are located close to the computer desk in the library. One binder contains a list of all books and DVDs in the library by Title, and a second binder contains a list of items by Author. A third binder lists items by Category—for example "Bible Commentaries and Studies", "Christian Life", "Memoirs and Biographies," "Fiction," "Children's" items, etc.

A heartfelt thank you to Gaye for giving her time to this significant improvement!

**New Set of Commentaries:** There's a new scholar in town! The library has a new set of New Testament Bible commentaries / studies by N.T Wright. This set was purchased partly with a donation from Gloria Stoker, and we thank her very much for thinking of the church library.

N.T. Wright was formerly bishop of Durham in England and is currently professor of New Testament and Christianity at St. Andrew in Scotland. These credentials are impressive, but even more so is the ease of reading and studying his "For Everyone" commentary series. He includes his own translation with each Bible passage, and he has spiritual insights to share as well as information about historical context.


Many of you know about the highly respected William Barclay commentaries, which are also in the library. The Wright commentaries make a good study comparison with Barclay's. The two don't always agree—which is a good thing—food for thought!

**New DVDs for Youngsters:** We have some "new" used VeggieTale videos courtesy of an anonymous

donor who left them on our doorstep! Well, not on the doorstep, but on the computer desk in the library, which is almost the same thing. VeggieTales stories present a combination of faith, values, and fun, including "silly songs" in each. They are lively, have an underlying moral message, and appeal to kids—and often to adults as well. The latest arrivals include The Little House that Stood: A Lesson in Making Good Choices, Josh and the Big Wall: a Lesson in Obedience, Celery Night Fever: A Lesson in Forgiveness, and Silly Little Thing Called Love. The "Love" DVD has three stories, each illustrating love in a different context— love of neighbor, love of family, and loving God.



# Murphysboro Ministerial Alliance Christian Scholarship

Deadline March 29, 2019

Applications for the Murphysboro Ministerial Alliance Christian Scholarship are currently being accepted. The recipient must be a graduating senior and a resident of Murphysboro, with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

Proof of registration to a college, university, or trade school is required, along with two letters of recommendation. One letter must be from the pastor of the applicant's church and the other letter must be from a teacher, administrator, or coach of the applicant's high school.

The application and all required documentation must be mailed to the Murphysboro Ministerial Alliance no later than March 29, 2019. Applications are available on the youth bulletin board outside the sanctuary or at the church annex during regular office hours.

### WHAT ARE THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES UP TO?

<u>Faithful Friends</u>, is a class for women of all ages with rotating leaders. During the month of February, Mary Ann Chambers Hinchcliff will be leading the class in the video based study – *Twelve More Women of the Bible* – with life changing stories for women today based on teachings from: Karen Ehman, Lisa Harper, Margaret Feinberg, Biana Juarez Olthoff, Chrystal Evans Hurst, and Courtney Joseph.

<u>Helping Hands</u>, led by Donna Horniacek, is a traditional Bible Study Class for men and women. They will be continuing their Winter series entitled **Our Love of God**. The final unit offers three lessons from Psalms – **Love Songs That Glorify God**.

<u>Passages</u>, led by Randy Auxier, meets in Room 110 (the Church library). In this class participants delve into in-depth studies of theological themes in Christianity, and they are currently studing the book of James.

<u>Pathfinders</u>, led by Michelle Parker-Clark, will be continuing their book study – *After Christmas How Christ's Birth Changed Everything* by Jeremy Royal Howard and Doug Powell. This seven session series addresses The Problem, The Promise, The Fulfillment, The Life, The Teachings, The Cross, and The Resurrection.

<u>Seekers</u>, led by Susan Patterson, are working through a six week video series by Rob Renfroe – *A Way Through the Wilderness: Growing in Faith When Life is Hard*. This series addresses the fact that "At one time or another, everyone has a wilderness experience, a time when life is barren and difficult and we feel alone and desperate, not knowing where to turn. Whether it's the loss of a loved one, a financial or health crisis, divorce, or some other painful experience, we see no end in sight and wonder how we can make it through another day."

<u>Trailblazers</u>, a class for young adults with rotating leaders, focuses on studies about fitting Christ into the big picture. Join them on Sunday morning in Room 108.

### 2018 UMM Annual Report

United Methodist Men (UMM) is the official organization for the purposes to involve men in a growing relationship to Jesus Christ and His church and to provide resources and programs in the area of stewardship and missions.

For the past eight years the United Methodist Men (UMM) have invited the community to our church to enjoy a homemade apple pancake breakfast to help celebrate the Murphysboro Apple Festival. Rather than keep any of the profits, the UMM have voted yearly to support missions at our church and in the community. **Some \$11,400 has been raised the past 8 years!** The programs funded have included food pantry, camping and camping scholarships, helping our youth on their mission trips, and funds to the Little Grassy Camp for the "Buy a Bunk" project. The UMM believe the Little Grassy camp is essential to the spiritual growth of youth in the community so it was an easy decision to support the camp.

For our 2018 annual meeting, we were very pleased to have Coach/Athletic Director at SIU-C., Jerry Kill, discuss his coaching experiences at SIU-C, Northern Illinois University, and Minnesota University. What worked for him as a young man on his father's Kansas farm to eventually becoming the Big 10 coach of the year at Minnesota was how he faced adversity and the importance of establishing positive personal relationships with people.

Other events we have had include attending The Main Event in Nashville, Graduates Breakfast, Feed the Team (Murphysboro HS), attending a Cardinal baseball game and a Saluki football game, serve at the Annual Women's Breakfast, and do minor repairs at the church. One of our best attended events is our Saturday annual meeting at the Bigham Farm. Allen treats us to breakfast and gives us an overview of the latest in farming equipment and the operation of the farm. In 2019, we want to have an overnight to the College of Ozarks and attend the Thresherman's Reunion in Pinckneyville.

If you are not an active member then please consider joining the UMM. Attendance averages 12 men each month. The UMM is open to all men, young and "very mature." We meet on the second Saturday of the month at 7:30 a.m. The breakfast is always very good and "homemade!" For those who would like to enjoy a breakfast including a social time and an occasional devotional, please join us. The topics we discuss range from serious to the sublime.

Pastor Larry has been an active participant in the UMM since arriving here 11 years ago. We will miss his participation. He has an open invitation to join us whenever he wishes!

We thank Jay Graff for his leadership the last 6 years and also thank Rob Williams for being our erstwhile Treasurer.






