WHAT ARE THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES UP TO?

<u>Faithful Friends</u>, is a class for women of all ages with rotating leaders. During the month of June they will be continuing their video based study -- *Twelve More Women of the Bible* -- with life changing stories for women today based on teachings from Karen Ehman, Lisa Harper, Margaret Feinberg, Bianca Juarez Olthoff, Chrystal Evans Hurst, and Courtney Joseph.

Helping Hands, led by Donna Horniacek, is a traditional Bible Study Class for men and women. The Summer 2019 theme is A Covenant in Christ Jesus focusing on how Jesus fulfilled the Law in the sense that it was given full meaning. The first unit - A Fulfilled Covenant - reveals a new sign of the covenant for Jewish and Gentile believers, as recorded in Matthew, Mark, Luke, Hebrews, and Colossians. The second unit - A Heartfelt Covenant - gives new meaning and purpose to the Law. The third unit - Covenant: A Personal Perspective - focuses on personal relationships between people in 1 Samuel, Ruth, and Ephesians.

<u>Passages</u>, led by Randy Auxier, meets in Room 110 (the Church library). In this class participants delve into in-depth studies of theological themes in Christianity. The class will be on hiatus from April 14 thru July 7 while Randy is in Poland.

<u>Pathfinders,</u> led by Michelle Parker-Clark, will be viewing the DVD <u>Unbroken</u>, based on the 2010 non-fiction book by Laura Hillenbrand, <u>Unbroken</u>: A <u>World War II Story of Survival</u>, <u>Resilience and Redemption</u>, which tells the story of USA Olympian and army officer Louis "Louie" Zamperini who survived in a raft for 47 days after his bomber crash-landed in the ocean during the Second World War, then was sent to a series of prisoner of war camps.

<u>Seekers</u>, led by Susan Patterson, will begin continuing the DVD study - *The Call: The Life, Ministry, and Message of the Apostle Paul*. Through author, Adam Hamilton, follow the journeys of Paul, beginning with his dramatic conversion, as he spread the Gospel through modern-day Greece and Turkey. Travel to the early church sites and explore Paul's conversations with the Romans, Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians and Thessalonians. In this six-week study, you are invited to experience faith through Christ's greatest teacher and missionary.

<u>Trailblazers</u>, a class for young adults, focuses on studies about fitting <u>Christ</u> into the big picture.

We have learned so much and been blessed so richly in our time there: praying, worshipping and learning together with this amazingly diverse and vibrant church body. As we near the end of our service here we realize all the more how blessed we have been through these ministry experiences in this season of our family's ministry.



The Library Corner: June in Bloom

Blooming flowers, beautiful brides, celebrations of Father's Day and of Anniversaries — they all come with June! Here are a few books from the library that fit the season:

With this ring: promises to keep, by Joanna Weaver. Weaver looks line-by-line at traditional wedding vows, interspersing them with personal stories, scripture and a variety of interesting and inspiring quotes and poems. Truly a lovely look at the vows we make, and the meaning they have. A good book for engaged couples, newly-marrieds and even those who have been married for a while!

Gift from the Sea, by Anne Morrow Lindbergh. This book is a "classic" and for good reason. Lindbergh's writing is exceptional—lovely, and insightful. Lindbergh, married to Charles Lindbergh, and the mother of five, took a vacation alone by the sea and used the sea shells she found as framework for her meditations on youth, age, marriage as an evolving partnership and other topics. Food for thought and an inspiration not to neglect our own contemplative and creative sides.

To Our Children's Children: Preserving Family Histories for Generations to Come by Bob Greene and D.J. Fulford. What do we leave our children and grandchildren? Property? Money perhaps? The authors say that what doesn't get passed along is "a package of memories of a person's life." (p. 1) Wouldn't it be great to preserve some of the memories that only you—or a few—possess about family and the past? This book is organized into chapters of questions meant to jog memories. Don't let the number of questions scare you! View them as options only, let your memories flow and then write or record the answers to the questions that resonate with you. Give it a try!

And here's some fiction that seems just right for June: **The Wedding Machine** by Beth Hart Webb. Set in Jasper,

South Carolina, the wedding machine consists of four matriarchs of the community who have long made sure weddings are done right for the daughters of Jasper. They are friends


from long ago, but when their own daughters get married, maybe things aren't so easy to manage—and the wedding machine may slip a gear or two.



The Nightingale, by Kristin Hannah

She doesn't believe that the Nazis will invade France...but invade they do, in droves of marching soldiers, in caravans of trucks and tanks, in planes that fill the skies and drop bombs upon the innocent. When France is overrun, Vianne is forced to take an enemy into her house, and suddenly her every move is watched; her life and her child's life is at constant risk. Without food or money or hope, as danger escalates around her, she must make one terrible choice after another.

Vianne's sister, Isabelle, is a rebellious eighteen-year-old girl, searching for purpose with all the reckless passion of youth. While thousands of Parisians march into the unknown terrors of war, she meets the compelling and mysterious Gäetan, a partisan who believes the French can fight the Nazis from within France, and she falls in love as only the young can...completely. When he betrays her, Isabelle races headlong into danger and joins the Resistance, never looking back or giving a thought to the real--and deadly--consequences.




