




Looking for a simple service project close to home?





HEALTHY HABITS

August means summer is soon over for many students and school will soon be starting. People of all ages need physicals and immunizations. Kindergarteners need physicals and "shots" before they start school. So do kids in Pre-K, 6th and 9th grade. But did you know everyone on

Medicare can have a yearly physical with no out-of-pocket cost to them? Lets look at the suggested and/or required immunizations for all ages.

Adults: Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria & acellular Pertussis) especially if around infants under 1 year. This prevents the spread of Diphtheria and Pertussis (Whooping Cough) to babies before they get their regular immunizations series of 3. There has been an increase in Whooping Cough in the last 10 years. Protect your babies: get a Tdap booster

Everyone needs a Tetanus booster at least every 10 years to prevent "lock jaw". Tetanus is a bacteria in the soil that can enter the body via any cut resulting in paralysis that can cause breathing difficulties and death.

Adults over 65: Pneumococcal. One or two injections to prevent certain pneumonias. Children under age 2 also get this type of vaccine. Pneumonia is dangerous for babies and the elderly. This is also suggested for people 19-64 who have weakened immune systems or smoke cigarettes. Herpes Zoster (shingles): The virus is dormant in your body after having Chicken Pox and can cause shingles during times of illness and or stress. Recommended even if you don't recall having Chickenpox as a child.

12 th Grade: Meningococcal conjugate. Prevents certain bacterial menigitis, which can cause severe nerve injury and death sometimes very suddenly. Illinois requires 2nd dose before entry to 12th grade. If first dose given after age 16 only one dose is required.

<u>6th Grade:</u> Hepatitis B-3 doses. *Usually given as infant but not required until 6th grade*. Tdap Meningococcal: 1st dose required for 6th grade/age 11.

*HPV: NOT REQUIRED. TALK WITH YOUR CHILD'S DOCTOR. A series of 3 shots to help prevent the growth of a type of cancer -- suggested for males and females.

<u>Kindergarten:</u> DPT/DTaP: 4 or more doses, last one after 4th birthday Polio: 3 or more doses, last one after 4th birthday. MMR: 2 doses, Chicken Pox: 2 doses

Keep an up-to-date records of all immunizations. There have always been questions regarding immunizations. Illinois schools now must have a written statement from your doctor regarding religious or medical objections to immunizations. Do your research and talk with your health care provider. And with God!

WHAT ARE THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES UP TO?

<u>Faithful Friends</u>, is a class for women of all ages with rotating leaders. Because of summer travels, the class will be taking a vacation during the months of July and August and will resume in September.

Helping Hands, led by Donna Horniacek, is a traditional Bible Study Class for men and women. The Summer 2019 theme is **A Covenant in Christ Jesus** focusing on how Jesus fulfilled the Law in the sense that it was given full meaning. The first unit – **A Fulfilled Covenant** – reveals a new sign of the covenant for Jewish and Gentile believers, as recorded in Matthew, Mark, Luke, Hebrews, and Colossians. The second unit – **A Heartfelt Covenant** – gives new meaning and purpose to the Law. The third unit – **Covenant**: **A Personal Perspective** – focuses on personal relationships between people in 1 Samuel, Ruth, and Ephesians.

<u>Passages</u>, led by Randy Auxier, meets in Room 110 (the Church library). In this class participants delve into in-depth studies of theological themes in Christianity.

Pathfinders, led by Michelle Parker-Clark, will be continuing with the story of USA Olympian and army officer Louis "Louie" Zamperini who survived in a raft for 47 days after his bomber crash-landed in the ocean during the Second World War, then was sent to a series of prisoner of war camps. Based on Laura Hillenbrand's bestselling book, *Unbroken: Path to Redemption* begins where *Unbroken* ends, sharing the next amazing chapter of World War II hero Louis Zamperini's powerful story of forgiveness, redemption, and amazing grace.

<u>Seekers</u>, led by Susan Patterson, will begin continuing the DVD study -- The Call: The Life, Ministry, and Message of the Apostle Paul. Through author, Adam Hamilton, follow the journeys of Paul, beginning with his dramatic conversion, as he spread the Gospel through modern-day Greece and Turkey. Travel to the early church sites and explore Paul's conversations with the Romans, Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Thessalonians. In this six chapter study, you are invited to experience faith through Christ's greatest teacher and missionary.

<u>Trailblazers</u>, a class for young adults, focuses on studies about fitting Christ into the big picture.


