




For many praying alone has it's challenges and then you add the fact that now you have to do it in front of people and many if not most people are anxious or even down right afraid.





Our DVD Collection is Growing

Books, we have books—but we also have DVDs (and some VHS tapes) too!

The biggest collection of VHS tapes and DVDs is for children. The Veggie Tale DVDs and "The Greatest Adventure" Bible stories, on VHS and DVD are great resources to help children understand and relate to Bible stories and to life values. And they're fun too!

The Greatest Adventure series includes "Noah's Ark", "The Miracles of Jesus", and "Moses" (all on DVD), and on VHS there is "Jonah", "Daniel and the Lion's Den", "Joshua and the Battle of Jericho". And there are more!

The library also has the BBC series on the "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" for older children (and we have the paperback books also). Also for older children or family viewing is "Where the Red Fern Grows" about a boy and his dogs during the depression, and his efforts to help his family.

"Soul Surfer" and "Chariots of Fire" are new additions to the library for family or adult viewing. "Grace Card", about the power of forgiveness is another new movie, starring Louis Gosset Jr.

The George Eliot DVD collection contains "Silas Marner" (remember that book from somewhere in your past?) and other stories based on George Eliot's keen observations of human nature.

We also have study resources for adults: "Start—becoming a Good Samaritan", and "Anointed, Transformed, and Redeemed" are two of them.

We are still working on building up the Church DVD collection. If you have thoughts or suggestions on DVDs for children, adults, or family viewing, please let us know.

The Finance Committee has reviewed the first 3 months of 2012 income and expenses. It is good to report that overall giving is close to what was projected. The Service & Mission's giving shown above of \$7,969 is in excess of the regular offerings. During the first quarter, the operating income was favorable. The expectation of increased participation in camping will be our largest program expense this summer. We have wanted this ministry to blossom and it has!

Other items that are important include the current balance of the Renovation Loan is down to \$270,190. The Elevator Fund Balance is \$23,489. The March 31, 2012 market value of the church investments is \$235,163. The Board of Trustees (BOT) receives an average of \$838 per month of dividends from investments and \$222 per month from designated offerings to use for building expenses. The principal amounts of the investments are not used for expenses and are restricted by the BOT.
