#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Several months ago our District Superintendent asked each of the churches of our district to consider doing a year-long program focused around the practice of several spiritual disciplines. I shared this program with our Adult Spiritual Formation committee and after some adaptation to better fit our congregations needs, it was presented to the Church Council for consideration. The Council approved the program, so for 2013 our congregation is going to participate in what is called "The 10x10 Journey".

This program focuses on the practice of ten spiritual disciplines emphasizing a different one each month for 10 months. Some of them are very standard like prayer, stewardship and Bible reading while others are less commonly practiced like fasting and mission work. During the year, numerous workshops will be offered to help support the spiritual emphasis of the month in the attempt to make sure everyone has the tools needed to fully participate in the program.

In January, I will be sharing a great deal more of the details of our year long journey and will at that time extend to everyone an invitation to participate in as much of this journey as you feel you can. My hope is that everyone will find at least a part of the journey that they feel they can join and benefit from.

If I had to state a goal for the year, it would be that everyone in our congregation deepens a spiritual discipline they are currently practicing and hopefully starts at least one new one. This program will offer each of us the opportunity to take a next step on our spiritual journey and it is my prayer that we will all take advantage of this church-wide opportunity.

As we consider resolutions for the New Year, I invite you to consider taking your next step *On The Trail* as a resolution for 2013.





## An Unexpected Gift

This is a little story involving the Seeker's Sunday School class, and how we received an unexpected gift—and in the strangest way. Here's what happened:




We are using an Advent study by James Harnish this year called *Come Home for Christmas*. We have been enjoying this excellent study, which every week features a different Christmas song as part of the study theme. Every Sunday we listen to the "theme" song for that week.

The very first week we played two "theme songs." One was "I'll Be Home for Christmas"; a haunting song that can bring tears to your eyes, and the second song was "O Little Town of Bethlehem". Like many of the older hymns it combines powerful words and lovely music. We found we gained a new appreciation for both songs, just by sitting quietly and listening to the words.

And this is where the truly unexpected occurred. A week or two after beginning this study, when I (Susan Patterson) was browsing in Big Lots—(yep, Big Lots plays a part in this story) I ran across a number of copies of a book on a shelf towards the back of the store. The name of the book is **In the Dark Streets Shineth.** Those are familiar words. They are, in fact, from one of our Advent study theme songs "O Little Town of Bethlehem".

The book is subtitled "A 1941 Christmas Eve Story", and it contains a presentation given by David McCullough, the famous historian. He joined with the Mormon Tabernacle Choir in its 2009 Christmas concert to give a compelling historical account from the early days of World War II of a visit made to the U.S. by British Prime Minister Winston Churchill. The Prime Minister came to consult with President Roosevelt during a perilous time for both countries. England was at war with Germany, and the U.S. had just suffered the attack at Pearl Harbor.



During Churchill's visit both men gave a short speech to the crowd gathered on the White House lawn for the lighting of the National Christmas Tree. Their inspiring message was one of courage, strength, hope and faith.

The book includes wonderful pictures plus the texts of the inspiring speeches by these two great men. There is an accompanying DVD which shows McCullough giving his presentation, along with a performance by the Mormon Tabernacle choir.

Intertwined with this story is McCullough's tribute to music, its role in our lives, and the stories of two Christmas songs, the very two songs the Seeker's class began our Advent Study with: "O Little Town of Bethlehem" and "I'll Be Home for Christmas."

The Seeker's class appreciated this touching and unexpected addition to our Advent Study. You too will be able to read and see this compelling story. The book /DVD set will be in the church library in January. **Enjoy!**




