A little over a year ago, God opened a new door of ministry to our church in the village of DeSoto. For much of our congregation walking through this door has brought little change to your worship life, but for some the change has been dramatic and transformational.

Currently the major ministry emphasis at DeSoto is a Wednesday evening program for children, youth and adults. Within just a few weeks God has brought to this site well over 30 children and youth who attend regularly. Many of these young people are in trouble at home, in trouble at school, and a few have been in trouble with the authorities. To those who work weekly in this program, the calling from God is clear and concise - love on them and make a difference in their lives.

The program begins at 5:30 with a meal and it is not unusual to have children on our parking lot as early as 4 o'clock playing ball games like basketball and four square. While they are there we require them to respect each other in word and action and participate in all aspects of the evening program, which consists of a meal, devotion, recreation time, and some type of bible lesson time, but most importantly to love on them in the name of Christ.

Upon my recommendation, the Finance committee has approved this year's Christmas offering to support this ministry project of our church, to invest in the children and youth of DeSoto and the families they represent. Funds will be used to make some improvements to the building, provide additional equipment, and generally help to supplement the grant funds from the annual conference.

I know some may wonder why in the world we are involved in DeSoto. Well, I feel the answer is quite simple: to make a difference in the lives of children, youth, and adults by inviting them to faith in Jesus Christ. Or maybe better said: to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.





Charles' changed life after conversion led to a very welcome cessation of his drinking. It also led him to preach to people on coaches. The latter habit apparently was not always appreciated! Lee would have enjoyed that story and many others. We hope you do too!
