During the month of July our spiritual focus will be *fasting*. If you look up *fasting* on the Internet, you will find a vast array of information. It is a spiritual discipline, which is practiced in dozens of religions around the world and has been for thousands of years. Ancient writings of various religious traditions record the application of *fasting* as a way to more fully connect with the spiritual life of that faith.

However, if you ask others or me why is *fasting* associated with spiritual practices or how does fasting help us become more spiritual it might be difficult to get a clear and precise answer. I guess I might have to say I really don't understand how or why it works but it has for thousands of years and still does today.

But don't take my word for it. During this month, I invite you to practice the discipline of *fasting*. We will offer a different type of fast each week in the hopes that one, if not all of them, might help you experience the spiritual benefits of this discipline which have been recorded for years.

As we consider this emphasis on *fasting* I would like to share with you one of many passages of scripture on this topic. The Old Testament prophet Isaiah shares a stirring account of *fasting* in the 58th chapter of his book. Here the writer clearly strikes at the heart of the purpose of all spiritual disciplines ~ to transform us as persons into who God created and called us to be.

Take a moment and read Isaiah 58 and set your heart and mind to practice *fasting*.

Ah, the pleasure of taking a break from our daily routines by picking up a book and reading about other lives and other times! Here is a sampling of fiction from the church library - some drama, some mystery, some romance, and all absorbing--just the thing for relaxing on a warm summer afternoon!

**Safe at Home** by Richard Doster. It's summer. It's 1953. It's baseball. What's not to like? There's a lot to like in this novel of a small southern town, proud of its local team the Bobcats, although the team is not doing too well this year. What does it need? A star player. And what if the star that shows up is black, not white? Here is a test of hearts, minds, and faith in a town that needed to change - but just didn't know it yet.

**All She Ever Wanted**, by Lynn Austin. This is our newest fiction book by this very popular author and Christy award winner. In this book a woman estranged from her family for many years goes back home again in the hope that by doing so she can salvage her relationship to her own daughter. The journey back home into her past also leads her to secrets from the pasts of her own mother and grandmother.


**Water's Edge** by Robert Whitlow. Nothing is going right for the up-and-coming young attorney Tom Crane. His father dies in a boating accident, and then in quick succession he loses his job, and his fiancé calls it quits. He reluctantly returns home to deal with his father's estate, but finds himself in deep and mysterious waters, as he finds a secret bank account, and evidence his father's death may not have been accidental. And the plot thickens from there!

The **East of Eden** series, starting with **Tomorrow's Treasure**. Love, betrayal, war, a fabulous stolen diamond—all of this is in the background of Evy Varley, who has no idea of the drama and secrets that are in her family's past. This young woman, full of faith, must find out about the past in order to find her future.

**The Secret** is the first book in the "Seasons of Grace" series of Amish novels by popular author Beverly Lewis. The young world of Grace Byler falls apart when her mother first takes to leaving the house on mysterious walks at night, and then just leaves all together—with no explanation to her husband Judah, or to Grace, or to any of the family.


