

The Wisdom of the Prophets

The library has four new pocket-size very short books. They could be called "blessing" books. They are not quite "devotional" reading, because devotions have a more extended, narrated message. By contrast, in these new books, each selection, each brief entry, is about as long as a blessing.

These books are (perhaps) pre-devotional reading; they are "preludes" to prayer. Like the Prelude before the Sunday service, the four books are invitational. They can lead us into a reflective, listening attitude, a prayerful state of heart and mind.

<u>Prayers of the Ages</u> includes brief passages of Scripture, some stanzas of hymns, occasionally lines from a poem. In this book, as well as in <u>Hope of the Ages</u>, and the selection of Frost's poetry, there are splendid reproductions of paintings.

The <u>Wisdom of the Prophets</u> has somewhat longer selections, but similar format. All four books invite reflection rather than study. And on occasion, they can move a person right into prayer itself.

Below is a sampling of the blessings these books have to offer:

"Be patient with everyone, but above all with yourself. I mean, do not be disheartened by your imperfections, but always rise up with fresh courage."


