

The Journey: A Reader Review by Kristi Miller

We love Christmas, and almost everything about it. But have you noticed how hard it is in the hustle and

hurry of the holidays to keep mind and heart fixed on the holiness at the center of this season?



Name of the book: The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem, by Adam Hamilton.

What is this book about? A fresh examination of the story of Jesus' birth.

What makes this book interesting or meaningful?

This book takes the story as we have known it since childhood and develops it further by introducing new information:

Discussion of the geography of the towns involved

Different thoughts on Joseph, including his age

Information about Mary and her childhood

Why Mary and Joseph weren't at Joseph's family home for Jesus' birth

Do you recommend this book to others? Absolutely. The author walks you through the story in a way that puts you in Nazareth and Bethlehem. Spend five hours reading this book and it changes Christmas!

Library Notes: The church library has two copies of "The Journey", and you can find one either upstairs in the hall on the library table, or downstairs in the library.

Pastor Larry's Sunday School class has been studying this book and viewing the accompanying DVD, which is set in the holy land. The DVD will be in the church library after the completion of their study.

Other DVD / book studies for Christmas are also available. We have "The Advent Conspiracy", "A Different Kind of Christmas", and "The Purpose of Christmas".

For inspiration and uplift there are a number of other adult and children's books and DVDS focused on Christmas. We recommend "In the Dark Streets Shineth" a unique historical and musical remembrance by historian David McCullough, and The Nativity Story.

Sunday Morning Announcements Guidelines

 Announcements should be e-mailed to the Worship Leader, with a copy to the Church office, by 11:00 a.m. on Friday. The names and email addresses of the Worship Leaders will be printed in the Compass monthly.

- In *emergency situations*, announcements must be hand-delivered to the Worship Leader no later than 8:00 a.m. on Sunday morning.
- The Worship Leader has the right to edit announcements as necessary, especially if it is particularly lengthy or there are numerous announcements on a given Sunday.
- The Worship Leader will make the announcement no more than two times, unless an
 exception is approved by the Publicity and Promotions Team in advance.
- Announcements will be made by the Worship Leader. Pastor will make announcements on an
 exception basis when an item warrants special emphasis. These exceptions should be
 submitted to the Publicity and Promotions Team for prior approval.


