#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As I write, the temperature has edged up into the 60's and everyone is beginning to talk about spring. I generally enjoy winter, but even I must admit I am about ready for this one to be over. As I consider this change in season, I am reminded of another season change which is also just around the corner - the beginning of the season of Lent in the church.

Ash Wednesday is March 5 and we will be holding our Ash Wednesday service that evening at 7pm. This will officially begin the season of Lent, a season which holds both the lows of death and suffering, with the joys of praise and triumph. It is a season which invites us to consider not only the wonderful gift of our relationship with God, but the tremendous cost of that gift paid by Jesus in sacrifice and disgrace.

In so many ways Lent is a season of contrast, helping us to experience the fullness of the God we worship. A God so powerful as to raise Jesus from the dead but also so personal that Jesus would live among us as a man. A God so humble as to wash his disciples' feet and yet so dynamic as to drive moneychangers from the Temple with a whip.

It will help you truly experience the words of the apostle Paul who writes in Ephesians: 3:18-19, "... to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge."

The Library Corner: Bound for Easter

Easter. It is the most joyous and triumphant day of the Christian year. But the path to Easter — to the resurrection — was an incredibly hard path for Jesus. Because we know the glorious end of the story, what happens before that end—the opposition of religious leaders, the fickleness of the people, the lack of understanding of the disciples, rejection, beating—may not seem as real to us.

Lent is a time of reflection, repentance, and meditation. The library has resources that can help make the path to the cross and beyond both more understandable and more real. Here are some of the resources that can make your own journey to Easter deeper and more meaningful:

**And the Angels Were Silent, the Final Week of Jesus** by Max Lucado. Lucado says: "Feel his passion . . . Sense his power . . . Hear his promise . . . Let's follow Jesus on his final journey. For by observing his, we may learn how to make ours."

**Preparing My Heart for Easter, a Woman's Journey to the Cross and Beyond** by Ann Marie Stewart. As an actor in a community passion play, Stewart had an opportunity to play the roles of several of the devoted women who followed Christ. Stewart looks at the journeys of these women, and how Jesus changed their lives, and invites women to realize how the stories of Jesus' followers can change lives today.

**24 Hours That Changed the World** by Adam Hamilton. Those 24 hours start with Jesus and disciples in the Upper Room for the Last Supper, and follow him through the next hours to his death on the cross. The final chapter is "Christ the Victor". Hamilton writes with great thoughtfulness and spiritual insight, as well as a knowledge of historical detail that brings it all to life for us.

In Remembrance, their Last Supper Together (DVD) This DVD is from Grace Products, and it was made in association with the Walk to Emmaus. It is a close look at Jesus and his disciples at the Last Supper. This film was shown as part of the Walk to Emmaus experience until a year or so ago. Now it has been released for others to see. The disciples are brought to life in all their humanness, which is to say they are not perfect! Every time we have communion we are remembering the Last Supper. Watching this DVD will make it more real for you than ever.

Look for these and other resources related to Jesus' life in the library downstairs and on the library table in the upstairs hall. If you have questions about these or other materials in the library talk with Trina Eaton, Candy Watt, or Susan Patterson.

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) at MUMC about Early and Late Services

With planning and preparation for an additional worship service come a lot of questions. Here are several questions - with answers - that we've encountered so far. This list will continue to grow as time draws near, which is all part of the process as we celebrate and grow together!

#### • Will there be changes to the early service?

No, the early service will remain the same with the exception of a change in attendance. Early service will remain at 9 and Sunday school at 10:10. The late service will probably begin at 11:15.

#### Will style of early service change?

No changes will take place beyond the tweaking that the worship team does on a regular basis to make sure that the worship experience is the best it can be. The early service will continue to sing from the hymnal, enjoy the Chancel and Hand bell Choirs, and special music.

### • Will technology ever be used in the early service?

Yes, announcements before the service begins and scripture readings will be projected on the screens so everyone can see them. Sometimes, video clips or slides to support sermon topics will also be used.

#### Will Pastor Larry be preaching at the late service?

Pastor Larry will be preaching and delivering the same sermon at both services.

### • What will the style and music of the late service be like?

The environment will be more casual. Pastor will not wear a suit and tie. Live praise and contemporary music will be led and sung by a worship team. There will not be as much liturgy. The service will last about an hour.

#### Will there be separate servers in each service?

Yes, it is anticipated that separate acolytes, greeters, ushers, hostesses, etc. will be needed.

#### Will communion be served at both services in the same way?

Communion will be served on the same schedule at both services. Communion will be by intinction at the late service with the opportunity for prayer at the communion rail if you desire. With an adjustment in attendance, it is anticipated that the communion rail will be used in the early service.

#### Will there be Children's Church?

At this time it is not planned to have Children's Church at the late service.

#### How will Sunday School be affected?

The Sunday School program will grow to accommodate new attendees.



March 5th at 7:00pm

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent in the Western Christian calendar. Occurring 46 days before Easter, it is a moveable fast that can fall as early as February 4 and as late as March 10.

According to the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus spent 40 days fasting in the desert, where he endured temptation by Satan.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of this 40-day liturgical period of prayer and fasting or abstinence. Of the 46 days until Easter, six are Sundays. As the Christian Sabbath, Sundays are not included in the fasting period and are instead "feast" days during Lent.

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of adherents as a celebration and reminder of human mortality, and as a sign of mourning and repentance to God. The ashes used are typically gathered from the burning of the palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday.



We must have a final count and all money turned in by April 1. There are no refunds. We are responsible for all registrants even if they do not participate.


We plan to arrive by 7pm on Sunday June 8th for the orientation.


