



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As the start of our additional worship experience draws closer, there are lots and lots of questions. Several individuals have worked to help develop the document below, which attempts to address the most common questions and just give a great deal of general information about the new worship service. I hope you find this information helpful. If you have a question which is not answered here, please do not hesitate to give me a call or send me an email and I will attempt to provide an answer.

 What will the attire be like at the later service?

Just as for the early service, you should wear what you feel is comfortable and appropriate for a worship service.

Will the nursery be offered during the late service?

Yes, the nursery will be available for your children.

Will there be changes to the early service?

No, the early service will remain the same with the exception of a change in attendance. Early service will remain at 9 and Sunday school at 10:10. The late service will probably begin at 11:15 and last 1 hour.

Will style of early service change?

No changes will take place beyond the tweaking that the worship team does on a regular basis to make sure that the worship experience is the best it can be. The early service will continue to sing from the hymnal, enjoy the Chancel and Hand bell Choirs, and special music.

 Will technology ever be used in the early service?

> Announcements before the service begins and scripture readings will be projected on the screens so everyone can see them. Sometimes, video clips or slides to support sermon topics will also be used.

Will Pastor Larry be preaching at the late service?

Pastor Larry will be preaching and delivering the same sermon at both services.

 What will the style and music of the late service be like?

The environment will be more casual. Pastor will not wear a suit and tie. Live praise and contemporary music will be led and sung by a worship team. There will not be as much liturgy. The service will last about an hour.

Will there be separate servers in each service?

Yes, it is anticipated that separate acolytes, greeters, ushers, hostesses, etc. will be needed.

 Will communion be served at both services in the same way?

Communion will be served on the same schedule at both services. Communion will be by intinction at the late service with the opportunity for prayer at the communion rail if you desire. With an adjustment in attendance, it is anticipated that the communion rail will be used in the early service.

Will there be Children's Church?
 At this time it is not planned to have Children's Church at the late
 service

How will Sunday School be affected?
 The Sunday School program will grow to accommodate new attendees.

When will the late service begin?

It begins on Easter Sunday and the 3rd Sunday of every month there after until the weekly services begin Sept. 21st.

The Library Corner: To Heaven and Back

We sing hymns about heaven. We think about heaven. We wonder what heaven will be like, but how can we know? There are some people who say they do know, and they give us personal accounts of their experiences of going to heaven and back. Fascinating? You bet! Here are three books narrating personal experiences, that we have in the library:

Heaven is For Real: a Little Boy's Astounding Story of His Trip to Heaven and Back by Todd Burpo

Todd Burpo is a pastor in a small town in Nebraska. After his four year old son Colton almost dies from a serious illness, Colton begins to tell his dad and mom about his visit to heaven, and his encounter with Jesus. Among other details, Colton emphatically affirms the love of Jesus for children.

To Heaven and Back: a doctor's extraordinary account of her death, heaven, angels, and life again: a true story

by Mary C. Neal

Mary Neal, an orthopedic surgeon, was kayaking in Chile when her kayak overturned and she was pinned underwater long enough to drown before her companions could rescue her. Neal describes her experience of heaven, and states that like patients of hers that have described their own experiences she had "an overwhelming sense of God's love and forgiveness", and also said she had no desire to return to earth. Needless to say this life changing experience really did change her life. She describes a life of gratitude, joy, and purpose.

90 Minutes in Heaven by Don Piper with Cecil Murphy Piper was also in an accident. He is a Baptist minister who was driving home from a conference when a semitruck crossed the center line and crashed into him. When rescue personnel arrived, they pronounced him dead at the scene. Another pastor who came upon the scene prayed over him, and he lived. His description of heaven includes meeting the people who were his spiritual influences and also experiencing a feeling of true peace. His recovery was long and difficult, and he did not write this memoir until urged to do so by friends and family. Our library copy of his book is in large print.

This is a beautiful book in every way. The illustrations are

children an idea of the depth, breadth, and vastness of
the love of God. A boy and his parents visit the ocean

WHAT IS MAUNDY THURSDAY?

The Christian feast, or holy day, falling on the Thursday before Easter. It commemorates the Maundy and Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles as described in the Canonical gospels. It is the fifth day of Holy Week, and is followed by Good Friday.

The liturgy held on the evening of Maundy Thursday initiates the Easter Triduum, the period which commemorates the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ; this period includes Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and ends on the evening of Easter. The service of worship is normally celebrated in the evening, when Friday begins according to Jewish tradition, as the Last Supper was held on feast of Passover.
