FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The last few weeks have brought many new changes into our church. We are:

- In the final stage of our long awaited elevator project
- We have just conducted our second new worship service
- We have new technology operational in the sanctuary
- We have completed a much needed sound system upgrade
- Several Sunday School classes have moved to new spaces in an attempt to right-size our building use.

Often change produces questions, so I would like to take just a moment and give what I hope are some bits of helpful information for everyone.

Our final phase of the elevator project is the addition and expansion of parking. A new driving lane will be added with additional parking on both sides of the lane. Also the Trustees voted to expand our parking lot with an additional row of parking. These additions will add a total of 18 new parking places and make the process of dropping off people near the church much easier.

Our Elevator Project, when complete, will have cost us \$275,329.86, and we borrowed \$159,500.00 to complete the project. Our capital campaign goal was \$200,000.00 and we raised 207,812.00 and had \$43,594.36 on hand when we began the project. It is very possible we could be totally debt free in less than three years, which would be great.

Our new worship service, which is being called Praise Service, was conducted for the second time on May 18th. In our first two services we have had a combined attendance of 200. which is already considerably higher than I had even hoped. We will have additional services on June 15th, July 20, and August 17, then start weekly services beginning September 21. Of the 200 who have attended this new service, about 45 of them also attended the early service on that respective Sunday; which means 155 were unduplicated worshipers.

Probably all of you have noticed the new technology in the Sanctuary. While we pushed to have it completed for the first Easter Praise Service, the goal to bring technology into our sanctuary goes all the way back to Worship Planning Team conversations in 2012. Over the past several months, we have spent a little over \$33,000 on technology additions and sound system upgrades. Some of this spending goes back to 2013, when some of the technology being used was purchased to support the new youth worship service we hold as a part of our youth program. The Finance committee this year established a budget line item for the Praise Service of \$26,000 to help cover these costs. They also understood that virtually all of these funds would need to be disbursed in a short period of time and planned to take a short term loan to help with the cash flow crunch created by such large simultaneous expenditures.

With the budget line item and some generous additional donations, we are close to covering this cost. As I write this, the short-term loan has not yet been secured but should be soon, and can hopefully be paid off in a few months.

I hope this information is helpful and allows you to understand a little more about what our church is doing and why. Our mission is to MAKE DISCIPLES OF JESUS CHRIST FOR THE TRANSORMATION OF THE WORLD. Over the last few months we have all invested deeply in helping to fulfill that mission.



Phase 3 Construction

You may have noticed that the Church yard is covered with survey stakes. These are for the contractor to use to construct Phase 3 of our Elevator Construction Project, the Parking Lot Addition. The Parking Lot Addition includes adding a Drop Off Lane and 9 parking spaces. As you may remember back on August 27, 2013, the Congregation approved a 3-Phase Construction Project with an estimated construction cost of \$282,000. I am happy to report with what we have spent so far on the completed elevator construction, and the signed contract for the Parking Lot improvements, we will have spent a total of approximately \$275,000. This also includes the addition of 9 parking spaces in the South parking lot, which was not part of our original estimate.

Thank you for putting up with all of the messy conditions during construction, and for your unbelievable support of this project. Just a few more weeks with the parking lot modifications and we will be mess free.



The Library Corner: Studying for Life



We've all engaged in studies for various reasons, perhaps for a test, a grade, or a degree. But how about studying for our life? Our spiritual life, that is. Study of any kind can bring rewards, but never more so than when it helps us follow our spiritual path. God can speak to us through what we read, whether we are studying the Bible, or reading about spiritual issues and insights experienced by other peopl*e*. Here are some of the study resources in the church library:

The NEW Daily Study Bible by William Barclay is one of the easiest and most rewarding New Testament Bible studies. In these books Barclay first gives the Bible passage, then provides useful information about the historical background, plus some of the rich spiritual insights he has gained from his studies. For each book of the New Testament there are one or two corresponding Barclay study books, making it easy to pick up and study any individual NT book.

10 Life Charged Words: Real Faith for Men, by

Derek Maul. In this brief, direct and "to the point" book, Maul discusses 10 significant words and gives thoughts about the importance of the word or issue to a man's Christian life. His first word is "Jesus" and he follows that with words such as "Excellence," "Capacity," "Authenticity," and "Community". Each discussion concludes with questions related to growth in faith and the church community. Here's a quote: "So let's demonstrate to the world that Jesus is the Lord of the positive, not the champion of the 'thou shalt nots'!"(p. 22)

Life Interrupted: Navigating the Unexpected by

Priscilla Shirer. Could your life be like Jonah's? Has it taken some turns that are not what you wanted, not what you expected, and just... interrupted? Shirer uses the story of Jonah, plus examples from her own very interrupted life to discuss how God may use these "interruptions" to set us onto a life path that will have meaning and value, even though very different from our original plans.

Faith Lesson Series by Ray Vander Laan. Vander Laan is a teacher and historian who has put together a 12 part DVD series set in Israel and the Mid-East. These fascinating videos put us in the footsteps of the ancient Israelites and in the life of Jesus, bringing together history, culture, geography and the Gospel story. We have several of these DVD studies in the library, including "Life and Ministry of the Messiah", "Death and Resurrection of the Messiah", and "Walking with God in the Desert". Walking with God in the Desert is especially meant to help the faithful see the ways that God is with us, even as we are walking in our own desert.

There are other studies, DVDs, and books of interest in the library downstairs, and on the library table in the upper hall. And if you find a resource that is truly helpful to you, why not write a review that we can publish and let others know? Thank you!


