FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I want to take a moment to reflect with you on our Easter Sunday at MUMC. We had so much going on that was new, and it was truly exciting to be a part of it.

I want to begin by just saying a huge THANK YOU to the dozens of people who worked long hours, putting so many pieces of our Holy Week services together. I will not even attempt to start a list, but you all know who you are, and I thank God for your tremendous dedication and commitment.

This year a total of 470 people celebrated Easter together during 3 worship services. Of that number, somewhere around 30 to 40 worshipped in two of the services, with the largest duplication being in the late 11:15am service. Of the 115 people who did attend the late service, 75 to 80 of them attended only that service on Easter Sunday.

I would not need to convince anyone who attended the 9am service that we just did not have room for an additional 75 to 80 people in our sanctuary. Picture those people - some of them attending our church for the very first time, several who came in response to the direct invitation of members of congregation – they would not have had a seat without that additional worship service.

No one needs to tell me church is not about numbers - it is about people. Each of these numbers represents a life, a person. Our church touched more people and reached more lives this past week than we have in a long time. I just thank God for giving us the vision, and for blessing our efforts to fulfill our mission of making disciples for Jesus Christ. I thank the leadership who had the courage to step forward and embrace the vision of God for our church.



The Library Corner: Drama, Dreams, and Devotions

The Kitchen House, reviewed by Trina Eaton.

"Dramatic" and "absorbing" are two words to describe this book. The book is set in the pre-civil war South, where violence underlies much of the social order.

Orphaned while onboard a ship from Ireland, seven-year-old Lavinia arrives on the steps of a tobacco plantation where she is to live and work with the slaves of the kitchen house. Under the care of Belle, the master's illegitimate daughter, Lavinia becomes deeply bonded to her adopted family, though she is set apart from them by her white skin.

Eventually, Lavinia is accepted into the world of the big house, where the master is absent and the mistress battles opium addiction. Lavinia attempts to straddle both the worlds of the kitchen house and the big house but when she is forced to make a choice, loyalties are questioned, dangerous truths are made known, and lives are put at risk.

I liked how the story was told through the viewpoints of the two main characters, Lavinia and Belle. The story reminds us of those who have suffered the indignities of both race and class slavery.

I highly recommend this book!

by Francine Rivers is a fictional family saga spanning generations of mothers and daughters. The story begins in Europe at the turn of the century and ends in the U. S. in our own time. Based partly on details of Rivers' own family, these two books are fascinating reading.

Always There: Reflections for Moms on God's Presence, edited by Susan Besze Wallace, and written by various writers, including Ann Voskamp and Renee Swope. Striking the theme of "God is with us" these women explore the ups and downs of motherhood, the good times and the hard times, the humor and the frustrations—and how they have drawn strength from realizing that God is present, in both the best and worst of times.

Faith for a Lifetime: Daily Inspiration for Women of Faith by various writers, including
Sheila Walsh, Luci Swindoll, and Patsy Clairmont.
These brief devotions give a Bible verse and some food for thought on a daily basis, all meant to inspire and enrich life from day to day.


