One of the joys I experienced as a child growing up was spending a part of my summers on extended visits to my grandparents. Often, shortly after school was out, we would make the drive from our home in Washington, Illinois to our grandparents, just north of Murphysboro, and I would get to spend the next couple of weeks visiting on their farm.

A family ritual I was fortunate to participate in several times during those stays was the annual Memorial Day graveyard visitation trip. My grandparents would put several bouquets of plastic flowers in the trunk of their car and off we would go to locate graves and place flowers.

One of my favorite cemeteries was the old Creek Paum north and west of Vergennes. Grandpa's father and uncle were buried there side by side. They were killed standing next to each other in a coal mine collapse when my grandfather was only a few months old. Even as a little boy, I remember the tragedy and sadness in that family story I heard each time we visited the cemetery.

Memorial Day began as a time set aside to honor the fallen of the Civil War. It has over the years expanded to include all military fallen and our loved ones in general. It is a great time to remember and share important family stories, to honor those who have served our country in military service and remember those who have touched your life.



The Library Corner: May Days

Mother's Day—it's a great time to celebrate mothers and all of the nurturing women in our lives. On Sunday May 10th we will be thinking of our mothers, and mothers will be thinking of their children, as mothers tend to do! Check the upstairs library table and the library downstairs for books related to moms—there are a variety of materials, including the serious and the fun, the prayers and the practical.

At the end of May, Memorial Day will turn our thoughts to all of those who have passed on before us, especially those who in some way were involved in past wars. Please check the library displays for materials related to war and its consequences. Here are some books that will be available:

Higher Call, by Adam Makos with Larry Alexander. This is a true story about an act of mercy which was long unknown. In the middle of World War II, a German pilot, Franz Stigler, does NOT shoot down a badly damaged American war plane, thus sparing those still left alive on the plane. This encounter haunts Stigler and the pilot of the American plane, Charlie Brown, for forty years, until finally they have a chance to meet each other face to face.

The Hiding Place, by Corrie Ten Boom with Elizabeth and John Sherrill. Corrie and her family were devout Christians living in Holland before World War II. Then the Germans invaded Holland. What would you do? What Corrie and her family did was to help Jews by hiding them in their home. Eventually the family was betrayed, and sent to a concentration camp. But Corrie's story does not end there, and neither does her faith.

The Zookeeper's Wife: A War Story, by Diane Ackerman. A zookeeper's wife—how did she become involved in war? It happened! When the Germans invaded Poland in World War II Jan Zobinski was the Director of the Warsaw Zoo. He and his wife Antonia lived on the zoo grounds. The Zobinskis loved the animals, but they also cared deeply for people who were in grave danger. They put their own lives in danger to help rescue a number of Jews, and Antonia watched over these hidden "guests" on the zoo grounds, until they could be sent on to someplace safer.

War can bring out the worst in some, and the best in others. Read about some of the best. It's fascinating, and it's awe-inspiring!

First he lost his voice and stopped eating. Then he slept constantly and shunned human contact. Doctors were mystified. Within eighteen months he was mute and wheelchair-bound. Martin's parents were told an unknown degenerative disease left him with the mind of a baby and less than two years to live. Martin was moved to care centers for severely disabled children. The stress and heartache shook his parents' marriage and their family to the core. Their boy was gone. Or so they thought.

Ghost Boy is the heart-wrenching story of one boy's return to life through the power of love and faith. In these pages. readers see a parent's resilience, the consequences of misdiagnosis, abuse at the hands of cruel caretakers, and the unthinkable duration of Martin's mental alertness betrayed by his lifeless body.

We also see a life reclaimed—a business created, a new love kindled—all from a wheelchair. Martin's emergence from his own darkness invites us to celebrate our own lives and fight for a better life for others.


Do you like to know when people miss you?
