FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A long time goal and priority set by our church leadership is finally becoming a reality. This week the preliminary work was completed to order a new 14-passenger-plus-driver church bus (15 people but with a bus they just list it this way) to replace our aging 15-passenger white van.

This was a priority set at the fall leadership retreat in 2014 and then was soon after affirmed by the church council as a 2015 church goal. Later, as we began the work of the Envisioning Team which came out of our spring retreat this year, a new church bus was in that list of priorities as well.

As a part of the Envisioning process and getting cost estimates on the various projects listed, we discovered a bus-sales company which offered a price considerably below anything we had found to this point. In conversations with various leadership, we began to consider the option of moving forward with this purchase as an early step in our overall updating work.

Due to safety concerns, we have removed the rear seat of our current white van and limited seating to no more than 10 or 11 persons. The new bus will fulfill our goal of hauling up to 14 adults in much greater comfort and safety, and will require the same level of driver license as the current 15-passenger van.

Last month at our Trustee and Finance committee meetings, the bus concept was discussed and approved. A significant lead gift has already been given which will more than cover the 10% down payment required.

Sometime in the next few weeks a video presentation on the bus will be shared with the congregation during our regular announcement time, with exact information on cost and features. The following week we will be asking for a one-time offering to help cover some of the cost and reduce the amount of funds we will need to borrow. The exact cost is not known at this time but an estimate is in the \$57,000 range, which will be reduced by a \$4000 trade-in allowance for our white van.

Those of us who have been involved in the various trip ministries of our church have dreamed of this day for a long time. This ministry tool will open up a whole new world of transportation ministry options for children, youth and adults.





Saturday, July 18th at 10:15 a.m. The Book for July is <u>The Girl on the Train</u> by Paula Hawkins

A debut psychological thriller that will forever change the way you look at other people's lives.
