

It's Germany, 1660: When a dying boy is pulled from the river with a mark crudely tattooed on his shoulder. hangman Jakob Kuisl is called upon to investigate whether witchcraft is at play. So begins The Hangman's Daughter-the chillingly detailed, fast-paced historical thriller from German television screenwriter, Oliver Pötzsch-a descendent of the Kuisls, a famous Bayarian executioner clan.

Summer is passing by faster than a speeding locomotive! But you can still get in a little more summer reading—if you get right on it! To help with that, the library team members have some suggestions for you from the church library fiction section. So pour that glass of lemonade and relax for just a little while longer . . .



#### **Suggested by Trina Eaton and Candy Watt:**

**Take This Cup (Jerusalem Chronicles)** by Bodie and Brock Thoene. "Woven into the fabric of prophecy, a young boy named Nehemiah must choose to embrace his destiny as cupbearer to the King of Kings." If you like historical Christian fiction, check this one out.

By Reason of Insanity, by Randy Singer. "A series of unsolved murders. A woman who knows too much. A lawyer in over his head. Sometimes, insanity is the only way out." If you like John Grisham you will want to try this one!

**One Thousand White Women: The Journals of May Dodd** by Jim Fergus. Based on an actual historical request by a Chevenne Chieftain to President Grant for 1000 white women to intermarry with his tribe, this book imagines what might have happened had the request been granted. The diary entries describe the journey west and marriage to the Indian Chief. Fascinating descriptions of the West and of life as it was lived by the Indians are part of this riveting narrative.

#### **Suggested by Kathy Bratton:**

**The Kitchen House** by Kathleen Grissom. This is the story of a young white girl who is orphaned on her passage from Ireland. Scared and alone she arrives at a tobacco plantation in Virginia. She is placed under the care of the slaves, where she sees up close the heartbreak of slavery while finding love and acceptance with her new family.



#### Suggested by Susan Patterson:

The No. 1 Ladies Detective Agency, by Alexander McCall Smith. Precious Ramotswe runs the only detective agency in the entire African country of Botswana. She takes this bold step because she wants to "help people with the problems in their lives." Using her wits, her knowledge of her country and her people, and her experiences with the waywardness of the human heart, she tracks down answers to the problems that are brought to her. But when it comes to a missing eleven year old boy, she is up against something wicked.

This is the first book in a series that has both charm and wisdom. The series, which was also made into a TV series on HBO, includes titles like Morality for Beautiful Girls, and The Kalahari Typing School for Men.
