Appropriate clothing items were taken to a local nursing home.

Thanks to all who helped with the sale in any way. The proceeds, totaling \$3790, will be distributed by the Service and Missions Committee.

One of the pleasures of Children's Moments at our worship services in recent weeks has been seeing Pastor Larry read Bible stories to the children. He holds the book, complete with pictures, and tells them a story from the life of Jesus.

Now, sometimes it is a little hard to capture every child's attention! They may not always get every bit of the story, but that is where the rest of us come in, as we read and discuss Bible stories with our children and grandchildren.

Many may have already found Bible story resources to use with kids, but if you would like to look at other resources, there is a variety of items in the church library to "try out" with the children in your life. Resources are available for the very young up to the teen years. Some examples:

My First Read and Learn Bible (board book)

Noah's Ark Pop-Up Book, The First Rainbow, Baby Jesus is Born (all board books) **Little Children's Bible Story Book**

Read 'n' See DVD Bible

Other DVD Bible stories such as Veggie Tales: Gideon, Tuba Warrior, and Heroes of the Bible

Illustrated Bible - New Testament (illustrated comic book style)

Deep Blue Kids Bible (this is the new Common English translation)

NIV Teen Study Bible

And here is one last item, for the kids, which may be the most popular of all-- the **Brick Bible.** Yes, you are reading right. We have both Old and New Testaments with Lego illustrations! It's fascinating to children and adults alike.


And finally, there are two new resources to help parents and grandparents enrich the faith of the children in their lives. Have a look at these:

In this book there are familiar prayers and new ones too—all designed to support your efforts to enrich the lives of the whole family.

Passing It On: How to Nurture Your Children's Faith by Kara Lassen Oliver. This book addresses important times of the year in the life of families and the church—Advent, Lent, summer, and back to school. Each of these sections offers easy to follow suggestions on ways to nurture your child's faith, season by season.

Try some of these out—they will be on display on the library table upstairs, and downstairs in the library.
