From the Pastor's Desk

Last week I spent some time selecting all the hymns for the Advent/ Christmas season. This is job I enjoy because I just love the truly amazing Christmas music the Church has created over the past 2000 years. It would be impossible for me to name a favorite, but there is one I look forward to every year and I almost always use it the first Sunday of Advent. Hymn 196, "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus." The music is by Rowland Prichard but the words are all Charles Wesley.

For me it is all in the first few words of the song: "Come, thou long-expected Jesus, born to set thy people free." For me this is the heart of it, the heart of Christmas, the heart of faith, the heart of God: Freedom.

You see, wickedness is all about controlling us, imprisoning us, breaking us down and keeping us down. It lives off of shame, regret, anger, hatred, lust, jealousy, humiliation, just to name a few – and it is always telling us how we are not good enough. But God, on the other hand, is about love, grace, forgiveness, acceptance, empowerment and always proclaiming to us and the world that we are loved unconditionally.

And so Jesus, God's gift to the world, comes to set us free, to help us break away from the bondage of sin and this broken world, to be free to live as the sons and daughters of God.

And so as you have opportunity during this Advent season, turn to this beautiful hymn and hear the words of hope and love that are being sung as God's prayer for you. Jesus came into the world to set you free - not a bad Christmas Gift.



The Library Corner: Many Ways to Enjoy Christmas

The Church Library has a number of items to enhance your Christmas enjoyment—maybe something to listen to as you wrap presents or bake goodies, or something to read while you have a quiet cup of tea or coffee, or something to watch as you relax or address the last of the

Christmas cards. Here are some ideas for you:

Listen: Steven Curtis Chapman's Christmas CD, **Joy** is new to the library. Also new is a book and CD combo featuring Mark Lowry singing "**Mary Did You Know**". Try it—we can just about guarantee you will look at the book and listen to this moving song more than once! How about an audio book Christmas novel from Debbie Macomber, such as **Cedar Cove Christmas**, or **The Perfect Christmas**? Or listen to the novel **The Gift** by Richard Paul Evans.





Read: Christmas books range from the serious to the light hearted. Look at Lee Strobel's The Case for Christmas. You can sample inspirational writings from several authors in The Glory of Christmas. In Unafraid, Francine Rivers gives us a novella about Mary, the mother of Jesus. Max Lucado's Christmas Candle (large print) is about an angel who visits a candle maker's shop in a small English village. Or cuddle up under the afghan and read one of the books in Donna Van Liere's The Christmas Shoes series. And for a fascinating look at a piece of U.S. history, read In the Dark Streets Shineth by historian David McCullough. It is an inspiring story about Winston



Churchill's visit to this country on Christmas Eve, 1941.

Watch: Watch the movie The Nativity Story, and accompany the young Mary and Joseph on their trip to Bethlehem. Christmas DVDs also include Debbie Macomber's Call Me Mrs. Miracle, Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol, and Max Lucado's Christmas Child.

Kids too! The library has things they can read, watch, and listen to also. There are books for the very youngest—such as **The Story of Christmas, Baby Jesus is Born, and Who's Coming to Our House?** Other books for youngsters include Joyce Meyer's **The Perfect**

Christmas Pageant and Kate DiCamillo's Great Joy. In DVDs we have Veggie Tales Christmas Sing Along Songs and It's a Meaningful Life. Or try out The Berenstain Bears Christmas Tree story.

"A Perfect Night for Treats After All"

Picture this scenario, it is one day until Halloween, there are thousands of pieces of candy sitting in a pile in my office and the local news predicts a 70 percent chance of rain with high winds. For the past 30 days I have been begging for candy like I am going through sugar withdrawals, arranging volunteers who will prepare and serve hundreds of free hot dogs, and wrangling individuals and trunks to entertain kids and distribute copious amounts of candy. The weather forecast was not a welcome piece of information.

A couple of years ago, big storms were predicted for Thursday, October 31st and the city decided to move the community trick-or-treating day to the following Friday. Sure enough, Thursday came and it was a deluge. Friday turned out bright and clear. But this year, there was no sign the city would move trick-or-treating to

But this year, there was no sign the city would move trick-or-treating to any other day; Saturday was it. I had trunks scheduled to line the parking lot between the education building and the pavilion. Several of the trunk hosts have volunteered for many years and are very dedicated to this ministry, but there were a few new trunks, including one representing the Murphysboro High School Future Business Leaders of America club, that were new to the Trunk-Or-Treat experience. The



last thing I wanted to do was ask a group of people to stand out in the wind and rain handing soggy fistfuls of candy to dripping wet superheroes and princesses. But the time had come to make a final decision on the fate of this year's Halloween event. We reluctantly decided to eliminate the hot dogs this year and planned to use the pavilion as our rain relocation area; if all else failed, we would set up on the picnic tables and let the kids walk around to each table collecting the treats and candy. I knew I had at least one other person who would sit with me, rain or shine.



Saturday, October 31st, dawned cold, damp and windy. But although it was damp and overcast, the rain was holding off. With each hour that passed fairly rain-free, I began to get more optimistic. The tables under the pavilion were moved and ready to hold my Trunk-Or-Treat volunteers if a big rain hit, but plans were proceeding to use the parking lot after all. As 5:00 pm rolled around, ten car/van trunks sat open and decorated, awaiting the arrival of children dressed in a variety of disguises. For three hours and what turned out to be a perfect evening (zero raindrops, low winds and fairly comfortable temperatures), we handed out the thousands of pieces of candy, laughed, danced and brightened what could have been a dark night.

The MUMC Trunk-Or-Treat tradition started almost 10 years ago as a way to utilize our spacious parking lot to provide a safe trick-or-treat option for families. I thank all who have made this ministry a success.


