

The Library Corner: 28 Days of Prayer

Life challenges: sometimes they seem to come from nowhere; sometimes they build up gradually into a crisis we either did not anticipate, or hoped would never happen. Many times our emotions run high,

and solutions are elusive. What do we need? Clear thinking? Good counsel and expert help? The support of family and friends? Perhaps all of the above, and definitely one more essential thing: prayer.

Upper Room Books has developed **28 Days of Prayer**, a series of booklets which offers help in facing some of these hard challenges of life. Using prayer, Scripture, meditation and suggestions for deeper reflections or personal application, these books can be a helpful companion and an aid to prayer when even prayer seems elusive.

Start with worry itself—the chronic worry that never leaves us in peace. In the booklet **Freedom from Worry**, author Patricia Wilson notes we can be on a "worrying treadmill" and states that "God calls you to leave your worrying behind." There follows 28 days of specific steps toward easing the load of worry, and attaining peace of mind.

But here is an important thing about any of these books. Do NOT get it, read through it in a day, and decide it doesn't help. To learn to trust God more, or to change a mind or a way of being takes time and some work. Read it thoughtfully, day by day. Use the prayers and Bible verses as suggested. Write down in a notebook the answers to questions asked.

Perhaps you are not facing any of these issues, but have a friend or family member who is. Feel free to check a book out, read it yourself, and if it seems right, pass it along to someone who could use its help. Although please ask them return it when through!
