What is the Pilgrimage?

This is a brand new ministry which grew out of the request of members of the congregation to offer something for adults like the confirmation experience for our youth. Following in that vein, the Pilgrimage program will consist of five separate focus modules:

Module 1	What is Worship
Module 2	Who is Jesus
Module 3	What is the Bible
Module 4	What is the UMC
Module 5	What are Spiritual Disciplines

The first module, *What is Worship*, will be offered in April and May of this year, in five sessions. This module will explore various concepts of worship, such as the history of our worship style, the various elements of worship, and how worship services are planned.

Each module is a standalone unit and most will consist of 5 to 6 sessions on the given topic. Two of the modules, *Who is Jesus* and *What is the UMC*, will also contain a travel experience. The *Who is Jesus* module will include a trip to Eureka Springs, AR to see the Great Passion Play which is an outdoor dramatic performance about the last week of Jesus' life. The *What is the UMC* module will include a trip to Nashville, TN to visit the General Board offices of Discipleship, Higher Education, Communication, and the Upper Room Chapel and Museum.

Sign-up for the first module is currently underway. You can sign up by checking the attendance pad or calling the church office to register. If you have additional questions, you may contact me by email, call the church office or call or text me on my cell phone.

Again let me say each module is a separate experience. I think each of them will be its own unique and rewarding experience.

The Library Corner: What's New

Libraries, like plants, need to keep growing and changing in order to stay alive! The library team cultivates our "living" library by adding books here and there, moving some books along to another space such as our local public library or Little Free Library, and culling through book donations to choose books that fit the needs of the library.

Here are a few recent book additions in the **Christian Life** section:

The Power of a Whisper: Hearing God. Having the Guts to Respond, by Bill Hybels, senior pastor at the Willow Creek Community Church. Hybels says: *"When the circumstances of your life start to shift... at least consider that it might be due to God. When you find yourself in a state of confusion or curiosity about the way things are going go ahead and ask him if there's something he'd like to say to you. Open your hands, open your heart..."* (p. 56)

A Love Worth Giving: Living in the Overflow of God's Love, by well-known author and minister Max Lucado. Using Bible stories plus contemporary stories, Lucado discusses "the forgotten first step in relationships"—turning towards God first. And, says Lucado, *"his love—if you will let it—can fill you and leave you with a love worth giving."* (p.10)

Additions to the **Fiction** section:

The Art of Arranging Flowers, by Lynne Branard. This is a long distance donation from former church member Pat Smart. Yes, it is fiction, not a "how-to" book! It centers on florist Ruby Jewell. You'll have to check it out to see what happens!

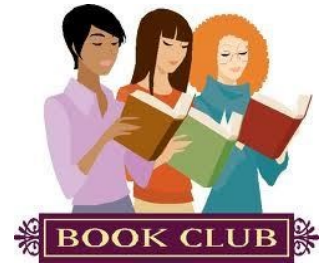
Threading the Needle, by Marie Bostwick, the fourth book in the popular Cobbled Court series. Friendships forged at the Cobbled Court Quilt Shop show the power of sisterhood in helping one another through the challenges of life.

New in the **Children's** section:

Good read-aloud books for little ones wondering where they came from, or expecting a sibling—**God Gave Us You**, and **God Gave Us Two** by Lisa Bergen and Laura Bryant.

Veggie Tales provides "I Can Read" books that are fun for the young reader, and with a little moral to the story as well. Try **Dial 'M' for Mess Up** or **Larry Makes a Choice** or several other amusing books in the series.

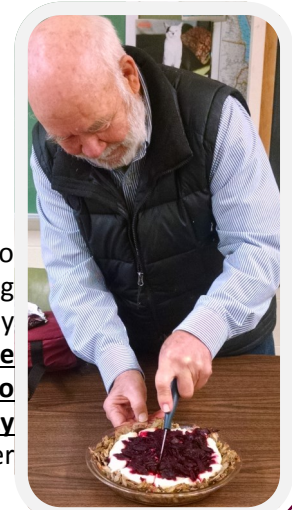

One of the most unique things about our group is that not all members belong to MUMC. The mom's group is open to everyone and many members attend neighboring churches. We found this group in different ways but we come together with shared values and a desire to grow in our faith.

I would like to thank MUMC for welcoming all of us. I am so grateful to have found these ladies to connect with. They have become so much more than a "mom's group" to me. These are my best friends. We share so much with one another, laugh together, cry together, pray together, guide one another through life's trials and have completely intertwined our lives. 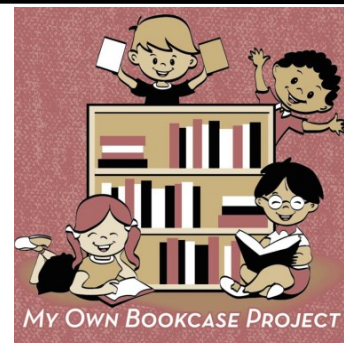
My Own Bookcase Project is co-sponsored by our church and the Murphysboro Kiwanis, but we have support from many different people, organizations and churches in our community.

So, what does the My Own Bookcase Project actually do? Last year we made 30 handmade oak bookcases (each bookcase has a personalized nameplate), a stuffed animal and a starter set of books. The children receive their books and bookcases at a very special Presentation Ceremony. Last year, Mayor Will Stephens called each child’s name and they came up front and were presented their bag of books. The look on the faces of those children as they received their very own books was PRICELESS!!!

This year we will be providing 34 children with a bookcase and starter set of books. We are excited to be able to provide books to children who might not otherwise have the opportunity to have books in their homes.

What is THE PILGRIMAGE?

THE PILGRIMAGE, in its entirety, is comprised of five modules and two trips; one trip to the Passion Play in Eureka Springs, Arkansas, and one trip to the United Methodist boards and agencies in Nashville, Tennessee. This is basically an 'adult version' of the confirmation classes offered to junior high and high school youth. All five modules and both trips will be offered over the next two years. Participants can attend all modules, or only some modules, in any order. Pastor Larry and Angie Baughman are leaders of Module 1, which begins April 17, 2016.

WHAT ARE THE FIVE MODULES?

Module 1: What is Worship?

Module 2: Who is Jesus?

Module 3: What is the Bible?

Module 4: What is the UMC?

Module 5: What are Spiritual Disciplines?

WHAT IS INVOLVED WITH THE TWO TRIPS?

One trip is to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, to view the Passion Play. Participants must attend the module *Who is Jesus?* in order to participate in this trip, as part of the module will be conducted during the trip. The other trip is to Nashville, Tennessee, to visit the General Board of Discipleship, General Board of Communications, and General Board of Higher Education. Participants must attend the module on *What is the United Methodist Church?* in order to participate in this trip.

WHERE DID THE PILGRIMAGE COME FROM?

THE PILGRIMAGE is being written and developed by Pastor Larry and Angie Baughman, in response to adult requests to be able to learn the information that junior high and high schoolers learn during their confirmation process. This will be rich learning for adults, and will also strengthen the church as a whole to become better mentors for young people as they learn these important truths about the church and our faith as a whole.

WHAT IS THE SCHEDULE FOR THE PILGRIMAGE?

Module 1, titled *What is Worship?*, will be held on five Sundays this spring, April 17, 24, May 1, (skip May 8), May 15, and May 22. Module 2 will be titled *Who is Jesus?*, and will be held on three consecutive Thursdays, August 25, Sept 1, and Sept 8, and will conclude during the trip to the Passion Play, which will be September 19-22, 2016. Other modules will be scheduled in 2017.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?

A few weeks before each module begins, there will be information announced and you can sign up on the attendance pad during either of the worship services.

United Methodist Men's Rally

A United Methodist Men's Rally on March 6th fell short in expected attendance but those who did attend were presented with thoughtful ideas on how and why to have a "mission vision." Jeff Thornton, President of the Illinois Great Rivers Conference United Methodist Men, provided ideas of how men should proceed. His main points for the evening were:

- Be involved in bible studies where observing, interpreting, and applying are important.
- Be "selfish" and build yourself by daily prayer, bible study, involvement in a small group, and becoming a mentor. Older can mentor a younger person but the reverse is also true. Mentoring builds relationships and involvement.
- Build relationships out in the community. 75-80% of any community is un-churched. A community the size of Murphysboro has up to 6,400 of its population of 8,000 not involved in *weekly* church activities. This is despite the fact there are 26 churches in Murphysboro. Jeff recommends reaching out for the "non-traditional Methodist." Go to them and make them feel comfortable. An example was given of setting up a bible study outside of the church where people congregate.
- Important for men of church to have a planning session that includes a survey of local "Missions Ideas for Men." For 2016, Bishop Keaton is encouraging planning for mission groups... to have a "Visionary Session" by surveying and planning for where missions want to grow. Awareness can change behavior. There are many resources available to the UMM through their charter dues of \$85 per year so the UMM are encouraged to tap into this resource.

Jeff ended the evening by inviting the UMM to form a golf team and enter into the Bishop Golf Tourney on April 22nd. This is a good idea for those MUMC golfers. Jeff will also be sending information out to us regarding a June 18th Cardinal outing at Busch. Cards will play Texas Rangers. Cost of ticket and how to sign up will be forthcoming to us. (Attending baseball games was an idea gaining support by a recent survey of Murphysboro UMM)

The group of men, which included six men from the Du Quoin Methodist Church, were treated with delicious snack items and drinks provided by Hospitality hostesses Theresa Mills and Sharon Graff. Brian Vincent provided entertainment with his guitar and singing.
