Summer is just around the corner and introduces what has become the busiest season in the life our church. Everyone thinks it is Christmas and Easter, and while those are busy they do not top summer.

And so as we prepare for this busy season, there are a couple of important worship items I want to mention.

- We have two really great sermon series coming up this summer. The first will begin in late May and is entitled: How Sweet the Song. For six weeks we will be focusing on the great theology taught through popular hymns and praise choruses. We will kick the series off on May 22 with a celebration of two great religious songwriters and artists: Fanny Crosby and Chris Tomlin. The Library Corner: Celebrating Women

Featuring Candace Watt's review of The Red Tent

It's the month of May, and a good time to celebrate the many roles that women play in families, churches, communities, work places and—well, you get the idea—everywhere! This month we are featuring books of interest to women, starting with a reader review by Candace Watt of the novel **The Red Tent**, by Anita Diamant.



"The Red Tent is one of my favorite books! A friend urged me to read it and I am so glad I did. The author, Anita Diamant, takes a very small reference from Genesis in the Bible and builds it into an epic story. She takes us into the world of one young child (Dinah) through her entire life.

The red tent is where the women in this Biblically related story went for a period of days during their menstrual cycle. Here they gave birth, grew old, and passed on knowledge to each other. It is a gripping story of community, family, tradition, and perseverance. Diamant's prose is descriptive and enticing and her story is thought provoking.

This novel tells a wonderful story—it gave me a sense of the time and the life of women in that time. Every woman should read this book. It is beautiful. The sisterhood and intense bonds of the women in the red tent is inspiring."

The library has other imaginative Bible related novels including a series of three books by Jill Eileen Smith featuring three of the wives of King David, Michal, Abigail, and Bathsheba.

Women who are in the midst of child-rearing may like one of a number of books in the library about parenting, including Momology: A Mom's Guide to Shaping Great Kids, by Shelley Radic of MOPS, (Mothers of Preschoolers). We also have books featuring true stories of women's lives and experiences. One of the most dramatic is in audiobook format, Unlikely Angel, by Ashley Smith. She tells the true story of being taken hostage in her Atlanta apartment,


and how her faith helped her bring this ordeal to a peaceful end.

Finally, enjoy some humor along with faith—even when life deals some serious blows. Try Barbara Johnson's Stick a Geranium in Your Hat and Be Happy or Chonda Pierce's Roadkill on the Highway to Heaven.

So take a pause and see what the library has that speaks to you where you are right now. It could be a devotional, a book for moms, a book about women's Christian walk, a novel with interesting female characters, or maybe just something humorous to make you laugh!

Eilis Lacev has come of age in small-town Ireland in the hard years following World War Two. When an Irish priest from Brooklyn offers to sponsor Eilis in America -- to live and work in a Brooklyn neighborhood "just like Ireland" -- she decides she must go, leaving her fragile mother and her charismatic sister behind.



Eilis finds work in a department store on Fulton Street, and when she least expects it, finds love. Tony, who loves the Dodgers and his big Italian family, slowly wins her over with patient charm. But just as Eilis begins to fall in love with Tony, devastating news from Ireland threatens the promise of her future.
