The General Conference of the United Methodist church has ended and our church is still together, which I must admit is somewhat of a surprise to me. The conference delegates asked the Council of Bishops to provide leadership to our fractured church and they brought back a proposal for serious study and dialogue, and this seemed to appease the majority in a very tight vote. For over 40 years (my entire ministry), our church has debated issues of human sexuality and most specifically in later years the issues of our lesbian and gay brothers and sisters and how the church should relate to them.

The action of the conference in no way unites our church; we are still deeply divided on these issues. Over the years I have developed a great appreciation for both this debate and many of those who debate it with grace and love. What I observe are people on both sides of this debate who are deeply committed followers of Jesus Christ, who love the church and the Gospel, but who understand how to live it out in the world in very different ways.

My prayer for our church is that somehow we can find the path to allow individuals to live out the Gospel of Jesus and act upon the convictions that message inspires in them. We will never convince everyone of one opinion and we should not by legislative degree force one side into the mold of the other. There is not a day that goes by that I do not pray to God for wisdom for our Church and myself as we struggle with these and other important issues.

I do not know what the future will bring, but I know God is still God. Jesus tells us in Matthew not to worry about tomorrow and I for one will attempt as best I can to follow this advice, but I do not believe that means we should not pray for it. Therefore I invite you join me in continuing to pray for our church and its faithful response to the call of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.




# The Library Corner: Glory Days

Glory Days sounds like something we all want! According to Max Lucado, in his new book Glory Days: **Living Your Promised Land Life Now**, our best days really are ahead of us in our Christian life. To illustrate his point, Lucado uses the story of Joshua and the Israelites crossing the Jordan and entering the Promised Land after 40 years of wilderness wandering. He also adds quotes from the New Testament to explain that, like the Israelites who inherited Canaan from God, Christians too have an inheritance—if they will claim it. As he explains, the Christian's inheritance is not a physical one, like the land in Canaan, but is instead a spiritual one. And what an inheritance it is! Lucado says our "Canaan" is a life "defined by grace, refined by challenge, and aligned with a heavenly call. In God's plan. .. we win more often than we lose, forgive as quickly as we are offended, and give as abundantly as we receive" (p. 6). If this is true, why don't more Christians feel and claim the "Glory Days"? Lucado says that first, we don't know about our inheritance and second we don't really believe it (pp. 21-22). Among the many quotes he gives from the New Testament, he quotes from Paul's letter to the Romans, 8:16-17: "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God and if children then heirs—heirs of God, and joint heirs with Christ." Sound intriguing? Check it out! **Glory Days** will be on the library table in the upstairs hall in early June.

# Other Books of Interest:

The church library also has the latest book from Lisa (Renshaw) Cherry: **Like a Flood: Live Boldly, Love Truthfully, Stand Fiercely in a Post Christian America.** In her book,

Cherry examines the secular cultural life of America, and compares it to a



tidal wave, a flood sweeping away the Christian foundations of the country. She also says there is another tidal wave, one born of the Holy Spirit, and that one is full of hope and power. She asks readers which wave they will catch, and she adds a whole section called "Prepare" which gives many resources for readers to consider. Cherry is also planning a conference at John A. Logan College on June 18th.

And especially for men, the library has two books by Derek Maul which speak directly to men about leading an authentic and meaningful Christian life. They are **Get Real: a Spiritual Journey for Men** and **10 Life-Charged Words: Real Faith for Men.** In **Get Real**, Maul describes the life of a Christian man:

It is about Jesus.

About being his disciple.

About falling in love with God.

And about having the courage to let that kind of devotion actually change your life. (p. 15) You will see these and other books during the month of June on the library table upstairs, or on display downstairs in the library.




