



What has happened since we voted to merge with DeSoto UMC?

- A team of six (L. Gilbert, N. Vallino, J. O'Donnell, K. Miller, C. Nolan, A. Baughman) traveled to Minnesota in April for a Church-Start Boot Camp as required by the grant funding.
- Following the conference, first year benchmarks (now through May 2017) were established and approved by the Conference Office and grant money was released.
- The MUMC staff, with dedicated hours from the grant, meet weekly; the Core Team, made up of staff, and volunteers meets monthly. Both groups work together to make decisions and further efforts.

WHAT ARE WE WORKING ON RIGHT NOW?

Building:

- We are working with a Caretaker who will move into the parsonage mid-August.
- The pews have been removed and we are looking for someone to purchase them. If interested, contact Chris Nolan.
- The church and parsonage are receiving deep cleaning and we are making decisions about church contents.

Youth & Children:

• We are discussing logistics on offering weekly programming for families. This would include dinner and break-out teaching for all ages.

Worship:

- Discussion continues on how best to handle music and worship-leading as well as best solutions for a pastoral presence for the DeSoto congregation.
- We are considering an 11:15 am worship time. The service will have a similar format to our Praise Service at MUMC. The sermon would



most often be live-streamed from the Murphysboro site.

Question of Name:

 We are considering developing an umbrella/ family name. For media sources like Facebook and our website, people would be led to a family name (something like www.thetrail.org). Under that heading, there would be information on DeSoto site and Murphysboro site.

So when you have an opportunity, how about a rest in the shade (or maybe indoors with the air conditioner) a cooling drink, and a good book? There are lots of fiction options in the Church library. Family Movies

Movies for Adults

The **Methodists on a Mission Relay For Life** team has just completed another successful year of raising money for the American Cancer Society. By raising over \$5,000 this year, we were awarded Gold Team status and placed Second overall in team rankings. Our team was one of the smallest we have had in recent years, yet despite only two fundraisers, with the hard work and dedication of our members we were able to surpass our goal. Our gift card sales in the fall netted us \$420, the chicken dinner in the spring netted \$1484, and our team members individually raised and donated \$4749 for a grand total of \$6653. Team members this year were Emma Bigham, Nancy Fager, Sharon Graff, Sharon Jones, Kathy Ripley, Lela Sternberg, Jennifer Watson, and Team Captain Wilma Westerfield. In fact our team captain, Wilma, was the top money earner for the entire Murphysboro event.

All of our team members have been impacted by cancer in their lives. Our team is comprised of cancer survivors, caregivers, family members and friends of cancer patients. The Murphysboro Methodist Church relay team was started about 20 years ago by Kathy Manfredi and our MUMC youth group, over at the Carbondale event. The Carbondale Relay was the only one in Jackson County at the time. At the urging of Earl Renshaw, some of the adult members of the congregation joined with the youth group. Kathy then passed the team captain position over to Lori Chapman, Paul and Debbie Chapman's daughter-in-law who recently lost her battle with cancer. Lori was still a student at S.I.U. at the time and served as captain for several years. Then Nancy Fager and Sharon Jones took over as co-captains for several years. It was during this time that Murphysboro established its own Relay For Life event. The past four years, Wilma Westerfield has led our team at the Murphysboro event.

Almost every Sunday, someone battling cancer is lifted up in prayer during our Joys and Concerns. We have lost so many dear members of our church family to this horrible disease. As we walk the relay track on the night of the event and read the names on the luminaria bags of so many dear friends, it is very sobering, but it also gives us hope. The luminaria bags are given in memory of those who have passed away, but are also honoring cancer survivors who have won the battle. Great strides are being made every year in cancer research and treatment. We have all had people ask us why we relay. It is really very simple – we walk to finish the fight.

We sincerely hope that many members of our congregation will feel the call to service for this great cause and join our team. It's a little bit of work and WHOLE LOT OF FUN!!!!!
