

Camp Restore is the only remaining organization in New Orleans still working on restoration. They have had over 45,000 volunteers in the 11 years since Katrina. There remains a lot in New Orleans still needing restoration. Last year seven from MUMC stepped up to repair a collapsing dining room ceiling for a mother and her three daughters. Our missionaries also removed foliage and debris to permit entrance to the family's beloved green house. A second project completed involved concrete removal and replacement in front of a small grocery store.



The following review is from Nancy Vallino, who presented this DVD study to the Faithful Friends class. Take a look at these fascinating and awe inspiring videos. You will find this study upstairs on the library table in August. Look for it!



THE ESSENTIAL COLLECTION Dr. Louie Giglio, Presenter

The Essential Collection of four talks by Passion City Church (Atlanta, GA) visionary and founder, Dr. Louie Giglio, paints a

picture of man in contrast to the vast cosmos. Spectacular images from the Hubble telescope and correlating data scale us down to invisible specks in a galaxy among billions of galaxies. Yet, each of us is a miracle of creation. We are known and prized by majesty.

Dr. Giglio's talks are enhanced through music by contemporary Christian artist, Chris Tomlin. Just a glimpse into the individual DVDs:

- Psalm 19:1 reads: The heavens declare the glory of God: the skies proclaim the work of his hands. The Indescribable DVD will take you on an image-rich journey through the cosmos, allowing you to discover the enormity of God's creation.
- The How Great is Our God DVD mixes scriptures with the sciences of astronomy and anatomy to beautifully illustrate that the God who created ginormous stars in the universe also wondrously created us.
- In the Symphony DVD Dr. Giglio guotes scriptures and "mashes up" audio from the heavens and earth to illustrate that we are a part of an entire universe created to bring praise to God.
- The final DVD, I Lift My Hands, speaks to God's love for us. Stars in the heavens, whales in the sea, and a legion of angels may at this very moment be singing His praises. God doesn't NEED us to worship Him. What is stunning is that our voices matter to Him.

The power and might of our Creator are more than our minds can grasp. Yet, the creator of the universe loves us

so much that He chose to come to our little dot in the Milky Way Galaxy. After watching these DVDs, you should feel incredibly small, but loved beyond comprehension. A starry night will forever hold special meaning for you. DO NOT miss this DVD collection, and share it with family and friends!!

On any given day in London, all Charles Lenox, Victorian gentleman and armchair explorer, wants to do is relax in his private study with a cup of tea, a roaring fire and a good book. But when his lifelong friend Lady Jane asks for his help, Lenox cannot resist another chance to



unravel a mystery, even if it means trudging through the snow to her townhouse next door.

One of Jane's former servants, Prudence Smith, is dead -- an apparent suicide. But Lenox suspects something far more sinister: murder, by a rare and deadly poison. The house where the girl worked is full of suspects, and though Prudence dabbled with the hearts of more than a few men, Lenox is baffled by an elusive lack of motive in the girl's death. When another body turns up during the London season's most fashionable ball, Lenox must untangle a web of loyalties and animosities. Was it jealousy that killed Prudence?
