

Library Corner

Have you browsed the holdings of our church library recently? Have you checked anything out? While the library contains excellent resources for Sunday School and Bible Study, it also has a sizeable collection of fiction, biography, and more! I enjoy wandering around libraries and bookstores, often just happening upon a book I think looks and sounds interesting. A number of the books I have checked out of our church library, I found in just that way.

I had heard about Malala Yousafzai in news reports, but never really took the time to learn her story until I saw I Am Malala: The Story of the Girl Who Stood Up for Education and Was Shot by The Taliban on our library's shelf. The book, written by Malala, with Christina Lamb, details Malala's early life, her father's schools and activism, and her own activism for education for females in her home valley – before and after the assassination attempt on her life when she was only 15 years old.

I was intrigued when I saw What Your Childhood Memories Say About You...and What You Can Do About It. Dr. Kevin Leman describes techniques you can use to discover what has made you into the person you are. He illustrates with personal stories, stories from celebrities, and case studies from his private practice. The book reads like a novel...not like a psychology textbook.

The Color of Water: A Black Man's Tribute to His White Mother, by James McBride, is another I just saw on the shelf and decided to read. Differences in race, religion, family, world view...and the resulting difficulties...it's all in here. The book is worth reading for McBride's writing alone. The prose often is pure poetry.

I'm excited about four recent acquisitions. Dave Auxier has donated four of Jonathan Auxier's award-winning books for young readers. While the books are recommended for kids in the 9- to 14-year-old range, I found them quite delightful. I even stayed up until 2am finishing one of them!

Peter Nimble and His Fantastic Eyes is the adventure of a small, blind orphan, who has the reputation of being the greatest thief who ever lived. During his travels, Peter ac-

quires an interesting travelling companion and learns about trust, loyalty, and true friendship.

Sophie Quire and The Last Storyguard is the story of an avid reader and book lover who also is a gifted book repairer. When Sophie repairs a magic book, she is drawn into an adventure she never imagined. Peter Nimble and his quirky friend assist Sophie in her task, but this is Sophie's story.

The Night Gardener is the story of two abandoned Irish siblings as they become servants of a family who live in a creepy old English mansion. Strange things abound in this not too scary ghost story.

Sweep: The Story of a Girl and Her Monster follows 11-yearold Nan Sparrow, an expert climber who attempts to escape her life of indentured service to a brutish chimney sweep, with the assistance of an unusual "monster." Set in Victorian London, this book is quite informative about the exploitation of orphans by chimney sweeps and about the folklore of the Jewish golem.



As we enter the July 4th week and all the fun outside activities lets look at some tips to protect yourself and your family from some of the damaging effects of that beautiful sun. Research proves that ultrviolet (UV) rays from the sun or tanning beds do cause skin cancer. Its also a scientific fact that damage from

UV rays builds up over time so sun protection should start at a very early age.

Tips to enjoy outside activities in the sun.

- Apply a thick layer of broad spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher at least 15 minutes **before** going outside even on cloudy days. Be sure to apply it to all exposed areas including ears, lips and part lines in hair.
- Reapply sunscreen at least every 2 hours and after swimming, sweating or toweling off even if the sunscreen says water resistant. There is no known "water proof" sunscreen at this time.
- Seek shade during midday hours and wear sunscreen in the shade. Be extra careful around surfaces that reflect the sunrays like water, snow, sand and concrete.
- Wear sun protective gear such as wide brim hats and sunglasses to protect the face and eyes and reduce the risk of
 cataracts. UV blocking clothing is available in most clothing and department stores. This special clothing is especially
 important for young children who love to spend the whole day playing in the water and sand.

Outside summer activities are fun and enjoyable at every age. God gave us this beautiful world and we can rejoice in it.

He also has now given us research on how to protect our bodies. Happy summer!!

WHAT ARE THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES UP TO?



<u>Faithful Friends</u>, is a class for women of all ages with rotating leaders. Because of summer travels, the class will be taking a vacation during the months of July and August and will resume in September.

<u>Helping Hands</u>, led by Donna Horniacek, is a traditional Bible Study Class for men and women. The Summer 2019 theme is **A Covenant in Christ Jesus** focusing on how Jesus fulfilled the Law in the sense that it was given full meaning. The first unit – **A Fulfilled Covenant** – reveals a new sign of the covenant for Jewish and Gentile believers, as recorded in Matthew, Mark, Luke, Hebrews, and Colossians. The second unit – **A Heartfelt Cove**-

nant -- gives new meaning and purpose to the Law. The third unit – **Covenant: A Personal Perspective** – focuses on personal relationships between people in 1 Samuel, Ruth, and Ephesians.

<u>Passages</u>, led by Randy Auxier, meets in Room 110 (the Church library). In this class participants delve into in-depth studies of theological themes in Christianity. The class will be on hiatus from April 14 thru July 7 while Randy is in Poland.

<u>Pathfinders</u>, led by Michelle Parker-Clark, will be continuing with the story of USA Olympian and army officer Louis "Louie" Zamperini who survived in a raft for 47 days after his bomber crash-landed in the ocean during the Second World War, then was sent to a series of prisoner of war camps. Based on Laura Hillenbrand's bestselling book, *Unbroken: Path to Redemption* begins where *Unbroken* ends, sharing the next amazing chapter of World War II hero Louis Zamperini's powerful story of forgiveness, redemption, and amazing grace.

<u>Seekers</u>, led by Susan Patterson, will begin continuing the DVD study -- *The Call: The Life, Ministry, and Message of the Apostle Paul*. Through author, Adam Hamilton, follow the journeys of Paul, beginning with his dramatic conversion, as he spread the Gospel through modern-day Greece and Turkey. Travel to the early church sites and explore Paul's conversations with the Romans, Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Thessalonians. In this six chapter study, you are invited to experience faith through Christ's greatest teacher and missionary.

<u>Trailblazers</u>, a class for young adults, focuses on studies about fitting Christ into the big picture.





