


So are you still wondering what exactly you are saying "Yes!" to when you volunteer for BLAST? Here are just a few things you're saying yes to:

The Library Corner: New and Various

It's a new year, so the church library should have some new books, right? And it does! Some are donated, some are new, but there are definitely a variety of items— and we hope something among them will suit your needs and tastes. Here is a sample:

Bible Studies for those who want to dig deeper into Scripture:

The Trailblazer's class recently studied the book of Revelation, and has donated the book, leader's guide, and DVD to the library. Is Revelation a "closed book" to you? Bruce Metzger, the author of "Breaking the Code: Understanding the Book of Revelation", says that readers of this study will "be surprised to find out how much of the book makes sense." If Revelations has always interested you, try out this book and DVD.

"All Things New: A Study on 2 Corinthians" by Kelly Minter. Minter says that 2 Corinthians, which is the source of many beloved Scripture passages, may be the apostle Paul's most personal letter. This study for women goes through 2 Corinthians chapter by chapter. And for good measure Minter throws in several recipes!

The library has other Bible Studies, including some that have accompanying DVDS—so come in and browse for other possibilities.

Christian Living / Inspirational:

Keri Wyatt Kent wants the readers of her book "Deeply Loved: 40 Ways in 40 Days to Experience the Heart of Jesus" to understand that each one of us is indeed deeply loved by God—whether we feel it or not. Kent offers specific ways to draw closer to Jesus, and to realize that "God loves each of us like an only child." (quote from St. Augustine, p. 2)

Fiction:

"Long Way Gone" by Charles Martin. The description on the book jacket says: "A radical retelling of the prodigal son story, Long Way Gone takes us from tent revivals to the Ryman auditorium to the tender relationship between a broken man and the father who never stopped calling him home."

Popular Christian author Colleen Coble brings us *The Lightkeeper's Daughter* – both a romance and a mystery - suspense story that will keep you guessing.

Bible Stories for Children:

Do you want the children in your life to be more familiar with Bible stories? The library contains a variety of books at different reading levels that can help with that, from Children and Youth Bibles to small books that

contain just one story. One of our recently donated books for young children is *Jesus Heals the Centurion's Servant*. This is one of the Arch Book Bible Story Series. The stories are illustrated on every page, and are told in verse. Other books in this series are *Jesus Blesses the Children, The Parable of the Lost Sheep,* and *Jesus and the Family Trip.*

P.S. During the month of February books will be on display on the topic of love, and also books related to the African-American experience. Look for them!



Then the time comes when she yearns to be touched and loved. When two young men from town become intrigued by her wild beauty, Kya opens herself to a new life-until the unthinkable happens.

Perfect for fans of Barbara Kingsolver and Karen Russell, Where the Crawdads Sing is at once an exquisite ode to the natural world, a heartbreaking coming-ofage story, and a surprising tale of possible murder. Owens reminds us that we are forever shaped by the children we once were, and that we are all subject to the beautiful and violent secrets that nature keeps.

WHAT ARE THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES UP TO?

<u>Faithful Friends</u> and <u>Pathfinders</u> have merged into one class and are now the <u>Faithful Pathfinders</u>. We invite you to join us as we continue <u>Revival</u> – Adam Hamilton's six-week journey as he travels to England, following the life of John Wesley and exploring his defining characteristics of a Wesleyan Christian. Wesley's story is our story. It defines our faith and it challenges us to rediscover our spiritual passion.

<u>Helping Hands</u>, led by Donna Horniacek, is a traditional Bible Study Class for men and women. For Winter 2019-2020 the lessons support the theme of "Promise." The five lessons in the first unit (Hope) center on one of the things promise gives us: hope. Hope -- the expectation that, regardless of what is happening in the present, God has a future for us. The four lessons in the second unit (Covenants: The Basis for Committed Relationships) focus on covenants and the promises they include. In the third unit (Holiness Expressed) the four lessons call us to live into the promise God gives us to be holy people.

Passages, led by Randy Auxier, will be continuing with the book/study *Stop Asking for Stones and Serpents: How the Way We Pray Can Block God's Blessings*, by Janice Staab, PhD. Dr. Staab shines a light on some ways of praying that block God's blessings and love from being fully active in our lives. She examines in detail how the things we pray for (stones) and the methods we pray with (serpents) can distract us from God's will for our lives and keep us from receiving all God wants to share. Jan is a write, teacher, philosophical counselor, and life coach. After 15+ years as an academic philosopher and an elder in her church, she's committed to having the conversations that matter with ourselves, others, and God.

<u>Seekers</u>, led by Susan Patterson, is continuing their study of *The Jesus Challenge: 21 Days of Loving God and Neighbor*. "Following Jesus is hard. If anyone tells you that it isn't, then they are misinformed or just plain lying." Author Justin LaRosa learned this truth through a journey to Christ filled with more than the average person's (and certainly more than the average pastor's) roadblocks and potholes. He discovered spiritual practices that helped him navigate the way, changing his life and his understanding of love. Through this study he guides readers as they follow Jesus and live out His commandment to love. Join Justin, and the Seekers, as they take the Jesus challenge, and be transformed.

Trailblazers, a class for young adults, has some exciting changes coming in the near future. Stay tuned for more information!







