Greetings to all in Christ Jesus!





Watching kiddos who have struggles in their lives and with their faith find a new way to worship, share and grow together as Christians. Helping them to build self-confidence as they recognize and assist others who are struggling or in great need is priceless to her. She has built strong relationships with them by ensuring they know she is someone they can always count

These experiences and the love she has for all MUMC Youth is what keeps Diane involved. She concedes it feeds her soul and helps her grow in faith but she is really in it for them!

We are so very thankful for you, Diane. Your commitment and passion to foster a nurturing and educational venue for the spiritual growth of our youth has enriched the lives of so many over the years.
