The Library Corner: Lives of Women

Church Library
Greetings, readers! As I write this, we do not yet know when we will be back to our communal church

life-- but hoping it will be in May! (Now we know) Whenever the church opens the library will be open too, with items of interest for May and beyond. Our feature this month is on women who have made contributions to the life of faith or to the larger society, including some who have risked their lives in doing so. Here are a few of the books that will be on display:

Hearts of Fire: Eight Women in the Underground Church and Their Stories of Costly Faith by the Voice of the Martyrs. These stories of women who became leaders in underground churches in countries such as China, Pakistan, and Romania reveal remarkable courage, faith, and dedication.

Irena's Children: The Extraordinary Story of a Woman Who Saved 2,500 Children from the Warsaw Ghetto, by Tilar Mazzeo. As a young social worker, Irena Sendler was allowed into the Warsaw ghetto. When Irena came to understand what was happening there, she began to ask families if they would entrust their young children to her. With the help of a network of others, she managed to smuggle children out in a variety of daring ways and place them in homes on the outside.

The Zookeeper's Wife: A War Story by Diane Ackerman. Before the Nazi invasion of Poland, Jan and Antonina Zabinski, Christian zookeepers in the Warsaw Zoo, lived an almost idyllic life on the zoo grounds taking care of a large array of animals. The dream turned nightmarish at the invasion, and with the horror of Nazi racism. Their response: Jan helped smuggle Jews out of the ghetto, and Antonia helped devise a system of hiding them on the zoo grounds, or in the house itself—all at a time when even to give a Jew a cup of water was to risk death.

Here If You Need Me: A True Story by Kate Braestrup. This is Braestrup's memoir of enduring the sudden and tragic death of her husband, Drew, leaving her with four children and deep grief. What next? What was next for Kate turned out to be attending seminary and becoming a chaplain for the Game Warden Service of Maine. As chaplain she deals with many harrowing situations—children lost in the woods, suicide, drink and drug caused deaths, and accidents. Braestrup's book alternates between telling about her life, and sharing stories of her service as chaplain.

There are many other types of books, many of them written by women for women—thoughts on motherhood, stories of faith, stories of hard times, and good times too. For thoughts about

the good times, try Luci Swindoll's **Simple Secrets to a Happy Life: 50 Ways to Make the Most of Every Day.** This would be a great time to read that book!

P.S. Have you been deep cleaning the house during this time at home? Perhaps not! But if you have found some overdue books from the Church Library, please bring them in and leave in the return basket upstairs or in the library. We don't charge fines, and would be happy to welcome the wayward books back home!




Summer Camp & Mission Trip Updates




Join the Saturday Book Club In the church library


Our current book is listed below. Meanwhile keep reading, and come to the next meeting with ideas for the next good book for the group to read!


As Pastor Danny has remained us as we walk *This Journey* together, **Best of All--God is with us!**






The Day of Pentecost
