Greetings to all in Christ Jesus!

After much prayer, work, discussion, testing, purchasing, setting up, tearing down, meeting, and deliberation I am very excited to tell you all our Church Council has voted unanimously to begin indoor worship as soon as possible! The decision has not been made lightly, and we will be monitoring all best recommendations and advice (both from the denomination and the state). We will be offering an indoor service at 9AM for seniors and folks with underlying heath conditions, and at 10:30AM which with include nursery care and be open to all! We will continue to stream our Sunday service at 10:30AM on Facebook Live and post it to Youtube shortly thereafter.

We do believe this is the best move for our congregation at this time. This move indoors will allow us to worship in the air conditioning during the hottest weeks of the summer, benefit from lyrics and readings on the screen while we are not able to pass common objects (like bulletins), hear our beautiful organ, hear from both our praise team and soon our choir (on screen) and of course gather in our beautiful sanctuary! If you plan to worship indoors with us, please send in the RSVP card you got in the mail as soon as you can. If you did not get a card please call or email the office at any time to sign up for 9AM or 10:30AM service!

Welcome Back! Here are the key things you need to know about worship indoors:

- Be sure to bring and wear a face mask!
- You will have your temperature taken with our brand-new touchless thermometers upon entry.
- Please use our brand-new touchless hand sanitizers upon entry and exit of the sanctuary.
- Please happily sit wherever our host team escorts you!
- Please touch nothing but the pew you're sitting in.
- We will have nursery at 10:30AM!
- The building will be completely closed from 10AM Friday through Saturday to ensure cleanliness for Sunday morning.
- The basement and education wing will be off limits on Sunday morning.
- The upstairs bathrooms will be open for emergency use only (follow the printed instructions)!
- The Church Council has parameters in place in the event we should feel compelled to cancel Sunday's service. We will mass email and call the whole congregation should that occur.

I want to thank our task force again for the work that they did to prepare for indoor worship, our Church Council for the many extra meetings they have put in, our amazing staff for their hard work and support throughout, and our parking lot host team that's come early and stayed late to help while we've been outdoors! Praise the Lord!

Indoor Worship will begin as soon as possible

When we begin we will have 2 services, as well as continue our on-line service each Sunday at 10:30AM.

 1st Service at 9:00AM will be for Senior Citizens and those with chronic health issues (sanctuary will be the most sanitized for this service)



- 2nd Service at 10:30AM will be for anyone else
 - * Basic Guidelines:
 - * 9:00AM service will be 45 minutes. This allows 45 minutes, between services, for congregational exiting, fully sanitizing and entrance of 10:30 worshipers. Second service will also only last 45 minutes.
 - * Congregants will need to RSVP for the service they would like to attend. If you do not make a reservation you will be treated on a first come, first serve basis. Reservation cards were mailed out, if you did not receive one or want to make a reservation for a future service, please call or email the Church office before noon on Thursdays. (If an individual shows up without an RSVP, they will only be turned away if we exceed our capacity.)
 - * The sanctuary will be cordoned off by every other row in each section, adjoining sections will be staggered to maintain the 6' social distancing guidelines. Pew cushions will be removed, as well as hymnals, prayer & guest cards, and tithing plates.
 - * ONLY gentle singing, 6 foot distant, with masks on will be allowed in worship


Instructions for congregants who will be attending indoor worship at MUMC

- Temperatures will be taken at the door via non-contact thermometer. Anyone registering greater than 100.4 will be asked to not enter the building but go home.
- wear a mask at all times when you are in a room with other people & maintain social distancing requirements of 6 feet between family units (and those in regular contact).
- We need to refrain from sitting with people outside of our daily contact group to protect them as well as ourselves.
- Reservations will be taken to help insure we do not exceed capacity recommendations which will be 50 persons (in addition to host and upfront teams) You will remain on the reservation list unless you miss three weeks in a row, then your name would be removed and can be re-added anytime by contacting the office.
- Traffic flow. Everyone will be asked to enter through the west parking lot door only and proceed up the stairs.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at both the entrance and exit.
- During the entry time the door will be kept in the open position until the service starts.
- The basement and rooms other than the sanctuary are closed and off limits.
- Nursery will be available during second service only (see Nursery Plan on the Children & Youth page).

- The elevator will be available only for those who cannot use stairs safely. Those who require the elevator are asked to stay seated at end of service until directed and then proceed directly to the elevator.
 - *1 household unit on the elevator at a time. (if you don't live together please don't ride together)
- Those coming to worship are asked not to enter the building until 10 minutes before the start of service.
- Please try to arrive at the church no more than 15 minutes before the service in order to avoid contact with earlier/other worshippers
- Pew cushions can't be used but you can bring a small cushion of your own for personal use.
- Please sit where directed by ushers.
- Restrooms are for emergency use only. Disinfecting supplies will be available for you to clean before your use and after yourself. Parents will need to accompany small children. Restrooms upstairs are the only ones to be used. The basement is entirely off limits.
- After services all are asked to exit via the southeast door at the back of the main sanctuary unless the elevator is required. The doors will be propped open during exiting.
- Please exit & move about only at the direction of usher.
- There will be a Red non-contact offering drop box on the wall at the entrance and exit of the Sanctuary, we will also continue with on-line and mailing in tithing.
- Please exit the sanctuary within 5 minutes of the end of service.

Please if you or your family are not feeling well stay home and worship with us on-line for the safety of all of our members.

We look forward to worshiping with you inside our Sanctuary again!


LACEY BROWN: A Woman of Faith

The Library Corner: Important Reading

As I write this article, we as a society are wrestling with the difficult topics of race and racism. The problems are long-standing, deeply rooted, and difficult. It comes in waves—just as one thinks that progress has been made, then comes the realization that we have further to go. The hardest part is probably that so many of us, if we are not people of color, can't really

"walk in their shoes." We truly do have trouble picturing, understanding, or even believing the day to day reality of African-Americans.

What to do? One thing we can do is find reading materials that help us understand these long-term issues more deeply. This article is devoted to views and recommendations on racial issues from the United Methodist Church.

From the July issue of **The Current**, the newsletter of our Illinois Great Rivers Conference (IGRC) we have some important and challenging articles. If you do not receive a paper copy, look online at https://www.igrc.org/current (click on the July issue). In this issue are articles on communicating cross-culturally to create change: police reform and reconciliation by a pastor who was once a police officer: and an article on "The Wesleyan witness on race".

The most interesting articles in the **Current** are by our Conference Bishop, Frank J. Beard. He is African-American, and has long served in the UMC. His three articles should be read in their entirety, but here are quotes from two of them:

As a black man serving in a majority-based denomination I've seen the underbelly of the church and have experienced institutional racism for over 40 years of ministry. God has not given up on the church and I believe and trust that God can and will turn things around and the church will be the instrument used to accomplish the world that we seek. ("Tears from a Bedside Lament", p. 5)

And in another article, "An antidote for racism: look and act like Jesus", p. 2, Bishop Beard states: How do we eliminate racism in the church? First and foremost, by allowing Jesus Christ to be the standard of the church. Christlikeness must become the pursuit of every Christian and of every congregation. Our goal, according to Ephesians 6:11-13 is to become mature representatives of Jesus Christ. . .. Racism will be abolished in the church when Christians look like, act like, smell like, and behave like Jesus Christ!

The third article from Bishop Beard has 10 action steps Christians can take. Look it up!

There are many more books and resources than can be listed here, but here are a few more:

Pastor Danny Motta shares that he is currently reading "One Race, One Blood: A Biblical Answer to Racism" by Ken Ham and A. Charles Ware.

The national UMC website has material related to racial justice issues, including recommendations for reading resources, at https://www.umc.org/en/content/books-about-race-a-place-to-start. Books listed there include, among others:

"Black & White: Disrupting Racism One Friendship at a Time," by John Hambrick and Teesha Hadra;

"White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk About Racism by Robin DiAngelo;

"Fear of the Other: No Fear in Love" by Will Willamon

Also, you could check out Cokesbury.com, and upperroom.org

Reading is a good resource for thinking things out. What makes us think and search our hearts? Perhaps something listed here will do that for you.




Are you getting your emails from the Church?






Wed., Aug 12th at 7pm in the Fellowship Hall. Please let Rosie know if you will be attending to ensure there is adequate spacing available.

The church nursery is now available!

We have begun offering the nursery to families with small children once again. As we start to transition back to in-person worship it is so important that we do our best to keep everyone safe. This includes keeping our youngest and tiniest church goers safe and healthy. We have carefully thought out ways to make the process of families returning to in -person worship safe and as smooth of a transition as possible. This includes making some necessary changes to the nursery.

- The nursery will be available to families for the 10:30 am service only.
- The max age for our nursery is 4 years old.
- Due to breathing and CDC recommendations, children 4 years and younger will not be required to wear a mask. The nursery attendants will be wearing a mask.
- Extra cleaning measures will be in place before, throughout, and after the nursery hour.
- Certain toys will be removed and stored at this time to allow for better cleaning and sanitizing practices.
- The use of plastic reusable drink cups and bowls for snacks will not be used.
 We will have one time use juice boxes or paper cups and individual snack packs offered.

In addition to these changes we have put into place a new **Drop Off and Pick Up** process. It will be as follows:

Drop-Off

- 10 minutes prior service a member of the MUMC host team will be at the main entrance of the church to take temperatures of everyone entering.
- Anyone with a fever above 100.4 degrees, symptoms of respiratory infection like a cough, or has come into contact with someone with COVID-19 in the past two weeks will be asked to worship from home.
- Once parent and child have had their temperatures taken, they may enter the building and proceed straight to the nursery door.
- Parents will drop their child and belongings off at the door of the nursery. We are asking that no other adult than the nursery attendants be in the nursery at this time.
- The nursery attendant will sign in the child and ask for the name of the parent/ guardian who will be picking the child up.
- A sanitized pager will be given to the parent/guardian in case they need to be contacted during the worship service.
- Children will wash their hands upon entering the nursery.

Pick-Up

- Immediately after service the parent/guardian will come to the nursery door (without entering) to pick up their child.
- The nursery attendant will ask the name of who is picking up the child and then sign the child out.
- At this time the parent/guardian will return the pager which will be wiped down for later use.

Our youth are the future of our church and we feel if properly done we can have a safe environment for our nursery children and our nursery attendants. We love our little ones and their families and that is why we are putting these measures in to place. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding as we do the best we can to keep everyone safe and healthy.

So as these ministry leaders continue to discern and fine tune those details, please pray for them.

Children's Sunday School and Children's Church will return at a later date. Our goal right now is to focus our volunteer power on the Children and Youth ministries happening during the week.

We appreciate your prayers and patience as we transition into the fall schedule. We love and pray for our families and their children and youth!
