Greetings to all in Christ Jesus!

It has been expressed often and in many ways, through many mediums, our desire to be done with 2020 and with the heartaches, pain and challenges we have all experienced. As we do acknowledge the hardships 2020 has brought upon us as a church family, I also want to pause and rejoice. Firstly, I rejoice because the Bible tells us to:

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" Philippians 4:4

Secondly, because of God's faithfulness through this crisis. God has blessed us in spite of the virus and by His grace, and through your faithfulness in continuing to give and serve, we are still standing!

Our church, like all houses of faith, will face challenges in 2021. The average Sunday morning attendance reported by churches nationwide is 30%-40% of their pre-coronavirus levels. We are in the same situation here at MUMC. As you can image, the ramifications of the virus and the economic shut down mean we'll all need to work together to make it through 2021. As it becomes safe enough, we will have the challenge together to rebuild our Sunday morning worship with excellence for the glory of God. Returning Sunday morning to an even higher level than we were at before the virus will be our number one goal in 2021. Our children's and youth ministries have also been hit very hard by the shutdown. Therefore, another top priority that our church leadership have identified will be to hire a Family Ministry Director to coordinate our Children's and Youth Ministries.

This will require continued, faithful giving. The Finance Committee and I agreed to call our stewardship series this November, "The Taboo Topic." It's a well-known and often joked about fact that very few people like to talk about money in church. However, the way we use our finances for the Lord is a big part of being a faithful disciple.

The reality is God wants every part of us, and everything we have comes from Him including our finances. Our sermon series this month will be less about trying to talk you into giving more money to the church and more about taking a month to prayerfully search the scriptures to see what God has to say about money.

The Taboo Topic November Stewardship Sermon Series:

Nov 1: The Biblical theme will be how the love of money can be dangerous to our souls. As good stewards we will also be dedicating our new hymnals and equipment for the children's area!

Pledge: to serve one Master


Nov 22: Will be pledge Sunday. We'll discuss the Biblical principal of tithing and how it relates to

As I write this article, prayer warriors across our Cache River District are in prayer for the Youth Director of our West Frankfort Trinity United Methodist Church. For as I write this he is currently laying in a hospital ICU in critical condition from COVID-19 and pneumonia. His critical condition from the virus is a stark reminder that this pandemic virus can attack all of us, regardless of our age. I am also mindful of one of the congregants of my former church, a young teacher in the Harrisburg School District. She too lay for days in a hospital ICU on a ventilator from COVID-19. And, recently we held our breath and were in prayer for our Minister @ our Harrisburg First United Methodist Church, who also was stricken with COVID-19, along with members of his congregation. We are finding that these cases are not unusual, as COVID-19 is sweeping across our United Methodist churches, just as it is through churches of all "stripes."

These cases within our own churches of our District, as well as the more then 200,000 deaths in less then one year from the virus across our country, are why Bishop Frank Beard and our Extended Cabinet are taking extremely serious our health guidelines for our more than 800 United Methodist churches throughout our Illinois Great Rivers Conference. On a regular basis our Extended Cabinet along with Bishop Beard review the latest trends, the recommendations from leading health experts (I receive regular updates from the Southern Illinois Healthcare), and the case and hospitalization rates throughout the regions of our Conference. Then the fifteen members of our Extended Cabinet and our Bishop discuss the latest known facts, and we vote upon our ever-updated guidelines for our churches. Once agreed upon, we then forward to our clergy of all of our churches here in Illinois our latest guidelines. Our clergy are requested and instructed to adhere to our guidelines, and to apply them to the churches of which they serve.

To date our clergy and congregations throughout our District and our Conference have been adhering to our guidelines, for our laity too realize the seriousness of what lays before us. Your church, the Murphysboro First United Methodist Church, and Reverend Danny Motta, are among those who have been faithfully following Bishop Beard's and our Extended Cabinets' guidelines.

For your adherence to our COVID guidelines, I give you thanks. None of us like many of the "restrictions." We all soon want to be back to "normal," engaging in congregational singing, sharing communion as we used to, hugging, and engaging with one another with no constraints.

But first, together we have to see ourselves through this. Thus, I urge you and pray that you and all of our churches will collectively continue to follow our United Methodist guidelines, in order that we may all lovingly keep one another safe.

30 Days of Thankfulness

Take some time together as a family and do this quick devotional as you start the 30 Day Challenge.

Look up and read this verse: Psalm 106:1



Ask your kids:

- What two things does this verse tell us to do? (Praise the Lord; Give thanks to the Lord.) How are those two different?
- Why should we praise God? (He is good.)
- How has God shown His goodness to vou?
- What does this verse say about God's love? (His love endures forever.)

Ask and Sav:

- The Bible says to "give thanks" to God more than 50 times! Why do you think it's important to give thanks to God?
- How does it feel when you do something for someone, or give them something, and they don't thank you or appreciate it? How do you think God feels when we don't thank Him for the things He does for us and for how loving and good He is to us?
- When we say "Thank you" to God every day, it helps us have a heart filled with thankfulness, gratitude, and worship. It helps keep us from focusing on ourselves and our problems.

We all have so much to be thankful for, but sometimes we need help thinking of those things. We need to say it out loud or write it down to help us remember. That's what we're going to do every day for the next 30 days! We'll use these prompts to help us think of things to tell God "thank you" for, and we'll try our best to think of something different every day. We're building the habit of thankfulness into our everyday lives and showing God how much gratitude we have for Him.




