December 6th, we'll light the Candle of Humility, as we come to the stable and remember Jesus' humble beginnings on earth. Next, we'll light the Candle of Light, celebrating Christ's incarnation: the light in our darkness! And finally, December 20th, we'll light the Candle of Beholding, and kneel before our Lord Jesus as we come and behold Him.

Now meeting via Zoom. Each of us in our own living space, but all meeting in a common space to talk about books. There will be no December meeting. Next Meeting:


January 16th at 10:30 The Woman in the Moonlight By Patricia Morrisroe

A stirring and romantic historical novel about nineteenth-century Vienna and the tragedy and dynamic passion that inspired Ludwig van Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata. Vienna, 1800. Countess Julie Guicciardi's life is about to change forever. The spirited eighteen-year-old is taking piano lessons with Ludwig van Beethoven, the most talented piano virtuoso in the musical capital of Europe. She is captivated by his volatile genius, while he is drawn to her curiosity and disarming candor. Between them, a unique romance. But Beethoven has a secret he's yet to share, and Julie is harboring a secret of her own, one so scandalous it could destroy their perfect love story. When Beethoven discovers the truth, he sets his emotions to music, composing a mournful opus that will become the Moonlight Sonata. The haunting refrain will follow Julie for the rest of her life. Set against the rich backdrop of nineteenth-century Vienna, The Woman in the Moonlight is an epic tale of love, loss, rivalry, and political intrigue.

The Library Corner: You Can Get It: IGRC/UMRC Resources

Say what? The above title must be one of the most non-Church Library understandable article headings ever! Here is a quick interpretation: our church belongs to IGRC—that is, the Illinois **Great Rivers Conference of the United Methodist Church. The**

UMRC—that is the United Media Resource Center-- is located at IGRC's headquarters in Springfield. It is a lending library of Christian books and other materials. And what is it you can get there? Quite a lot—and it can be delivered straight to your door!

It hurts not be able to put on display our own Church Library's stock of Advent studies, Christmas related books, and DVDs, but the Resource Center can fill part of that gap. If you would just like some study or reading to help center your mind on the arrival of the Christ child, and what that means in our world, the UMRC has a lot to offer. Here are some examples:

Advent Conspiracy: Can Christmas Still Change the World? This is a four session DVD study. Almost Christmas: A Wesleyan Advent Experience by Magrey de Veda and others. This is modeled from Wesley's sermon about "Almost Christians" needing to become wholehearted Christians. Four to five DVD sessions.

Because of Bethlehem by Max Lucado. Four session DVD study with study guide.

Not a Silent Night: Mary Looks Back to Bethlehem by Adam Hamilton. Five session DVD study with leader guide and book.

Under Wraps: The Gift We Never Expected by LaGrone, Renfroe and others. Five session DVD study plus guide and participant book.

Here are a few others that are not DVD studies:

Let Us Go Now to Bethlehem: Daily Devotions for Advent and Christmas by Todd Outcalt. **Devotions for Advent, Christmas and Epiphany.**

Taste and See: Experiencing the Stories of Advent and Christmas by Jan Johnson. She invites the reader to become part of the Christmas story, featuring daily readings and suggestions for family use.

Behold: Cultivating Attentiveness in the Season of Advent by Pamela Hawkins. Daily meditations and a weekly prayer practice.

This article features Christmas materials, but the UMRC has a variety of resources for everyone—pastors, Sunday school classes, small groups, youth groups, and children's ministries as well as resources for personal spiritual growth.

There is no rental fee to borrow resources; you will pay only the postage it costs to return materials to the Center. (Hint: tell the postal worker that it is media mail—which it is--and the charge will be less). 
