

Happy New Year to all in Christ Jesus!

When the virus first hit and we were first shut down we began a sermon series together called, "This Journey." The first Sunday we were not able to meet together was March 22, 2020. Even though that series ended in October, in many ways this journey continues. Now that we've turned the Page into the New Year together, our journey toward Easter, Resurrection Sunday begins! This journey now is one of building back our worship service for the glory of God in Christ Jesus as we also focus on building back other vital ministries for outreach and witness. Please be praying about how you can help!

Our new series together will lead us up to Holy Week! It's called, "The Way the Truth and the Life: Jesus in the Gospel of John." The key passage from John that we'll base our time together on is John 14:6...

"Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." We will be living in this Gospel through February and March and I even plan to use the Apostle John's account for our Holy Week texts this year! As we build back our worship services together we will do so seeking Jesus in the book of John and meditating on what God the Father shows us through His Holy Spirit about His Son!

To begin with, I have exciting news! Here is what our services will look like, now that we have been returned to revitalization phase 4 and in light of all we've learned about the virus in the meantime. Beginning Feb 7th we will return to our 'Traditional' service and 'Praise' service distinctions! This means that the 9 AM service is still the safer, given the freshness of the space, but the style will be purely traditional led with hymns, piano, and organ; all ages are welcome! The 10:30 AM service will now return to passionate praise style worship led by our excellent praise team!

ALL our current safety measures will still be in place (including 45-minute services, masks, distancing, entry and exit flow, and sanitization)! And ALL are welcome to resume worship in person with us at EITHER traditional or praise service as soon as the Spirit leads you to. We have plenty of room at both services before we get close to our max covid occupancy. This decision was made in consultation with our SPRC and based on their recommendation, as well as a vote of approval from our Church Council. And it was not made lightly! For the time being, nursery care will only be available at the 10:30 service. Also, we do hope to stream both traditional and praise services so that MUMC friends and family can worship with either or both online!

One final exhortation, as our worship begins to round back into the style and quality that we all know and love, please be praying about who God is calling you to invite to church with you. Whether you invite them to join us online or to meet you in the parking lot and walk them in in-person, let's remember some of the wisdom of the wisemen from our sermon series last month and make this a year of outreach, fearlessness, and worship!

# Chapter '20 Celebrating Our Faithfulness

Pastor Danny ushered us into 2021 with a sermon series entitled *Turning the Page!* Visualizing chapters and pages of a book is also a great way to tell the story of MUMC 2020 finances. A great story contains a main character, an antagonist or agent to move the main character toward growth and change, inciting action to set the character in motion, turmoil or challenge to overcome, and ultimate resolution. Using our church family as the main character of the challenging past year's story, we can proudly report that your strength, resolve, patience and commitment resulted in a happy ending to Chapter '20.

More specifically, the amazing news is that **IN 2020 OUR CHURCH FAMILY HONORED OR, IN SOME CASES, EVEN EXCEEDED THEIR PLEDGES AT A COLLECTIVE 98.35% LEVEL!!!** This is incredible, church family, especially when one considers we suffered the loss of nine church family members in 2020. We can definitely label the church family a hero among our story characters.

# Chapter '21 Same Story; New Twists

Turning the page to Chapter '21, a number of twists have been added to the story plot. Continued national turmoil, uncertain household income, fractured connectivity to the church, or a myriad of other explanations may account for significant losses in the number of pledges and correlating dollars, 2020 to 2021. Looking at the stewardship numbers:

Outside of stewardship pledges, we have no choice but to estimate dollars we pray to receive in order to meet annual expenses. Christine Nolan does a great job of this by reviewing current giving patterns, estimating other income possibilities and, yes, even consulting her crystal ball about COVID. This is how Christine's last and current year *estimates* and total income stack up:

We share this data with you so you might better understand our financial story for 2021. 2021's projected income loss is sizeable at \$66,279. Sums not reflected above but critical to our future are totals of pledging units and estimated non-pledge givers. That total in 2020 was 146, but the total for 2021 is 118. Again, this is a sizeable loss in supporters and well above losses attributable to death. A summarized 2021 budget follows:

Passage of a 19% deficit budget is certainly nothing Finance Committee and Church Council wished to do. However, as applies to every story, there is history to bear in mind. Considering 2021 anticipated income losses, every effort was made by Finance Committee to reduce expenses. Expenses were reduced by \$33,842 (including reductions in staffing positions). Over \$10,000 in outside funding (Special Funds) will be drawn down for Children and Youth Formation before using a dollar of that \$17,525 budget. Most importantly, church family, due to COVID-related reduced spending, in general, PLUS our successful pursuit of Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) free dollars in 2020, we were blessed to carry-over \$73,344 (cash) into 2021, exceeding the projected 2021 budget deficit by \$15,632. (Sidebar: we are in pursuit of a PPP "loan" this year as well.)

# Epilogue

None of us can predict how Chapter '21 or future MUMC chapters will play out. If you intended to pledge this year and simply didn't get around to it, your pledge is still welcome. At this point in time we're unable to adjust the 2021 budget on record, but Christine will gladly record your pledged commitment.

Jesus left us with a command to make disciples of all nations. He has been faithful through His people and other unanticipated means to see us through a challenging last year. He has generously done His part. We can overcome the latest twists in our church story by doing our parts to become the best stewards we can be. Let's prayerfully search our hearts and renew our vows to support the church with our prayers, by attending church (in person as we are comfortable), by serving when and where we can, by our witness and through faithful giving. God willing, we'll soon be able to better carry out our mission to make disciples!

The Murphysboro United Methodist Church Council has voted to permit ministries and community groups to resume gatherings in church facilities effective immediately. Details on meeting room scheduling and usage, COVID protocols to be followed and options for MUMC meetings virtual conferencing are listed below:

## Meeting Room Scheduling and Usage

- Groups wishing to schedule a meeting room must do so through the church office, 687-2317 or murphysboroumc@gmail.com.
- The number of meeting participants cannot exceed 25% room capacity. Only the Fellowship Hall will accommodate a group of 25. Larger groups may have the option of use of the sanctuary if judged by administration to be appropriate and if available.
- Meeting rooms will be utilized only one time per day to permit sanitizing between usage.
- Fridays and Saturdays are available for scheduling by ministry groups.
- Groups wishing to have food MUST contact the church office for guidelines.

### **COVID Protocols to be Followed**

- Group leaders are required to continue with contact tracing.
- Masks must be worn by all meeting participants (unless a doctor's certification is presented by participant).
- Social distancing must be practiced.
- Hand sanitizers are available for your use.

NOTE: Temperature-taking is no longer required.

Some type of men's Bible study


The Men's banquet and/or a Church family day picnic (Like Trail Days)

The Library Corner: Choices for Lent

Even in the midst of our "trial by Covid" the calendar pages keep flipping over with amazing speed! Soon it will be Church Library Lent, a season of quiet reflection about Jesus' faithfulness, love, and sacrifice. It is also a time for us to reflect on our

own faithfulness and love, and how we can deepen our relationship with Christ. To accomplish that, a Lenten devotional or study can help us focus on our spiritual life, and provide new inspiration.

The Church Library is closed at this time, but there are resources available through the United Media Resource Center (UMRC) in Springfield. The UMRC is a lending library of Christian books and other materials for United Methodist churches, classes, and individuals. To find out more about the Center, including its online searchable catalog, go to the UMRC website, www.igrc.org/UMRC. Materials can be mailed directly to your door. The only cost is the return postage when you return the materials.

The UMRC has many books and DVDs, and here are a few choices about Lent for adults from Jill Stone, the Director of the UMRC:

CLEARING SEASON: REFLECTIONS FOR LENT (806211) By Sarah Parsons. Welcome the Lenten season as an opportunity to clarify your relationship with God. The author shows you how to clear a space in your life for God, identify obstacles that keep you from God, and choose a Lenten practice to help you remove those obstructions. Includes a chapter for each of the six weeks of Lent and a guide for smallgroup use. 111 Pages.

EASTER FROM THE BACK SIDE (809002) By J. Ellsworth Kalas. The author looks beyond the traditional Gospel scriptures to connect the story of Christ's resurrection with other stories throughout the Bible. His creative approach both clarifies basic teachings and introduces new possibilities of meaning, even for those who are most familiar with the Easter story. Seven chapters. Includes a study guide for group use. 91 Pages.

GOD IS ON THE CROSS: REFLECTIONS ON LENT AND EASTER (815103) By Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Brief daily readings for Lent on the topics of prayerful reflection, self-denial, temptation, the purpose of suffering, the cross, preparing for Holy Week, and Holy Week. Includes Scripture index. 114 Pages.

FINDING LIFE: FORTY DAYS OF DEEPER DEVOTION THROUGH LENT (815005) By Jane Rubietta. From Eden to Gethsemane -- The Garden Restored. Forty short devotional readings designed for use during Lent. Focusing on both Eden and Gethsemane, topics include creation, oneness, darkness, shame, sacrifice, thorns, failure, exile, suffering, and life. Includes daily reflection questions and a small group guide. 255 Pages.

WALKING WITH JESUS THROUGH THE OLD TESTAMENT: DEVOTIONS FOR LENT (816011) Paul Stroble. On a sevenmile journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus, the resurrected Jesus captivated two travelers with stories from the Old Testament pointing to his life and death. This book invites readers to embark on this journey with Christ throughout the Lenten season. Stroble imagines what Jesus would have said to his companions and guides readers along the way with 46 daily devotions referencing the Old Testament. 142 Pages.

And here is one that adults can use with children during Lent:

LENTEN TREE (808000) By Dean Meador Smith. Devotions for Children and Adults to Prepare for Christ's Death and His Resurrection. This book includes devotions and patterns for decorating a Lenten tree with 41 symbols that represent Jesus Christ and his life. Age: Adult. 189 Pages.


Bible Journaling Class will resume on


#### SPRING EVENT

Please meet outside under the pavilion.






