But in the meantime, this I know: it is safe to gather and worship with the many safety measures we have in place, and we need each other!


Let us all commit to following our newly worded mission: "to know Jesus and make Him known, together."

The Book of Two Ways by Jodie Picoult

Everything changes in a single moment for Dawn Edelstein. She's on a plane when the flight attendant makes an announcement: Prepare for a crash landing. She braces herself as thoughts flash through her mind. The shocking thing is, the thoughts are not of her husband but of a man she last saw fifteen years ago: Wyatt Armstrong.

Dawn, miraculously, survives the crash, but so do all the doubts that have suddenly been raised. She has led a good life. Back in Boston, there is her husband, Brian, their beloved daughter, and her work as a death doula, in which she helps ease the transition between life and death for her clients. 
Building Closure

Please call or email Melba in the Church Office to reschedule your regular meeting to a new time either prior to Holy Week or after. Thank you for your understanding.







The Library Corner: Reading Devotionals—and the Bible!

Have you been looking for a good devotional to read in 2021? We asked several people to write about devotionals that have been meaningful to them in their walk with God. Here are their recommendations:

From Michelle Clark: I have utilized the **Upper Room** for many years, and a couple of years ago incorporated **Jesus Calling** by Sarah Young into my devotional readings, as well.

This year I have started something new, thanks to Mary Ellen Tierney. During our Sunday School Zoom meeting a few weeks ago, she read the introduction to **Hope for Today** by Dr. David Jeremiah. I asked to borrow the book to utilize a quote for my sermon on January 10, and I have continued the daily readings which I have found to be very uplifting. I will share a passage from the introduction of **Hope for Today**, which I included in my sermon a couple of weeks ago:

"When you wake up in the morning, what is your first thought? Is it your coffee, that meeting you have to attend, or the blessing of being a child of God? It is human nature to plan for the events of the day, but each day also needs a dose of hope-the hope that comes from knowing that the God of the universe is also our personal friend and Savior. The hope that we are never alone, and that no task is too difficult with our heavenly Guide along to support and strengthen us. "(Introduction)

My prayer is that hope is the theme for everyone in 2021!

From Karen Motta: Praying the Scriptures for Your Children. Author: Jodie Berndt.

Parents and Grandparents, I highly recommend this book! It has helped me to go beyond the "keep my children safe"...."help them to do well with school"..."give them good attitudes" kind of prayers. I still pray for all of these things but this book has opened my eyes and heart and taught me how to dig deeper in prayer for my children.

From Danny Motta: The Holy Bible. Author: God (working through human beings)

I have to say, I've read numerous devotionals and commentaries, but none come close to the life-changing impact of this book. This is the number 1 best-selling book of all history, and for good reason!

A great devotional tool I love is called **M.A.P.S**: First, pick a short paragraph, then **M**. Meditate (write it down, memorize it if you can). **A**. Apply (make some notes on what it's saying) **P**. Prayer (write a prayer, whatever the Lord puts on your heart). Finally, **S**. Surrender (Based on your time in the Word, what is God asking you to surrender to Him?). Happy devotions! Pastor Danny

More people are becoming eligible to receive the COVID vaccine!!

Starting Thursday, February 25th, those in phases 1A, 1B AND 1B, Part II are all eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine. See the Illinois COVID-19 Vaccination Plan for additional details.

Those currently eligible include the following:

Phase 1B Part I:

Those 65 years of age and older and frontline workers with higher risk of exposure because of their inability to perform work duties remotely and who work in proximity to other coworkers or members of the public:

Phase 1B Part II:

Persons aged 16 to 64 years with high-risk medical conditions (ELIGIBILITY BEGINS 2/25/21): Persons aged 16 to 64 years with medical conditions that increase the risk for severe COVID-19. Conditions include Obesity (click on the CDC BMI calculator to determine eligibility based on weight), Diabetes, Pulmonary Diseases, Smoking, Heart Conditions, Chronic Kidney Disease, Cancer, Immunocompromised State from a Solid Organ Transplant, Sickle Cell Disease, Pregnancy, and Persons with Disability (Not otherwise covered in previous categories.)
