As we continue with our masks and good social distancing, know that our numbers restrictions are slowly lifting and we are allowed to sing together again. In light of these changes, and as our Church Council has planned since January, I am excited to tell you we will begin a fuller Sunday morning worship experience April 11th. The schedule will be as follows: 9AM Traditional Worship, 10AM Sunday School for all ages, and 11AM Praise Worship. As has been the case, preregistering for worship is NO LONGER required! All are welcome in person and we will continue to live stream our worship.

The Choice: Embrace the Possible by Dr. Edith Eva Eger

At the age of sixteen, Edith Eger was sent to Auschwitz. Hours after her parents were killed, Nazi officer Dr. Josef Mengele forced Edie to dance for his amusement and her survival. Edie was pulled from a pile of corpses when the American troops liberated the camps in 1945.

Edie spent decades struggling with flashbacks and survivor's guilt, determined to stay silent and hide from the past. Thirty-five years after the war ended, she returned to Auschwitz and was finally able to fully heal and forgive the one person she'd been unable to forgive—herself.

Edie weaves her remarkable personal journey with the moving stories of those she has helped heal. She explores how we can be imprisoned in our own minds and shows us how to find the key to freedom. The Choice is a life-changing book that will provide hope and comfort to generations of readers.

Perhaps you have been storing items and are ready to get them out of your house. We are extending the times to bring items to the church as follows:



The Library Corner: Books for This Moment in Time?

Last April we were all reeling with the shock of the pandemic, with no clue about how long it would last. Good thing we didn't know it would last this long! This April the return to "almost normal" seems in sight—and perhaps soon, the re-opening of the Church Library? Meanwhile, here are some of the books and DVDs recently featured by the United Media Resource Center (UMRC) that may speak to the times we are in. The UMRC offers Christian materials for loan—delivered straight to your door. (See Box)

Courage: Jesus and the Call to a Brave Faith.

DVD study by Tom Berlin which explores elements of what we call courage with Jesus as our guide and focus.

Be the Bridge: Pursuing God's Heart for Racial Reconciliation by Latasha Morrison, a leading advocate for racial reconciliation. She offers a clarion call for Christians to move toward relationship and deeper understanding in the midst of a divisive culture.

Wondering About the Bible with Children by Elizabeth Caldwell. Help the Bible become a life-long companion for faith and spiritual growth for the children in your life. Chapters: What story does the Bible tell?; How can we use children's natural curiosity to help them read the Bible?; Taking time and making space for God with children; Stories that form us for a life of faith; The spiritual lives of teachers and parents; Recommended Bible storybooks.

Five Loaves, Two Fish, Twelve Volunteers:
Growing a Relational Food Ministry, by
Elizabeth Mae McGill. Chapters include:
Feeding Jesus; Problems with direct-service
charity; Listening; Cultural conflict; Everyone
can volunteer; Leadership teams; Let
volunteers lead; Living with chaos;
Unexpected learnings; Interdependence;
Creating networks; Eating together is church;
Go out into the world.

Rural Church RESCUE: A Call to Restore **Healthy Churches to Rural North America** by Jon Sanders. Speaking from his experience as both a rural church pastor and firefighter, Sanders has a unique perspective on common problems facing the rural church. He outlines six principles necessary for rural churches to be healthy and reclaim the vital role God has called them to in their communities. Chapters: Dream job; Do what?; If God can speak through a jackass; Recognize the mission; Execute strong leadership; Speak a compelling vision; Cover the community; Unleash the volunteers; Embrace the future but honor the past. Appendix: Can multi-site work in a rural context?

Perhaps one of these books speaks to an interest, concern, or hope that you have? Feel free to borrow these materials or others from the UMRC.

The UMRC is a lending library of Christian books and other materials for United Methodist churches, classes, and individuals.
