-Psalm 118:1



Your Finance Committee is pleased to begin sharing quarterly financial snapshots. We will follow up with 2nd, 3rd and 4th quarter snapshots in July, October and January, respectively.

At the time we provided our church family with this year's budget, we mentioned that 2021 estimated income is down over \$66,000 from 2020. We mentioned also that Finance Committee worked very hard to cut staffing and other expenses. Our saving grace this deficit budget year was: a) diminished 2020 spending due to COVID; b) dollars available in Special Funds to augment our Youth program; and c) a Paycheck Protection

Program (PPP) "Loan." One takeaway we see by comparing 2020 with 2021 Estimated Income columns above is that were it not for these three extraordinary factors "carrying" us into 2021, we would have had to make

serious, detrimental decisions about staffing and ministries. We should all be thankful that the Lord is meeting our needs during this season when giving estimates are insufficient to maintain the critical staffing and

programming levels of 2020.

A second takeaway from the 2021 data illustrated above relates to the Estimated and Actual Income columns. At first quarter (25% of year) we calculated \$75,913 (middle blue column) as Estimated Income. Looking at Actual Income (right blue column), you can see that we've received \$94,154, exceeding estimate. This is due to several major factors. First, pledges are being honored at a stellar level!! Non-pledged gifts

estimates are lagging only slightly behind where we predicted at 1st quarter. Last, but not least, an additional \$21,351 has been deposited into our Operating Budget from a second PPP "loan." Bottom line: first quarter Actual Income at just over 31% is a good thing. Again, the Lord continues to meet our needs.

First quarter expenses were as follows: Salaries—\$33,127.64; Benefits—\$9,617.30; Contractual Staff—\$4,408.56; Nurture & Care—\$19.60; Worship—\$400.75; Adult Spiritual Formation—\$97.52; Children & Youth—\$2,062.94; Utilities—\$8,977.80; Finance (includes Apportionments & Parsonage Mortgage) - \$6,483.51; and Administration (primarily office expenses)—\$8,242.79, for total expenses in the amount of \$73,438.41. 1st Qtr Income at \$94,154.07 minus 1st Qtr Expenses at \$73,438.41 = \$20,715.66 1st Qtr Net Income.

You may arrive at other takeaways from the data provided, but surely we all grasp that we must keep our church and its ministries in our daily prayers. Also, we must all continue to do our parts to wisely steward what the Lord has so generously provided, both as individuals and as a church family.

Nothing Daunted: The Unexpected Education of

Two Society Girls in the West by Dorothy Wickenden

In the summer of 1916, Dorothy Woodruff and Rosamond Underwood, bored by society luncheons, charity work, and the effete men who courted them, left their families in Auburn, New York, to teach school in the wilds of northwestern Colorado. They lived with a family of homesteaders in the Elkhead Mountains and rode to school on horseback, often in blinding blizzards. Their students walked or skied, in tattered clothes and shoes tied together with string. The young cattle rancher who had lured them west, Ferry Carpenter, had promised them the adventure of a lifetime. He hadn't let on that they would be considered dazzling prospective brides for the locals.

Nearly a hundred years later, Dorothy Wickenden, the granddaughter of Dorothy Woodruff, found the teachers' buoyant letters home, which captured the voices of the pioneer women, the children, and other unforgettable people the women got to know. In reconstructing their journey, Wickenden has created an exhilarating saga about two intrepid women and the "settling up" of the West.



The Library Corner: Library Awakening

It feels like the Church Library has been in hibernation! Due to Covid circumstances the library team has been unable to do very much for the past year. And in the months ahead we will be working on clearing out, organizing, and re-vitalizing the library. But you can visit the library now—you don't have to wait till that work is done. Come on in and check out books and DVDs as you have in the past—it will be a welcome return to normalcy!

Here are some things to be looking for:

New books! They'll be on display when we are able to get them processed, so be on the lookout for new items to appear.

A display space in the new children's section in the upstairs hall. There will be plenty of books for kids, and also a few books of interest for parents.

A new adult books display table in the welcome center by the Sanctuary.

As Mother's Day approaches look for books of interest by or about women and their roles. As always, we celebrate mothers, but we also celebrate the accomplishments of women in general.

May also brings us Memorial Day, and we think of all of those who have passed on before us, especially those who were involved in past wars. Southern Illinois has a special relationship to Memorial Day through the Civil War General John A. Logan, who helped start the practice of honoring those who died in the war.

General Logan, called "Black Jack" by the men he led into battle, was also important in influencing southern Illinois to support the Union, and he did so as he changed his own mind about the issues involved. This was such an interesting time in the history of Murphysboro and southern Illinois. Read about it in the book Black Jack: John A. Logan and Southern Illinois in the Civil War Era, which will be on display along with other books related to war or to southern Illinois.

And a final note: Don't forget the Little Free Library! The Little Free Library (LFL) is the colorful little box by the sidewalk near the pavilion. It is a book exchange box, and everyone in the community can participate—it's simple! Just bring an interesting book or two and place them in the box. If you see a book in the LFL that you are interested in, take it with you.

We try to keep some religious books in the box, but there will be books of many types in it. Many different people bring books or take books from it. And—we are especially interested in having good children's books in the box. Those are the books that go the fastest! So, participate if you can—it's like being part of a treasure hunt. Bring a treasure—and if you are lucky you may find a treasure!





Coming this Summer will be three exciting days of Methodists in Mission in Murphysboro! At MUMC we have long spoken of being disciples and making disciples. You have hopefully heard us speak of "on the trail" a path plan to discipleship. The weekend will be an opportunity for every member of the Body of Christ in our congregation to resurrect discipleship as a physical practice.

We are going to be doing projects in an area that lets the community know that we care about them at the same time we will be showing God that we are willing to be His hands and feet to our neighbors.
