### MURPHYSBORO COVID UPDATE

With the new guidance from the CDC as well as adjusted instruction from our IGRC leadership, our Church Council here at MUMC has voted to give the following instructions for our mask-wearing policy:

- Masks will now be welcome but optional in all MUMC worship services and special events (with the exception of indoor K-5th grade ministries where masks will continue to be encouraged until phase 5).
- We will continue to encourage social distancing in worship and respect for each other's personal space during all activities.
- We will not ask for any individual's vaccine status as a requirement to participate in any ministry.
- We will resolve to respect everyone's decisions to either mask or not mask and refrain from unkind words about each other in the love of Jesus Christ!

We encourage all individuals to use their best judgment in protecting their health and the health of others.

The Book of Lost Friends By Lisa Wingate

Bestselling author Lisa Wingate brings to life startling stories from actual "Lost Friends" advertisements that appeared in Southern newspapers after the Civil War, as newly freed slaves desperately searched for loved ones who had been sold away.

Louisiana, 1875: In the tumultuous era of Reconstruction, three young women set off as unwilling companions on a perilous quest: Hannie, a freed slave; Lavinia, the pampered heir to a now destitute plantation; and Juneau Jane, Lavinia's Creole half sister. Each carries private wounds and powerful secrets as they head for Texas, following roads rife with vigilantes and soldiers still fighting a war lost a decade before. For Lavinia and Juneau Jane, the journey is one of stolen inheritance and financial desperation, but for Hannie, the pilgrimage west reignites an agonizing question: Could her long-lost family still be out there? Beyond the swamps lie the limitless frontiers of Texas and, improbably, hope.

Louisiana, 1987: For first-year teacher Benedetta Silva, a subsidized job at a poor rural school seems like the ticket to canceling her hefty student debt—until she lands in a tiny, out-of-step Mississippi River town. Augustine, Louisiana, is suspicious of new ideas and new people, and Benny can scarcely comprehend the lives of her povertystricken students. But amid the gnarled live oaks and run-down plantation homes lie the century-old history of three young women, a long-ago journey, and a hidden book that could change everything.

On Sunday after the Our Neighbor's Table dinner those in attendance were able to choose items they desired. We are so happy to offer this to our community.



And in the months ahead we will be working on clearing out, organizing, and re-vitalizing the library. But you can visit the library now—you don't have to wait till that work is done. Come on in and check out books and DVDs as you have in the past—it will be a welcome return to normalcy!

Here are some things to be looking for:

New books! They'll be on display when we are able to get them processed, so be on the lookout for new items to appear.

A display space in the new children's section in the upstairs hall. There will be plenty of books for kids, and also a few books of interest for parents.

A new adult books display table in the welcome center by the Sanctuary.

As Mother's Day approaches look for books of interest by or about women and their roles. As always, we celebrate mothers, but we also celebrate the accomplishments of women in general.

May also brings us Memorial Day, and we think of all of those who have passed on before us, especially those who were involved in past wars. Southern Illinois has a special relationship to Memorial Day through the Civil War General John A. Logan, who helped start the practice of honoring those who died in the war.

General Logan, called "Black Jack" by the men he led into battle, was also important in influencing southern Illinois to support the Union, and he did so as he changed his own mind about the issues involved. This was such an interesting time in the history of Murphysboro and southern Illinois. Read about it in the book Black Jack: John A. Logan and Southern Illinois in the Civil War Era, which will be on display along with other books related to war or to southern Illinois.

And a final note: Don't forget the Little Free Library! The Little Free Library (LFL) is the colorful little box by the sidewalk near the pavilion. It is a book exchange box, and everyone in the community can participate—it's simple! Just bring an interesting book or two and place them in the box. If you see a book in the LFL that you are interested in, take it with you.

We try to keep some religious books in the box, but there will be books of many types in it. Many different people bring books or take books from it. And—we are especially interested in having good children's books in the box. Those are the books that go the fastest! So, participate if you can—it's like being part of a treasure hunt. Bring a treasure—and if you are lucky you may find a treasure!









### Meet our new Family Ministries Director!
