The Codebreakers of Bletchley Park: The Secret Intelligence Station that Helped Defeat the Nazis by Dermot Turing

At Bletchley Park, some of Britain's most talented mathematicians, linguists, and intellectuals were assembled to break Nazi codes. Kept secret for nearly thirty years, we have now come to realize the crucial role that these codebreakers played in the Allied victory in World War II.

Written by Dermot Turing - the nephew of famous codebreaker Alan Turing - this illustrated account provides unique insight into the behind-the-scenes action at Bletchley Park. Discover how brilliant and eccentric individuals such as Dilly Knox, Alan Turing and Joan Clarke were recruited, the social life that grew up around the park, and how they dealt with the ever-present burden of secrecy.

Bestselling author Lisa Wingate brings to life startling stories from actual "Lost Friends" advertisements that appeared in Southern newspapers after the Civil War, as newly freed slaves desperately searched for loved ones who had been sold away.

Louisiana, 1875: In the tumultuous era of Reconstruction, three young women set off as unwilling companions on a perilous quest: Hannie, a freed slave; Lavinia, the pampered heir to a now destitute plantation; and Juneau Jane, Lavinia's Creole half sister. Each carries private wounds and powerful secrets as they head for Texas, following roads rife with vigilantes and soldiers still fighting a war lost a decade before. For Lavinia and Juneau Jane, the journey is one of stolen inheritance and financial desperation, but for Hannie, the pilgrimage west reignites an agonizing question: Could her long-lost family still be out there? Beyond the swamps lie the limitless frontiers of Texas and, improbably, hope.

Louisiana, 1987: For first-year teacher Benedetta Silva, a subsidized job at a poor rural school seems like the ticket to canceling her hefty student debt—until she lands in a tiny, out-of-step Mississippi River town. Augustine, Louisiana, is suspicious of new ideas and new people, and Benny can scarcely comprehend the lives of her poverty-stricken students. But amid the gnarled live oaks and run-down plantation homes lie the century-old history of three young women, a long-ago journey, and a hidden book that could change everything.



The Library Corner: Something for Everyone

As libraries go the Church Library is small, but we strive for variety! For example, below are descriptions of some of the new (and varied) acquisitions that will soon be cataloged and available in the church library:

The Rock, the Road, and the Rabbi: My Journey into the Heart of Scriptural Faith and the Land Where it All Began by Kathie Lee Gifford, with Rabbi Jason Sobel. A longtime television talk show host, Gifford has also been a long-time student of the Bible. And then she upped her game! As she began her co-host duties for the Today Show, she explains that she felt the Lord tugging at her spirit—telling her she must still put Him first. That meant getting up even earlier and spending the first two hours of her day praying and studying scripture. Studying scripture and walking the ancient paths of Israel with experts on scripture and Holy Land led to this book about the Rock (Jesus Christ), The Road (Israel) and The Rabbi (God's Word).

Five Loaves, Two Fish, Twelve Volunteers:
Growing a Relational Food Ministry by
Elizabeth Mae Magill. Magill is a pastor of a
church in Massachusetts, and also works
with an organization of outdoor churches.
Magill was in involved in an outdoor food
ministry when she first met Alan, a homeless
man with an alcohol problem who kept
telling her they were doing it all wrong. She
was pretty annoyed with Alan. But—Alan
was right. Alan used his talents to change
how things were organized and Magill
gained insights and did research that

changed her thinking about how food ministries can be handled. Food for thought!

Trial and Error by Robert Whitlow. Whitlow is a master of legal thriller / mystery fiction whose stories draw you in and keep you guessing. In this new book small town attorney Buddy Smith has a heart for helping find children who have been the victims of parental kidnapping, as his own daughter was years ago. Then a new case seems to bring new clues that may affect his own personal situation. Whitlow's books always involve a Christian perspective, and that makes them different than many other legal mysteries—but no less interesting! You will also find other books by Whitlow in the library.

Good Good Father by Chris Tomlin and Pat Barret. Yes, it's the Chris Tomlin, the music artist who sings "Good Good Father." This book for children tells the story about Tucker the little bear who wants to help others. The book shows in simple words and illustrations that there is a Good Good Father who loves Tucker-- and everyone.

Something for everyone? Well, if you didn't find something for you in this article, it is, after all, only a small sample of what's available! Check out the library and other future articles. That "something" may just be waiting to be found.


