



Your Finance Committee is pleased to provide a 2nd Quarter 2021 Financial Snapshot. Consistent with last quarter, we include in our snapshot the 2020 and 2021 estimated income comparison. We feel it critical for our church family to understand that current giving estimates are considerably lower than last year at (\$66,000).

On a more positive note, income through June 30th at \$204,973 exceeded estimates of \$151,827 by \$53,000 due in large part to a second Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) "loan" of \$43,630. Congregational giving is tracking super close to estimates. Pledges are logged in at \$92,371 or 49.86%, just shy of the 50% (mid-year) giving benchmark. Non-pledged gifts are doing even better percentage-wise at 50.28% of estimates, or \$57,761. Our plate offerings are running slightly behind at \$1,364 or 45.47% toward \$3,000 estimated this year. So great job, church family!

For anyone interested in 2nd Quarter ONLY data, income was \$110,818.69, up from 1st Quarter income of \$94,154.07.

Moving to expenses, you can see from the bar graph above (far right) that actual expenses at June 30th(\$162,031) came in lower than estimated expenses (\$180,682). We mentioned last quarter that SPRC and Finance Committees worked very hard to cut staffing and other expenses this year. Cuts amounted to nearly \$34,000. The combination of budget cuts and wise spending is helpful, of course, but for a second consecutive year and most likely next year, the gap between income and expenses has been/will be bridged by the PPP loans (totaling \$96,500) which are now concluded. Trusting we're all offering praise and thanks to the Lord.

The break-down on 2nd Quarter ONLY expenses are as follows: Salaries—\$40,136.14; Benefits—\$9,365.24; Contractual Staff—\$5,805.44; Nurture & Care—\$187.39; Worship—\$266.43; Adult Spiritual Formation—\$162.00; Children & Youth Formation—\$4,225.93; Hospitality—\$66.21; Promotions & Publicity - \$115.02; Utilities—\$12,196.42; Finance (includes Apportionments & Parsonage Mortgage) - \$7,967.01; Administration (primarily office expenses)—\$7,737.67; and Misc. Ord. Expense—\$362.00, for total expenses in the amount of \$88,592.90. Note: this figure is up from 1st quarter at \$73,438.41.

Final data to consider are net income calculations. At June 30th, income at \$204,973 exceeded expenses at \$162,031, for net income of \$42,942. For those interested in 2nd quarter ONLY data, income at \$110,819 exceeded expenses at \$88,593, for net income of \$22,226.


On behalf of the SPRC Committee, we are notifying the church that we are still in need of a Family Ministry Director position.



The Library Corner: A Book, A Movie, A CD: We've Got Them!

What are you looking for this month? Entertainment? Inspiration? Perhaps to delve deeper into your faith? The library can offer a lot of choices in all those categories. Here are a few "picks" from the library shelves:

A new fiction book in the library this month is **The Book of Lost Friends** by Lisa Wingate. Wingate used real advertisements that appeared in newspapers after the Civil War to frame her fictional story. These weren't advertisements for things, instead they begged for news about lost people. Slave families were often separated—leaving them bereft of those they loved—and with little clue where to look. Wingate switched back and forth the between the 1870s and 1980s as she imagined a fascinating story based on one of these ads.

Even those who haven't read **Unbroken** will probably recognize the title of this historical account by Laura Hillenbrand about Louis Zamperini, who was a troubled teen, an Olympic athlete, and a World War II prisoner of war. The book was on best seller lists for years, and later was made into a movie that portrays for audiences Zamperini's desperate situation as a POW, and the endurance and resolve he summoned up in response. The library now has the DVD and you will find the movie an incredible and inspiring story.

We also have some music CDs for those of you who still have a CD player! Living With a Fire by Jesus Culture is a recent addition. This album includes the song "Move", a song that Pastor Danny and family sang and played. Remember "Move" starts with the lines "When You move, darkness runs for cover/ When you move no one's turned away"

Revival: Faith as Wesley Lived It by Adam Hamilton is available as a book and a

companion DVD. Both are very accessible portrayals of the man whose life and ministry gave us Methodism. The DVD was filmed in England, and shows us the places important to Methodism, and even more importantly the faith journey that helped revive religion in England and America—and can still do so now. Hamilton gives us an informative and inspirational discussion. Highly recommended!

And here is one for the kiddos: **The Marvelous Mustard Seed** by Amy-Jill Levine and Sandy
Eisenberg Sasso. It is a nicely illustrated
contemporary story that portrays what
happens when two children plant a mustard
seed. At the end of the book the authors
discuss the parable of the mustard seed as told
by Jesus, and also suggest questions that may
engage children's imagination and make them
think.

Born mute, speaking only in sign, Edgar Sawtelle leads an idyllic life with his parents on their farm in remote northern Wisconsin. For generations, the Sawtelles have raised and trained a fictional breed of dog whose thoughtful companionship is epitomized by Almondine, Edgar's lifelong friend and ally. But with the unexpected return of Claude, Edgar's paternal uncle, turmoil consumes the Sawtelles' once peaceful home. When Edgar's father dies suddenly, Claude insinuates himself into the life of the farm—and into Edgar's mother's affections.

Grief-stricken and bewildered, Edgar tries to prove Claude played a role in his father's death, but his plan backfires—spectacularly. Forced to flee into the vast wilderness lying beyond the farm, Edgar comes of age in the wild, fighting for his survival and that of the three yearling dogs who follow him. But his need to face his father's murderer and his devotion to the Sawtelle dogs turn Edgar ever homeward.

David Wroblewski is a master storyteller, and his breathtaking scenes—the elemental north woods, the sweep of seasons, an iconic American barn, a fateful vision rendered in the falling rain—create a riveting family saga, a brilliant exploration of the limits of language, and a compulsively readable modern classic.

Betty J. Kiel


