We will be working 9am to 3pm Monday, October 11 thru Friday, October 15, Monday, October 18 thru Thursday, October 21 and Friday, October 22, 9 am to 6 pm. We are asking that you bring in sale items during these hours if possible or evenings when the church is open (please check the church calendar for evening meeting times). Items may be dropped of on Sundays (October 10 & 17). Moving chairs, setting up tables, and moving boxes from the storage closet will be Sunday, October 10, time TBA. The youth groups will be assisting in this activity.

We need many volunteers to make this sale a success. The Friday afternoon sale is very busy and volunteers are especially needed from 3 to 6 pm.

The sale closes at Noon on Saturday, October 23. We will be preparing (noon to 1 pm) for a GIVE-AWAY from 1 to 4 pm for those in our community that may need good winter items. Previously we gave items to Our Neighbor's Table guests but they will not be at church until October 31 but they are invited to come October 23, 1 to 4 pm.

After 4 pm on October 23 plans are to box up and load a trailer with the remaining items to be hauled away on Monday, November 1. I am very pleased that our youth groups will be assisting with this project. The youth groups will be receiving a very nice \$\$ donation for their assistance. Parents are welcome to assist their youth in these two yard sale-related activities. Service and Missions Committee will be determining that \$\$ figure on September 29.

The remains from the April Sale were delivered to Renew in Marion, since Salvation Army in Marion only took 7 boxes. Plans are to deliver these sale remains to JR Center in Anna. For a number of years they have graciously accepted all that we had but due to Covid restrictions they were unable to accept them earlier this year. I will be working on a Plan B if that becomes necessary this October.

In past years I have received advice on how to distribute left-overs and new ideas. If you have concerns or suggestions I welcome them NOW, not later. In past years we have taken clothing items (age and laundry appropriate) to a local nursing home, items to Pregnancy Matters and the Women's Center in Carbondale. Since Covid I am not sure of their acceptance policies. If anyone has info for the Carbondale Warming Center needs I would be pleased to share our bounty.

Please do volunteer; lots of work but so many blessings in our fellowship time together.



The Library Corner: Deeper into the Bible, Part II

Last month's article discussed some ways to know the Bible better – and there is ALWAYS more to know! It is a path of spiritual growth for us—one of the ways God communicates with, and inspires his people. Here are other Biblical resources that can be found in the Church library that can help us on our way:

Resources for an "overall" look:

The Story: The Bible as One Continuing Story of God and His People (selections from the New International Version) hits the Bible highlights (the "overstory" as Max Lucado and Randy Frazee call it) in only 31 chapters, along with short connecting passages. Although not a replacement for the full Bible, it is a great way to refresh the reader's knowledge of the Bible in an easy to read and understandable format. It is a good resource for learning how the Bible stories that we have heard in a "piecemeal" way all these years actually fit together!

Seamless: Understanding the Bible as One

Complete Story by Angie Smith. This is both a study book and a video. Although written as a women's study, nothing says men can't use it too! Smith confesses she once knew so little about the Bible that she finally read several children's Bibles just to give herself basic knowledge! Her six-week study involves reading some portions of the Bible, and answering questions.

New Testament Commentaries:

The Church library has two New Testament commentary sets, one written by William Barclay, and one by N.T. Wright, both noted Christian scholars. These books come in paperback format, with separate volumes on Matthew, Mark, etc., making it easy to take out the volume you want. Barclay and Wright give their own translation of a Bible passage, and then discuss it. They can be useful in Bible study, or just for helping you think more deeply about certain passages you find puzzling or interesting. And I don't think Cliff Buchholz would

have minded me sharing this: On the library card for each Barclay volume, you will find Cliff's name. Many of you know that Cliff was a man devoted to reading the Bible, and reading these also was part of his spiritual journey.

Using these aids to help in our Bible reading journey can be very helpful. But there is another way, too—one that is not study, or reading fast through a chapter. It involves quiet, slowness, and short Bible passages. With this way of "spiritual reading" we pray for God's help in listening with our heart and spirit, and hearing His word for us on that day. This is an age-old practice of Biblical meditation or "Lectio Divina". It is discussed more fully in at least one book we have in the library, **Soul Feast: An Invitation to the Christian Spiritual Life** by Marjorie Thompson, in a chapter entitled "Chewing the Bread of the Word." Thompson says "In a certain sense. . .it is not so much we who read the Word, as the Word who "reads" us!" (p. 22)

Somewhere out beyond the edge of the universe there is a library that contains an infinite number of books, each one the story of another reality. One tells the story of your life as it is, along with another book for the other life you could have lived if you had made a different choice at any point in your life. While we all wonder how our lives might have been, what if you had the chance to go to the library and see for yourself? Would any of these other lives truly be better?

In The Midnight Library, Matt Haig's enchanting blockbuster novel, Nora Seed finds herself faced with this decision. 
Prayers & Squares Quilting


