### John 3:16-17

For this is the way God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life <sup>17</sup> For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world should be saved through him.



Description: Let's be honest about Advent: American culture forces many of us to put on a happy face, to pretend we're merry when we're frustrated and stressed and exhausted by the expectations of others. We're also frustrated by what Advent has become - a celebration of consumerism - while it forgets the season's origins in a dark, cold stable with an empty manger. In this honest Advent devotional, best-selling progressive Christian author John Pavlovitz reminds us that God came to meet us in the low places of our lives - and that Jesus continues to come low this Advent season: when we live humbly, when we seek forgiveness, in our grief and suffering, when we act on behalf of someone else, when we pray. As we walk the road of Advent, Jesus reminds us the invitation is not to escape this world to an elevated Heaven somewhere else, but to bring Heaven down. "God with us" is Jesus, getting low. Each devotional includes a scripture and Advent reflection on Jesus meeting us on the ground, in the grit."



### The Library Corner: Look, Listen, Enjoy

What do you need this Christmas? If it is to have your shopping and baking all done, the library unfortunately can't help with that! But if you just want to live this season more deeply—to look, listen, enjoy—the library has some items that may help.

You could start with a book by Max Lucado—a man who loves Christmas—every bit of it. But he loves it best when someone asks what he calls "the Christmas questions", such as "What's the big deal about the baby in the manger?" The short answer is in the title of his book: **Because of Bethlehem: Love is Born, Hope is Here.** In his easy, conversational style Lucado discusses in the book and accompanying DVD what he calls the "heart shaping promises of Christmas." Other Advent studies include:

Mike Slaughter's slim book Christmas is Not Your Birthday and accompanying DVD A Different Kind of Christmas: Living and Giving Like Jesus. Slaughter is the author of The Christian Wallet, the book that Pastor Marty used in his November sermon series.

The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem and Not a Silent Night: Mary Looks Back to Bethlehem by Adam Hamilton.

And others!

The library has Christmas fiction books and DVDs that can provide enjoyment and lift the heart. Here are two among a number of fiction books and DVDs:

**Shepherds Abiding** is a lovely Christmas tale by Jan Karon. Gain some joy and inspiration from Father Tim and other denizens of Mitford.

Jennifer Chiaverini has a tale of Christmas past, and Christmas present, in **Christmas Bells**, a novel inspired by the poem written by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow:

I heard the bells on Christmas Day
Their old familiar carols play

And wild and sweet the words repeat Of peace on earth good will to men There are books and DVDs for kids as well. Among the DVDs try **The Fourth King**, who arrives late at the manger because of the delays caused by his penchant for helping others. And the **Veggie Tales** series include **Merry Larry and the True Light of Christmas** and a fun DVD of **Christmas Sing-Along Songs**.

May you find something that helps you savor this glorious season!




be on display in the downstairs hall and in the library.


