Hello church! I hope this correspondence finds you in the best of health and spirit. It is my most sincere desire that you grow in your faith and relationship with Jesus Christ. It's the best thing you can do for yourself, your family and community. There are a few things on my mind. If you will allow me to share, I will attend to them in this letter.

First, I know October has been a particularly difficult month for the Winters, Herring and Flowers families. All have lost a loved one and I had the great honor to officiate their home-going services. It is imperative that we as a worshipping and faith-filled community continue to pray for these families. For our faith in this way affirms that the **"...Effectual fervent prayer of the righteous avails much"**. Our prayers must be formed in accordance with the Word of God; not just words of intercession when speaking to God on their behalf alone, but also being the interceder. Church we must call, send cards, and connect with these families that they may know for sure the love which is in your hearts for them. James 2:26 says: **"For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead"**. So, let us be the answer to our prayers for them and their prayers to God.

Second, I want to ask you to be fully present with the next sermon series "The Christian Wallet", which is taken from a popular book on Christian Stewardship called "The Christian Wallet". I know some of us take offence at the church speaking about our money and how it ought to be used. But consider this, does the Bible discuss these matters and give directions to you, the elect of God? The answer is yes. Does God have authority in your life? The answer is yes, but you have to surrender it. I ask that you be fully present in body and spirit during this 4-week sermon series. Honor God with your obedience and evaluate my presentation of God's Word on this subject that you might confirm you heard Him alone. Finally, please get a copy of the book. Some copies are available at the church, one per family please. Or order your own off of Amazon.

Finally, my brothers and sisters; **"...whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things"**. (Philippians 4:8)

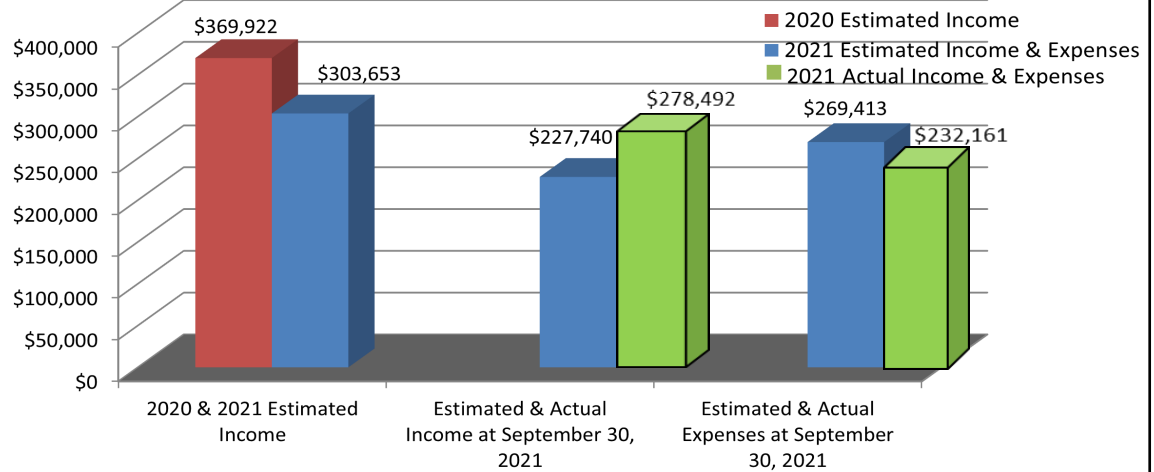

2020 and 2021 Estimated Income Comparison
and Estimated/Actual Income and Expenses at September 30, 2021

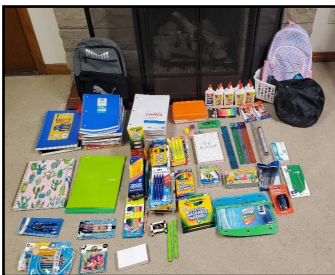


Your Finance Committee is pleased to provide a 3rd Quarter 2021 Financial Snapshot. Consistent with prior quarters, we include in our snapshot the 2020 and 2021 estimated income comparison.

Actual income through September at \$278,492 exceeded estimates of \$227,740 due in large part to the second Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) “loan” of \$43,630 received across 1st and 2nd quarters. Congregational giving is tracking close to estimates. Pledges toward operations are logged in at \$132,778 or 71.66%, just shy of a 75% (three quarters) giving benchmark. Non-pledged gifts actually exceeded 3rd quarter estimate at \$88,683, or 77.2%. Our plate offerings also exceeded estimate—running slightly behind non-pledged gifts—at \$2,313, or 77.09%. So another great job of living out your commitments to Christ’s church!

Moving to expenses, you can see from the far right bar graphs that actual expenses through September at \$232,161 came in lower than estimated expenses at \$269,413, due in part to our not paying a Youth Director’s salary the majority of the year.

We can forecast congregational giving through the end of 2021 using the average monthly rate of giving over the past nine months. Using this method, we can estimate receiving an additional \$74,591 in the remaining quarter, bringing estimated congregational giving to \$298,365. We can forecast expenses through the end of 2021 using the same method. Accordingly, we can estimate spending another \$77,387 in the remaining quarter, bringing estimated expenses to \$309,548. We can weather this estimated giving vs. expenses deficit (-\$11,183) (or a similar deficit figure) thanks to PPP dollars which covered numerous weeks of payrolls across both this and last years. The PPP payrolls coverage permitted us to preserve cash. Next year it is highly, highly unlikely we will have the PPP revenue stream. Our nation’s inflation impacts the church, and we have staffing holes to fill. With our annual stewardship program having commenced with Pastor McMichael’s sermon series entitled “The Christian Wallet,” let us each one approach the stewardship season with open hearts and open minds.



Caring for Kids Donations

We conclude our Q3 Financial Snapshot with a report on your generosity beyond tithes and offerings in support of Christ’s church. Numerous bins of school supplies, cash in the amount of \$692.33 and gift cards in the amount of \$235 were donated to the *Caring for Kids Program*. The supplies, gift cards and cash were divided between Carruthers and General John A. Logan schools. Your donations bridge the gap to meet children’s basic needs. Obviously, MUMC CARES FOR KIDS. Our focus upon missions makes a difference in our spiritual lives and in the lives of others (children and school staff in this case). Let’s continue to help others see Jesus through our actions.

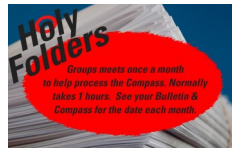
Methodists on a Mission Relay for Life GIFT CARDS

The Library Corner: Now Thank We All Our God

We are all familiar with the hymn we often sing at Thanksgiving “Now thank we all our God with heart and hands and voices”. We can hear the melody in our minds. To give thanks to God is a good and right thing to do, but has humankind always known that? Perhaps—or at least for a very long time, as witnessed by the Bible.

One of the best ways to find out where a topic of interest is mentioned in the Bible is to use **Strong’s Exhaustive Concordance of the Bible**. Using the key words “thank,” “thanks,” and “thanksgiving”, we can find a variety of specific Bible passages that contain those words, listed by book, chapter, and verse.

For instance, the very first mention of any of those words is in *Leviticus: 7:12* in the Old Testament, certainly one of the older books in the Bible. This verse is a description of how to make a sacrificial Thanksgiving offering to God.

A number of Psalms proclaim praises to God with thanksgiving. *Psalm 100* is one of the most beautiful and well known. It’s short—read it in its entirety for the joy of it! Here are two of the verses:

Know that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; We are his people, and the sheep of his pasture Enter his gates with thanksgiving, And his courts with praise; Give thanks to him, bless his name. Psalm 100: 3-4

Examples in the New Testament include passages from Paul, in his pastoral letters to young churches.

Paul urges these people of faith to be thankful. He wrote to the Philippians: *Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.* Phil: 4:6

Similarly, Paul’s letter to the Thessalonians urges them:

pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. I Thess 5:17-18

Read the verses before and after around both of the passages quoted above to see how Paul also urges his readers to rejoice always. Rejoicing, thankfulness in all circumstances, prayer, supplication—there is a spiritual connection among them that is both inspiring and challenging—something to think about.

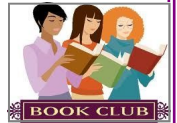

Afterlife

The first adult novel in almost fifteen years by the internationally bestselling author of *In the Time of the Butterflies* and *How the García Girls Lost Their Accents*

Antonia Vega, the immigrant writer at the center of *Afterlife*, has had the rug pulled out from under her. She has just retired from the college where she taught English when her beloved husband, Sam, suddenly dies. And then more jolts: her bighearted but unstable sister disappears, and Antonia returns home one evening to find a pregnant, undocumented teenager on her doorstep. Antonia has always sought direction in the literature she loves—lines from her favorite authors play in her head like a soundtrack—but now she finds that the world demands more of her than words.

Afterlife is a compact, nimble, and sharply droll novel. Set in this political moment of tribalism and distrust, it asks: What do we owe those in crisis in our families, including—maybe especially—members of our human family? How do we live in a broken world without losing faith in one another or ourselves? And how do we stay true to those glorious souls we have lost?

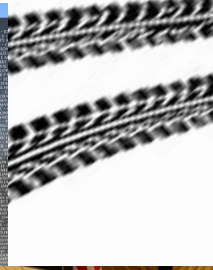

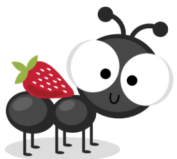
Our 2021 Charge Conference has been set for November 2nd at 6:30 at Carbondale Grace UMC. Everyone in the church is invited to attend.

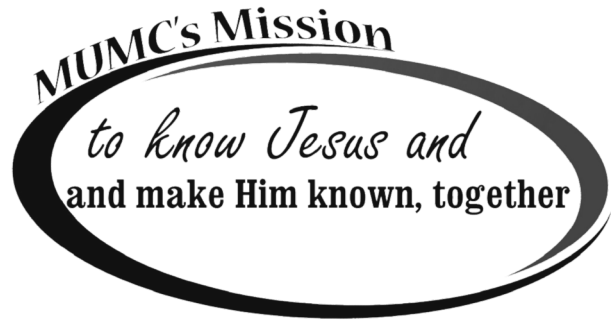
