

The Library Corner: Want More?

We know that the study of the Bible is central to the Christian life—but we also know there are books and studies that can help us understand and gain insights about what we read in the Bible. There is always more to learn! Here is a small sample of what is available in the church library:

Jesus' apostles are the subject of several books—one of them, The Thirteen Apostles, is by J. Ellsworth Kalas. Thirteen? Yes! Kalas discusses the initial twelve, including Judas, but then adds a chapter on Matthias who was chosen to replace Judas as one of the twelve. See Acts 1:15-26.

Twelve Unlikely Heroes by John MacArthur is NOT about the apostles! It is instead about other people in the Bible—not at all perfect— who still played their parts in God's story. That is why the subtitle of this book is How God Commissioned Unexpected People in the Bible and What He Wants to do with You.

The Women of Easter: Encounter the Savior with Mary of Bethany, Mary of Nazareth, and Mary Magdalene by Liz Curtis Higgs. Mary, the mother of Jesus. Mary of Bethany, the sister of Lazarus and Martha. Mary Maadalene, devoted follower —and a witness to his resurrection. The lives of each of these Marys are forever changed because of Jesus.

One of Max Lucado's better books is Grace: More Than We Deserve Greater Than We Imagine. Lucado says about grace: "Here's my hunch: we've settled for a wimpy grace . . . Never causes trouble or demands a response." He asks: "Have you been changed by grace? Shaped by grace? Snatched by the nape of the neck and shaken to your senses by grace? (p.8) This book invites readers to learn more about being shaped by grace—and possibly being snatched by the nape of the neck and

shaken to our senses!

Now Hear This! Sometimes more reading is more than we can do. The library has a limited number of Audio CDs—just for those of you who still have a CD player! Here are two audio books:

Final Words from the Cross by Adam Hamilton. Hamilton explores Jesus' dying words and their meaning for today. This is a good book to listen to or read during Lent, as it takes us deeper into the day of Jesus' crucifixion. These are important words —and are packed with meaning. The book and DVD are also available.

Abraham: a Journey to the Heart of Three Faiths by Bruce Feiler. Feiler explores the life of Abraham, the patriarch who is at the beginnings of Judaism as well as Christianity and the Muslim religion. He walks the ground in the Holy Land, and talks with scholars of religion. Feiler also wrote Walking the Bible, which is also in the church library.

> The Alchemist By Paul Coelho

Paulo Coelho's enchanting novel has inspired a devoted following around the world. This story, dazzling in its powerful simplicity and soul-stirring wisdom, is about an Andalusian shepherd boy named Santiago who travels from his homeland in Spain to the Eayptian desert in search of a treasure buried near the Pyramids. Along the way he meets a Gypsy woman, a man who calls himself king, and an alchemist, all of whom point Santiago in the direction of his quest. No one knows what the treasure is, or if Santiago will be able to surmount the obstacles in his path. But what starts out as a journey to find worldly goods turns into a discovery of the treasure found within. Lush, evocative, and deeply humane, the story of Santiago is an eternal testament to the transforming power of our dreams and the importance of listening to our MUMC. hearts.





MUMC Camping Families:

We are excited to say Summer Camp is back in 2022! We have established a new pricing structure. MUMC will be responsible for 50% and parents will be responsible for the other 50%.

Parents will have the following choices for their 50% responsibility:

Parents pay the entire 50% themselves
Parents apply for IGRC Scholarship
If Scholarship applied for the break down for cost is: parents pay at least 1/3 or more of cost, but must be at least \$25, Church pays 1/3 or more, and scholarship pays the remaining balance.
Children's participation in fundraising opportunities
Church member sponsorship of individual Child/Youth participating in the

camp.

(We will trust families to do what they can genuinely afford. Parents' choice for registrations will be held in the strictest confidence.)

It has been voted that each youth participant may bring one friend, and the church will be responsible for 50%, and the parent will be responsible for the remaining 50% (they may apply for the IGRC scholarship also). Potential for additional friends could be an option after registration is on April 10th is received.

If your camp application is received by Thursday, April 14th at 9 am, you will receive an additional \$25 off the total camp fee.


