

The Library Corner: Unafraid?

It seems that fears and human nature go together. Fear is as old as humanity, (remember Adam and Eve in the garden as told in Chapter 3 of Genesis) and it still springs new in the human heart.

In his recent book, Unafraid: Living with Courage and Hope in Uncertain Times, Adam Hamilton delves into fear and the many things that make us anxious or afraid. Before starting the book, he surveyed members of his church about their level of fear, and found that 80% had either moderate or significant levels of fear.

He says "We worry about the future, about politics, and about our health. We fear violent crime, racial divisions, and the future of the economy. Deep rifts in our nation leave us with an increasing sense of uncertainty. Fear in the financial markets can wipe out billions of dollars of wealth in a single day. Our fears, in the form of insecurity often wreak havoc on our lives and personal relationships." (p.3)

Hamilton points out that fear can be our friend when helping us take action in threatening situations, and discusses the "anatomy" of fear --how our brain works and what happens to our bodies if we perceive a threat—real or not. He focuses on the "unreal," and the out of proportion fears and paralyzing anxieties in this book.

He gives many examples of real-life situations that involve anxieties and fears and how they affect individuals and their quality of life. He also offers strategies that use brain and heart and faith to evaluate and cope with fears.

Hamilton observes that "Fear, and finding peace in the face of it is one of the major themes of the Bible" (p. 32) He also points out that the phrase "Do not be afraid" appears more than 100 times in the Bible, but states that "the phrase that often follows is just as important: for I am with you." (p. 32).

He points out that spiritual resources such as prayer and devotional reading can help ease our fearful

minds and hearts. We can bring ourselves closer to God's presence and love by slowly Bible passages, and meditating on them. In the appendix of the book Hamilton describes that meaningful method of Bible reading and gives a list of 31 reassuring scriptures—one for each day of the month.

This review has only touched upon a very small part of this helpful book. There will be a copy on display on the library bookcase upstairs, and there are also extra copies in the church library that can be borrowed. The Seekers class is currently studying this book—and will probably be discussing it into June! You are welcome to stop by the class and join the class discussions. Don't be afraid!:)

A Perfect Union: Dolley Madison and the Creation of the American Nation

When the roar of the Revolution had finally died down, a new generation of politicians was summoned to the Potomac to assemble the nation's capital. Into that unsteady atmosphere—which would soon enough erupt into another conflict with Britain—Dolley Madison arrived, alongside her husband, James. Within a few years, she had mastered both the social and political intricacies of the city, and by her death in 1849 was the most celebrated person in Washington. And yet, to most Americans, she's best known for saving a portrait from the burning White House.

Why did her contemporaries so admire a lady so little-known today? In A Perfect Union, acclaimed historian Catherine Allgor reveals how Dolley manipulated the constraints of her gender to construct an American democratic ruling style and to achieve her husband's political goals. By emphasizing cooperation over coercion—building bridges instead of bunkers—she left us with not only an important story about our past but a model for a modern form of politics.
