The Library Corner: Books of Interest

This month's column lists books that are a bit off the beaten path. They have two things in common: 1) they have not received much attention; and 2) the topics are interesting and thought provoking— an open invitation to explore something different!

This We Believe: The Core of Wesleyan Faith and

Practice by Will Willimon. Core beliefs? Do we need to read about them? Yes! Willamon has things to say that both reminds and informs us about core beliefs such as "We believe in One God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit", "We Believe in Jesus Christ and His Reign" and "We Believe in Salvation for Sinners". This book ties in with the **Wesley Study Bible**, which is also in the library.

United Methodist Questions, United Methodist Answers: Exploring Christian Faith by F. Belton Joyner Jr. Joyner addresses topics in a questionand-answer format. Here are some of the questions in the section on Christian Life: "What are the means of grace? What are the works of mercy? What about prayer? What about healing? Why be involved in justice? Why does it make a difference how I live my life? Each topic has pertinent questions and brief, informative answers.

The Heart of the World: An Introduction to Contemplative Christianity by Thomas Keating, a Catholic monk. Here's a quote: "Contemplative prayer allows the hunger and thirst for God to well up. (p. 10) How do we just "be" before God, without words, but in communion? Keating has a lot to say about that in this small book

Beth Moore's book **Chasing Vines: Finding Your Way to an Immensely Fruitful Life.** Vines and fruitfulness are frequent images in Scripture, which Moore uses, along with experiences in her own life, to address our desire as human beings to make our lives matter. Every person who knows Jesus, she is convinced, will live in fruitfulness.

Mary, Called Magdalene by Margaret George. You may recognize the author's name; she has written several popular fiction books about real people in history-- while still keeping her writings as factual as possible. In her book about Mary Magdalene she starts with Mary's childhood, giving details about what life was like in first century Judea. Mary eventually falls into great trouble—and Jesus saves her.

These and other books will be on display upstairs and downstairs in the church library. Hope you find one of them interesting! Or browse around and find another one of interest to you!

Happy Thanksgiving! Look for some children's books about Thanksgiving on display. And later in the month you will begin to see books and movies related to Christmas! Yes, it is coming, and things to read and watch during this joyful time can add to your enjoyment and appreciation of the season.
